

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 6TH FEBRUARY, 1924.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The premises described in the Schedule

hereto which were declared by the Order specified in the Schedule to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place is hereby declared to be free from Foot-and-Mouth Disease.
