FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED
AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 11).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Substitution of New Infected Area No. 8.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 10) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule hereto were substituted for the Infected Area No. 8, described in the Second Schedule to that Order.

Amendment of Description of Infected Area (No. 6).

2. The Second Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 10) shall be read and have effect as if the parish of Preston transferred from the administrative county of Gloucester to the administrative county of Hereford were excluded from the Infected Area No. 6 described in that Schedule.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 11).
