

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 21ST MARCH, 1924.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The premises described in the Schedule

hereto which were declared by the Orders specified in the Schedule to be Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Places are hereby declared to be free from Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries is hereunto affixed this twenty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

1905	1923. 6th December ...	The fields known as Newhaid Field and Red Bank Field on Bank Close Farm, in the occupation of Raymond Hill, in the parish of Northallerton, in the administrative county of the North Riding of Yorkshire.
2391	1924. 10th January ...	All the lands and buildings at Crowhilloch, in the occupation of James Badenoch, in the parish of Gamrie, in the county of Banff.
2517	18th January ...	The farm buildings, the stockyards and the field adjoining thereto, at Channel Farm, in the occupation of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, in the parish of Sunk Island, in the administrative county of the East Riding of Yorkshire.
2641	29th January ...	The holding, known as East Henshilwood, in the occupation of John Hepburn, in the parish of Carnwath, in the county of Lanark.

2706	2nd February ..	The buildings and premises, also the Fern Hill Paddock adjoining thereto and the two fields known as the Dairy Field and Cricket Field, being part of Fern Hill Farm, in the occupation of Robert Furborough, in the parish of Wolvey, in the administrative county of Warwick.
2727	4th February ...	Extensions of Limits of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place described in the Schedule to the Order of the Minister, dated 30th January, 1924 (No. 2666).

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED
AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 44).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power

enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Formation of Further Infected Area.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 34), shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were an Infected Area, described in the First Schedule to that Order.

Restriction on Landing of Animals at Bristol.

2. The Landing of Imported Animals at the approved Landing Places at the Port of Bristol is hereby prohibited.
