Further Infected Area.

11. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Gloucester.

The County Borough of Bristol.

The petty sessional divisions of Lawford's Gate (including its detached part) Sodbury, Wotton-under-Edge, and Thornbury, and

The parishes of Didmorton, Alkington, and Ham and Stone.

In the county of Wilts.

The borough of Chippenham;

The petty sessional divisions of Bradford, Trowbridge, Melksham (*except the parish of Seend*), Chippenham (*except the parishes of Kelloways, Sutton Benger, Draycott Cerme, Christian Maford, and Seagry*) and

The parishes of Hullavington, Norton, Alderton, Luckington, Sopworth and Sherston.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE:
INFECTED PLACES.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts,

1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The several premises mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be places infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

SCHEDULE.

*Description and Limits of Infected Places.**Bedfordshire.*

1. Turvey Cottage, and the twenty-six acres of land comprising the property, in the occupation of Rupert Allen, in the parish of Turvey, in the administrative county of Bedford.

Derbyshire.

2. The buildings, and the land attached thereto, known as Field Farm, in the occupation of H. P. & J. H. Holt, in the parish of Chaddesden, in the administrative county of Derby.

Leicestershire.

3. The farm buildings, and paddock, at Beaumont Leys Farm, comprising part of Leicester Sewage Farm, in the occupation of the Leicester City Corporation, in the parish of Beaumont Leys, in the administrative county of Leicester.

Norfolk.

4. The farm buildings, premises, and land, known as Grange Farm, in the occupation of Sydney Frank Lee Warner, in the parish of Northwold, in the administrative county of Norfolk.

Northamptonshire.

5. The forty acres, and the Meadow Field, at Cracks Hill Farm, in the occupation of J. Lansbury, in the parish of Crick, in the administrative county of Northampton.

Nottinghamshire.

6. The whole of the buildings and yards at the home premises, together with the fields known as the Home Paddock, The Orchard, Long Summer Gangs, Middle Summer Gangs, Little Hoggins, The Hams, and Conycroft, forming part of Manor Farm, in the occupation of Alvey Sheldon, in the parish of Shelford, in the administrative county of Nottingham.

Shropshire.

7. The fields known as Cordey Field, and New Meadow, and the buildings thereon, of Wood Farm, Codsall Wood, in the occupation of Frank Nock, in the parish of Donington, in the administrative county of Shropshire.

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
