(3) Each dipping shall, where practicable, take place on lands to which this Article applies, but where such dipping is not practicable, the Notice may require the dipping to be carried out on other premises specified in the Notice, and may impose any conditions as to movement, detention, isolation and dipping of the sheep which the Inspector may consider desirable and specify in the Notice.

(4) If the owner or person in charge of sheep to which a Notice served under paragraph (2) of this Article relates fails to comply with any condition specified in such Notice he shall, according to his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4.—(1) The provisions of Articles 2 and 3 of this Order shall apply also to any lands in the neighbourhood to which they may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspec-

tor of the Ministry or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the lands described in such Notice, and shall cease to apply to any such lands upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) A copy of every notice served under this Article by an Inspector of the Local Authority shall forthwith be sent to the Ministry by the Inspector signing the same.

*Power to Prohibit Exposure of Undipped Sheep on Lands in Double Dipping Area.*

Such portions of the parishes of Llangynog, Llanrhaidr-ym-Mochnant, and Pennant as lie to the north, north-east and north-west of the road running from Bala via Llangynog, Penybont Fawr, to the village of Llanrhaidr-ym-Mochnant; and

In the administrative county of Denbigh.

Such portions of the parishes of Llanrhaidr-ym-Mochnant, Llanarmon Mynydd Mawr, Llansilin, and Llanarmon Duffryn Ceiriog as lie to the north-west of the road running from Penybont Fawr through the village of Llanrhaidr-ym-Mochnant via Llidiart and Cae Hir to the village of Llanarmon Dyffryn Ceiriog, but excluding that portion of the parish of Llanarmon Dyffryn Ceiriog which lies to the north and north-east of the River Ceiriog.
