## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £30,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

## TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th February, 1924, to Saturday, the 1st March, 1924, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

## 4% TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax and will, as indicated in the Notice of 5th October, 1923, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th February, 1924, to Saturday, the 1st March, 1924, inclusive, the first dividend, payable on the 15th April, 1924, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of One Shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

**USE OF CINEMATOGRAPH OR SIMILAR APPARATUS IN CINEMATOGRAPH FILM STORES.****PROPOSED HOME OFFICE ORDER.**

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 1 (4) of the Celluloid and Cinematograph Film Act, 1922, of making Orders with respect to the use of any cinematograph or similar apparatus upon any premises used for any purpose to which the Act applies, he proposes to make an Order as in the draft printed below, to apply to all cinematograph film stores in which cinematograph or similar apparatus is used.

Copies of the draft Order and the Notice may be obtained on application to the Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1.

Any objections to the proposed Order must be sent to the Secretary of State at the Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1, within 21 days after the date of this Notice. The objection must be in writing and must state—

- (a) the draft Order or portions of the draft Order objected to;
- (b) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (c) the omissions, additions, or modifications asked for.

Where any objection is made jointly on behalf of a number of occupiers, the names of the occupiers and their addresses must be stated, or, if the objection is made by an

association of occupiers on behalf of its members, the number of the members affected by the Order.

**CINEMATOGRAPH, ENGLAND.**

Order dated \_\_\_\_\_, 1924, made by the Secretary of State under section 1 (4) (a) of the Celluloid and Cinematograph Film Act, 1922 (12 & 13 Geo. 5, c. 35), with respect to the use of cinematograph or similar apparatus in cinematograph film stores.

In pursuance of Section 1 (4) (a) of the Celluloid and Cinematograph Film Act, 1922, I hereby make the following Regulations with respect to the use of any cinematograph or similar apparatus upon any premises used for any purpose to which the Act applies:—

1.—(a) The projecting apparatus shall be placed on firm supports constructed of fire-resisting material.

(b) Every lantern shall be fitted with a metal shutter which can readily be inserted by hand between the source of light and the film-gate, and every projector shall be fitted with a metal shutter so arranged as automatically to cut off the film-gate from the source of light when the projector stops.

(c) The construction of the film-gate shall be substantial and such as to afford ample heat-radiating surface. The passage for the film shall be sufficiently narrow to prevent flames travelling upwards or downwards from the light-opening.

2.—(a) Projectors shall be fitted with two metal boxes of substantial construction to and from which the film shall be made to travel, unless both the film spools are contained in a metal chamber of substantial construction below the projector. There shall not be more than 2,000 feet of film in either of the two metal boxes.

(b) The film boxes or chamber shall be made to close in such a manner, and shall be fitted with film slots so constructed, as to prevent the passage of flame to the interior of the box or chamber, and they shall remain so closed during the whole time that projection is taking place.

3. Take-up spools shall be mechanically driven and films shall be wound upon spools so that the wound film shall not at any time reach or project beyond the edges of the flanges of the spool.

4. During the projection all films when not in use shall be kept in closed metal boxes of substantial construction. When in the room in or from which the films are projected not more than six spools shall be kept in one box at the same time.
