## THE UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACTS, 1877-1923.

The following Statute made by the Chancellor, Masters and Scholars of the University of Cambridge on the 1st day of February, 1924, and approved by the University of Cambridge Commissioners on the 8th day of March, 1924, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes in relation to the University of Cambridge, made under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877" (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 48), and having been approved by the University of Cambridge Commissioners, under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923" (13 and 14 George V, Chapter 33), which approval is testified by the Common Seal of the Commissioners being hereunto affixed, is now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Chancellor, Masters and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 53rd section of The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and by the 11th section of the

Schedule to the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, in relation to our said University in manner following, that is to say:—

By adding to Statute B the following Chapter to be inserted between Chapters XI and XII of that Statute:—

*"Chapter XI A. Pensions for persons holding Office in the University.*

"(1) All persons appointed after 19th November, 1923, to hold office in the University shall, if eligible, be required to join in any University Scheme for Pensions for such persons which may be approved by the Statutory Commissioners (1923).

(2) The University shall have power to come to an agreement with any person already holding any University office for the surrender by him of rights under the present Statutes and the substitution of rights under such Pension Scheme as aforesaid, or any modification thereof specified in the Agreement, and for the payment by the University of such capital and annual sums as may be required to carry out any such agreement."

We, the University of Cambridge Commissioners, acting under the powers conferred on us by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do approve Chapter XI A,

herein set forth, to be added to Statute B of the Statutes for the University of Cambridge: Such Chapter being a Statute wholly for the said University.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 21st March, 1924, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £30,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

#### TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 24th March, 1924, to Saturday, the 29th March, 1924, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date

on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

#### 4% TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax and will, as indicated in the Notice of 5th October, 1923, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 24th March, 1924, to Saturday, the 29th March, 1924, inclusive, the first dividend, payable on the 15th April, 1924, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

*By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other Provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."*

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for seventy Hackney Carriages at Seymour Street, Barnby Street, and Amptill Square, in four portions, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

*First Portion.*—Ten Carriages at Seymour Street, commencing immediately North of the Carriage entrance to Euston Railway Station, extending Northward, by kerb, as far as necessary for ten carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the South.

*Second Portion.*—Twenty-eight Carriages at Barnby Street, South side of roadway, extending Westward, by kerb, as far as Amptill Square.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

NOTE.—No cab will be allowed to stand in this portion between 6 a.m. and 8.30 a.m.

*Third Portion.*—Sixteen Carriages at Amptill Square, on South side commencing at a point opposite Barnby Street, extending Westward by kerb, as far as necessary for sixteen carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

*Fourth Portion.*—Sixteen Carriages at Amptill Square, West side, commencing at South-west corner of enclosure, extending Northward by railings as far as necessary for sixteen carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the South.

The First portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion, the second from the third, and the third from the fourth portions.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriageway.
