

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Controlled Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such notices, when served shall be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

10. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

11. Any contravention of this Order, or of any notice served thereunder, shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the Ayrshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1924.

Extension of Limits of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place.

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place (No. 7) described in the Schedule to the Order of the Minister dated 21st November, 1923 (No. 1730) is hereby extended so as to include the pastures known as Rammer Fields on the farm known as Crab Mill Farm, situated in

the parish of Baddiley in the administrative county of Chester, and in the occupation of John Birchall, Crab Mill Farm, Baddiley, Nantwich, Cheshire.
