AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 29TH JANUARY, 1924.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE:
INFECTED PLACES.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The several premises mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be places infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries is hereunto affixed this twenty-ninth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

SCHEDULE.

Description and Limits of Infected Places.

The following premises in the administrative county of Chester:—

1. The farmstead, known as Thorn Tree Farm, in the occupation of John Stubbs, in the parish of Crowton.

2. The farm buildings, premises and pasture lands, known as Old Hoolgrave, Minshull Vernon, in the occupation of John Joseph Astbury, in the parish of Minshull Vernon.

3. The buildings and the fields, at Topwood, in the occupation of George Henry Done, in the parish of Oldcastle.

4. The buildings and land, known as The Small Holding, Whitechurch Road, Spurstow, in the occupation of John Griffiths, in the parish of Bunbury.

5. The whole of those farm premises and fields, known as Coole Hall, in the occupation of Thomas Walker Goodwin, in the parish of Hankelow.

6. The whole of the farm buildings and the land, known as Crabtree Farm, in the occupation of Joseph Payne, in the parish of Cuddington.

7. The whole of the farm buildings and the pastures, known as Willow Hill Farm, in the occupation of Alice Brown, in the parish of Burwardsley.

8. The whole of the buildings and the land, known as Hankelow Court, in the occupation of William M. Killick, in the parish of Audlem.

9. The whole of the buildings and land, known as Field Farm, in the occupation of William Probyn, in the parish of Malpas.

10. The buildings and the fields pertaining to the holding in the occupation of Colin Rutter, in the parish of Acton.

11. The farm buildings and the stack yards at Mount Farm, on the west side of the main road, Chester to Northwich, in the occupation of Herbert Reynolds, in the parish of Tarvin.

Description and Limits of Infected Place.

The farm buildings and also the land attached thereto known as The Grange Farm, in the occupation of George Allsup, in the parish of Freckleton, in the administrative county of Lancaster.

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
