FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Home Secretary gives notice, that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an order authorising the employment on two day shifts of male young persons of 16 years of age and over in parting, fettling and grinding in the Stainless Steel Casting Department at the works of Messrs. Thomas Frith & Sons, Limited, Weedon Street, Tinsley, Sheffield, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation shall be provided.
