#### TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

#### FLAX AND HEMP TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

#### PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Flax and Hemp Trade in Great Britain as specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, THAT THEY PROPOSE TO VARY certain of the minimum rates of wages set out in their Notices F.H. (15) and F.H. (10) dated 25th July, 1922, and 23rd February, 1922, respectively, the proposed variations being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

FOR MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED IN LEARNING CANVAS WEAVING during the first 6 months of such employment to apply *in substitution* for the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Section IV of Part III of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (15) dated 25th July, 1922.

#### PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES. Per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 21 years of age and upwards ...	25s. during the first 3 months and 30s. during the second 3 months of employment.
Workers of 18 and under 21 years of age ...	20s. during the first 3 months and 25s. during the second 3 months of employment.
Workers of 16 and under 18 years of age ...	15s. during the first 3 months and 16s. during the second 3 months of employment.

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES APPLICABLE TO FEMALE WINDERS by the addition of the following to the provisions relating to female winders contained in the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (15) dated 25th July, 1922.

A winder is a worker, other than a bit or beating winder, who is wholly or mainly employed on winding from the reel, hank or bobbin.

PART IV.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES APPLICABLE TO MALE APPRENTICES by providing that the minimum rates set out in Part I of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (10), dated 23rd February, 1922, shall apply to male apprentices who are apprenticed to tenting or dressing under indentures IN ANY FORM APPROVED BY THE TRADE BOARD, as well as to those indentured in the form prescribed by the Trade Board.

PART V.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime rates calculated on the minimum rates of wages proposed in this Schedule in the manner specified in Part VII of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (15) dated 25th July, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the proposed minimum rates of wages in respect of all time worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the before-mentioned Notice F.H. (15) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 12th day of February, 1924. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Flax and Hemp Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Amendment of certain provisions of Animals  
(Transit and General) Order of 1912.*

1. Articles 39 and 40 of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912 shall apply to the ascertainment of the value of animals for the purpose of compensation payable under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, or under any Order made thereunder, subject to the following modifications:—

(a) Paragraph (iv) of sub-section 1 of each of the said Articles shall be read and have effect as if the words "within fourteen days" were therein substituted for the words "within seven days"; provided that this amendment shall not affect any appointment of an arbitrator or notice of application of such appointment made or given under that paragraph before the commencement of this Order.

(b) Paragraph (v) of sub-section (1) of each of the said Articles shall be read and have effect as if the words "within thirty days" were therein substituted for the words "within seven days."

2. Articles 15 and 16 of the Cattle-Plague Order of 1895, Articles 23 and 24 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order of 1895, Articles 19 and 20 of the Pleuro-Pneumonia Order of 1895, and Articles 19 and 20 of the Sheep Pox Order of 1895, containing provisions as to the ascertainment of value for compensation, are hereby revoked.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

(No. 14).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Revocation of Previous Orders.*

1. The Orders described in the Second Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.

*Meaning of Terms.*

2. In this Order:—

“ An Infected Area ” means an Area described in the First Schedule hereto.

If any farm or holding (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside an Infected Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area.

“ Animals ” means cattle, sheep, goats or pigs;

“ Slaughterhouse ” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

*Restrictions in Force in the Infected Areas.*

3.—(a) No animals shall be moved out of an Infected Area except to a slaughterhouse in another Infected Area as provided in Article 4 of this Order.

(b) No animal shall be moved without a licence under Article 4 of this Order:—

(i) into an Infected Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within an Infected Area.

(c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in an Infected Area.

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in an Infected Area, except a market or sale of fat animals intended for immediate slaughter or a sale of animals on farm premises. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat. No licence shall be granted for the holding of any such market or sale of fat animals on any premises within a radius of five miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease or for the holding of a sale on farm premises within a radius of two miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease: Provided that any such premises on which all affected animals have been slaughtered shall for the purposes of this Article cease to be regarded as a place

infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease at the expiration of twenty-eight days from the date upon which the slaughter of the stock was completed, if the final disinfection of the premises has been completed to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Ministry.

(e) No slaughterhouse manure, refuse, or offals or other parts of a carcase intended for feeding animals shall be moved out of an Infected Area or be brought into contact with animals in any such Area.

(f) The landing of animals at the approved Landing Places at the Ports of Fleetwood, Silloth and Preston is hereby prohibited, except for animals intended for slaughter. Such animals may be moved from the Landing Place only to a slaughterhouse in an Infected Area. The landing of animals at the approved Landing Place at the Port of Manchester is prohibited.

*Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Infected Areas.*

4.—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movement of animals only:—

(a) From premises outside any Infected Area to a slaughterhouse in an Infected Area.

(b) From premises outside any Infected Area to a farm in an Infected Area.

(c) From a farm in an Infected Area to a licensed fat stock market or fat stock sale in the same Area.

(d) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in an Infected Area, or from a farm or other premises in an Infected Area, to a slaughterhouse in the same Infected Area or in another Infected Area.

(e) From one farm to another in the same Infected Area, or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence “ Occupation Licence.”)

(2) Where a licence is granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority under paragraph (b) for the movement of animals from premises outside any Infected Area to a farm in an Infected Area, or under paragraph (e) for movement from one farm to another in an Infected Area, it shall be a condition of the licence that the animals shall on arrival at the destination specified in the licence be detained thereon for a period of twenty-eight days, and during that period the animals shall not be removed from the premises for any purpose. This Article does not prohibit the movement of the carcase of an animal slaughtered on the premises during the said period.

Provided that this provision shall not apply to licences granted in respect of the movement of animals for breeding purposes.

(3) No licence shall be granted under this Article for (i) the movement of animals from any premises to any farm for the purpose of sale at a licensed farm sale, or (ii) the movement of any animal to or from any place or along any road within a radius of two miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth

Disease: Provided that any such premises on which all affected animals have been slaughtered shall cease to be regarded as a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease for the purposes of this Article at the expiration of twenty-eight days from the date upon which the slaughter of the stock was completed, if the final disinfection of the premises has been completed to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Ministry.

*Time Limit for Slaughter of Animals.*

5. Where any animals are moved with a licence under this Order to a slaughterhouse they shall be slaughtered within 96 hours of the time of arrival at the slaughterhouse, provided that the Local Authority of the district in which the slaughterhouse is situate may, if they think fit, require any such animals to be slaughtered within a less period than 96 hours.

*Conditions of Licences.*

6.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the place of destination is situate, and a licence shall not be available for the movement of the animals, unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district from which the animals are to be moved.

(b) Where any animals are moved with a licence under this Order, the Inspector granting or countersigning the licence may, if he thinks it desirable, specify therein the route by which the animals are to be moved, and may require the animals to be moved by float or other suitable vehicle.

(c) Licences for movement within an Infected Area, or from one Infected Area to another shall not permit movement on any road outside the Infected Area.

(d) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such Licence was granted.

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an Officer of the Local Authority immediately after completion of the movement.

(f) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for six days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement.

(g) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by rail, by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate, as far as practicable, from all other animals. Animals being moved under this Order by railway shall not be untrucked until they reach the railway station nearest to the place of destination. In no case shall any such animal be untrucked at any place outside the Infected Areas.

(h) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority.

(i) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and

such person shall, if required, by such Officer, give his name and address.

*Movement through Infected Areas by Railway Permitted.*

7. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through an Infected Area or Areas, from a place outside any such Area to another place outside any such Area, but the animals shall not be untrucked within any Infected Area or Areas through which they are so moved.

*Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.*

8.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered.

(b) Before such movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

*Cattle.*—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

*Sheep.*—A letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

*Pigs.*—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

*Closing of Footpaths and Premises.*

9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right-of-way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in an Infected Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

*Control of Dogs and Poultry.*

10.—(1) Within a radius of two miles from any place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease all dogs shall at all times, except whilst in a dwelling-house, be kept by the owner thereof under control by being:—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) accompanied by the owner, or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(b) Any dog which is not kept under control as prescribed by this Order may be seized by the Local Authority, or by the Police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with in the same manner as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act,

1906, is thereby authorised to be dealt with. No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purpose of vivisection.

(2) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in an Infected Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises;

(3) Copies of such notices when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

#### *Movement of Imported Animals.*

11. Imported animals intended to be moved from an approved Landing Place to a destination within any of the Infected Areas shall be accompanied throughout the movement by

(1) a licence issued under this Order by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination, and in the case of cattle, sheep or goats, by (2) the licence granted by the Inspector of the Ministry under the Imported Animals Order of 1923 (No. 2) authorising the removal of the animals from the Landing Place. The last mentioned licence shall not be issued until the Local Authority's licence is produced to the Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place.

#### *Local Authority to enforce Order.*

12. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### *Offences.*

13. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder or of the conditions of any licence granted thereunder shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### *Commencement.*

14. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

#### *Short Title.*

15. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 14).
