THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 17th day of January, 1924, in the words and figures

following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Brompton Ralph and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Tolland, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells: "Whereas Commissioners appointed at our

request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon

the union of the said two Benefices of Brompton Ralph and Tolland duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended

in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Brompton Ralph is now full, the Reverend Guy Lauder Fitzmaurice being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Tolland is at present vacant:

is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said Guy Lauder Fitzmaurice has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas there is charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Brompton Ralph a pension in excess of £50 per annum to the Reverend Alfred Ernest Wansbrough, late Incumbent of such Benefice:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, of the said Reverend Alfred Ernest Wansbrough, the Patron of the said Benefice of Brompton Ralph and of the Right Honourable George, Viscount Cave, Knight Grand Cross of Saint Michael and Saint George, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and as such Lord High Chancellor. the Patron on behalf of Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors of the said Benefice of Tolland (in testimony whereof they have hereunto set their respective hands), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Brompton Ralph and the said Benefice of Tolland shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Brompton Ralph with Tolland' but the parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Guy Lauder Fitzmaurice if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Brompton Ralph, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Brompton Ralph shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Tolland and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale be applied as follows, that is to say (a)

towards defraying such expenses as may seem reasonable to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and the Bishop of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells for improving the water supply, and providing a bathroom at the Parsonage House belonging to the United Benefice and for purchasing certain land and outbuildings connected therewith and (b) any balance of such net proceeds shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as an addition to the endowments of the United Benefice.

4. That upon the said union taking effect or upon the cessation of the said pension payable to the said Alfred Ernest Wansbrough if such pension has not ceased before the union takes effect all the tithe rent charges glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong thereto shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of South Twerton, The Ascension, in the said Diocese of Bath and Wells with the annual sum or yearly rent charge hereinafter mentioned:—that is to say—a clear annual sum or yearly rent charge equivalent in amount to the gross yearly value of a sum of £4515s. 10d. Tithe Rent Charge as determined in accordance with the Statutory provisions for the time and from time to time in force, for ascertaining the sum payable in respect of Tithe Rent Charge and to be paid half yearly as hereinafter provided and so that the amount of the half yearly instalment of the said yearly rent charge to be paid on each half yearly day hereunder shall be the same or the like amount as would in accordance with the aforesaid Statutory provisions have become payable in respect of such sum of £45 15s. 10d. Tithe Rent Charge on the last preceding half yearly day for payment of Tithe Rent Charge. said yearly rent charge to be as from the date of the said union taking effect or as from the date of the cessation of the said pension due and payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of South Twerton, The Ascension. and to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said Benefice of South Twerton, The Ascension, or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by half yearly instalments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year. And for the recovery of the said yearly rent charge the Incumbent of the said Benefice of South Twerton, The Ascension, and his successors shall have and be entitled to all such or the like powers and remedies as are expressed to be conferred by Section 44 of the Conveyancing and Law of Property Act, 1881, in relation to rent charges within the purview of that Section. Provided always that if at any time by reason of any redemption of Tithe Rent Charge belonging to the said United Benefice or any sale of or other transfer of the right to receive any such Tithe Rent Charge the endowments chargeable with the said yearly rent charge shall no longer include any sum whatsoever of Tithe Rent Charge then and in such case as from the date on which such redemption sale or transfer shall take effect the amount of the said yearly

rent charge shall cease to be regulated by the value of Tithe Rent Charge and shall thereafter be a fixed annual sum equivalent to the amount payable in respect of the said yearly rent charge for the year ending on the half yearly day for the payment thereof which last preceded the aforesaid date. Provided also that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him grant convey and annex or if by any other instrument in accordance with statutory authority there shall at any time be annexed to the said Benefice of South Twerton, The Ascension, in lieu of or in substitution for the yearly rent charge hereby created any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Bath and Wells for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the yearly rent charge hereby created as aforesaid then the said yearly rent charge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

"And provided also that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now or hereafter payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said United Benefice shall continue to be payable by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in each series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Tolland shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Brompton Ralph shall have the second and third turns.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected, together with a notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bath and Wells has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

JUTE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

Proposal to Vary the General Minimum Piece Rates and Overtime Rates for Female Workers employed on Hessian Weaving as Double Loom Weavers in the Areas of Aberdeen, Barrow-in-Furness, Dundee and Tayport.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Jute Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Piece Rates and Overtime Rates for Female Workers employed on Hessian Weaving in the Areas of Aberdeen, Barrow-in-Furness, Dundee and Tayport, set

out in their Notice J. (29) dated 8th June, 1923, in their application to Double Loom Weavers, by providing (a) that the STANDARD GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE RATE for Double Loom Weavers set out in Section I (b) of Part I of the Notice J. (29) shall be 15 per cent. less than the Standard General Minimum Piece Rate for Single Loom Weavers, instead of 20 per cent. less than the Standard General Minimum Piece Rate for Single Loom Weavers, as at present, (b) that the other General Minimum Piece Rates for Double Loom Weavers specified in the Notice J. (29) shall be calculated in the manner provided in that Notice on the basis of the proposed Standard General Minimum Piece Rate, and (c) that the Overtime Rates for Double Loom Weavers shall be calculated in the manner provided in Part III of the Notice J. (29) on the basis of the General Minimum Piece Rates proposed above.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within 2 months from 26th February, 1924. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Jute Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely and so far as possible with reasons what is objected to.
