**WHEREAS** by the Representation of the People Acts, 1918 to 1922, power is conferred on His Majesty to make provision for various matters by Order in Council:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Order His Majesty was pleased, by Order in Council, to make provision for various matters under those Acts:

And whereas by section 13 (2) of the Representation of the People Act, 1918 (in this Act referred to as "the Act"), the rules contained in the First Schedule to that Act may be altered by Order in Council:

And whereas by section 40 (2) of the Act, any Order in Council made thereunder may be revoked or varied as occasion requires by any subsequent Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by those Acts and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following Form of Declaration shall be added to, and deemed to be part of, the Forms of Statement Nos. (1), (2) and (3) set out or referred to under Heading V in Schedules I, II, and III, of the Representation of the People Order ("Forms of Statement to be made under Section 5 (2) of the Act.")

" 1. (Where the man is already registered as a naval or military voter).

I declare that I am registered for the following constituency and qualifying premises.

and that, having made a statement of my qualification in respect of other qualifying premises, I do not desire my name to remain on the register in respect of the premises described in this declaration.

2. (Where the man is not registered as a naval or military voter).

I declare that I am not registered for any constituency in respect of a qualification which I should have had if not serving in H.M. Forces.

Provided that a statement received by the registration officer not later than the 15th day of June, 1924, need not include such declaration.

2. The following Rule shall be inserted after Rule 9 of the Representation of the People Order:

“ 9A. The following paragraph shall be added at the end of Rule 6 of the First Schedule to the Act (which provides for the preparation of electors lists):

‘ Provided that if it appears to the registration officer, after inquiry as aforesaid, that any person serving as a member of any of the naval, military or air forces of the Crown is entitled to be registered as a parliamentary elector in respect of qualifying premises in the registration area in pursuance of section five of this Act and is not so registered in the register in force, he shall, if he has not already received from that person a statement in the prescribed form in accordance with subsection (2) of that section, forthwith notify the person in writing that unless such statement is received from him he will not be registered in respect of those premises, and the registration officer shall not unless and until he receives such statement include the name of the person as a parliamentary elector in the electors lists in respect of the premises.’ ”

3. The following Rule shall be inserted after Rule 13 of the Representation of the People Order:

“ 13B. The following paragraph shall be added to Rule 23 of the First Schedule to the Act (which provides for the correction of electors lists):

“ The registration officer for any constituency in which a naval or military voter serving in His Majesty's forces is registered shall expunge the name of the voter if he receives a notification from the registration officer for any other constituency that the voter will in pursuance of a statement made by the voter in the prescribed form be registered in the register then in course of preparation for that other constituency.’ ”

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 20th day of December, 1923, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Marlborough, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Marlborough, Saint Mary the Virgin, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Marlborough, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, and Marlborough, Saint Mary the Virgin, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Salisbury and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Marlborough, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, and Marlborough, Saint Mary the Virgin, are now full, the Reverend Charles Dixon Hoste being the present Incumbent thereof:

“ And whereas the said Charles Dixon Hoste has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Marlborough, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, and Marlborough, Saint Mary the Virgin, at present belongs to one and the same Patron:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Marlborough, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, and the said Benefice of Marlborough, Saint Mary the Virgin, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style

of 'The United Benefice of Marlborough, Saint Peter and Saint Paul with Saint Mary the Virgin,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Charles Dixon Hoste if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Marlborough, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, and Marlborough, Saint Mary the Virgin, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That a Curate be appointed to assist in performing the duties of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Marlborough, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patron affected, together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Salisbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme are both situate in the Municipal Borough of Marlborough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 22nd day of November, 1923, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Luke, Nottingham, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Philip, Nottingham, both of which Benefices are situate in the City and County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Saint Luke, Nottingham, and Saint Philip, Nottingham, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Southwell and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Southwell signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Saint Luke, Nottingham, and Saint Philip, Nottingham, are now full, the Reverend Frank Johnson Taylor being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Nottingham, and the Reverend John Goulton being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Philip, Nottingham:

" And whereas the right of presentation or nomination to the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Nottingham, at present belongs to Sir Edward Hildred Carlile, of Ponsbourne Park, Hertford, in the County of Hertford, Baronet, M.P., The Venerable Robert Charles Joynt, of 12, Kingswood Road, London, S.E. 19, Archdeacon of Kingston on Thames and Canon Residentiary of Southwark Cathedral, The Reverend Prebendary Edward Grose Hodge, Rector of Birmingham and Honorary Canon of Birmingham, The Reverend Canon Arthur Blackwell Goulburn Lillingston, of the College, Durham, Canon Residentiary of Durham Cathedral and Sir Thomas Walker Hobart Inskip, Knight, K.C., M.P., of No. 3, Hare Court, Temple, in the City of London:

" And whereas the right of presentation or nomination to the said Benefice of Saint Philip, Nottingham, at present belongs to Henry Edward Thornton, Esquire, of Wymeshead, Kegworth, in the County of Leicester, Clement Boughton Kingdon, Esquire, of Stamford Hill, Stratton, in the County of Cornwall, the said Robert Charles Joynt, the said Edward Grose

Hodge, and the said Thomas Walker Hobart Inskip :

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, and also with the consent of the said Edward Hildred Carlile, Robert Charles Joynt, Edward Grose Hodge, Arthur Blackwell Goulburn Lillingston, Thomas Walker Hobart Inskip, Henry Edward Thornton, and Clement Boughton Kingdon (in testimony whereof they have hereunto set their hands respectively), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say :—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Nottingham, and the said Benefice of Saint Philip, Nottingham, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ' The United Benefice of Saint Philip with Saint Luke, Nottingham ' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided.

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Saint Philip, Nottingham, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Saint Philip, Nottingham, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice, and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Luke, Nottingham, shall be transferred to the Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Luke, Nottingham, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 5. That upon the union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Saint Philip, Nottingham, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 6. That upon the union taking effect (a) the fund amounting to £850 at present held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the purpose of providing a Parsonage House for the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Nottingham, shall be excepted out of the union and invested by us as an addition to the endowments of the Benefice of Saint Ann, Nottingham, situate in the said Diocese of Southwell (b) a part, amounting to £50 per annum of the annual payment now made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Nottingham, shall also be excepted out of the union and be paid by us to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Ann, Nottingham, and (c) the fund amounting to £691 1s. 5d. at present held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Nottingham, shall also be excepted out of the union and held and accumulated by the said Governors for and towards the endowment of the proposed District of Saint Jude, Nottingham, to be taken wholly or partly out of the said Benefice of Saint Ann, Nottingham.

" 7. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Saint Philip, Nottingham.

" 8.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Luke, Nottingham, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the provisions of the 17th section of the Union of Benefices Act, 1860, as incorporated with modifications in the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919.

" (b) the Font, Communion Table, Sacramental Plate, Bells and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Luke, Nottingham, or such of them as may not be required for the Parish Church of the United Benefice shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Southwell for use in the Church of the said proposed District of Saint Jude, Nottingham, or be transferred to any other Church or Chapel, or Churches or Chapels, within the Diocese of Southwell, which the Bishop may select.

" (c) the net proceeds to arise from the sale or sales to be made by us as aforesaid after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Southwell under the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, removal of human remains and monuments and all other expenses incidental to these matters shall be held and accumulated by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for and towards the endowment of the said proposed District of Saint Jude, Nottingham.

" Provided always that this Scheme shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, are made requisite to the sale or letting or appropriation under the powers conferred by



that Act of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale hereby proposed of the Church of Saint Luke, Nottingham, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof.

“ And provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected, together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Southwell has been duly given in the manner

and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme are both situate in the City or Municipal Borough of Nottingham:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 7th day of February, 1924, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Luke, Whaley Thorns, situate within the Parish of Bolsover, in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Southwell:

“ Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Bolsover, of the Parish of Scarcliffe, of the Parish of Upper Langwith, both in the said County and Diocese, and of the Parish of Norton Cuckney, in the County of Nottingham and in the said Diocese of Southwell, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

“ And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Bolsover, of the said Parish of Scarcliffe, of the said Parish of Upper Langwith, and of the said Parish of Norton Cuckney should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Luke, Whaley Thorns, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Scarcliffe, with the consent of the Most Noble William John Arthur Charles James, Duke of Portland, K.G., as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Bolsover as well as of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Norton Cuckney, and with the consent of the Most Noble Victor Christian William, Duke of Devonshire, K.G., as the Patron of the Rectory of the said Parish of Upper Langwith (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Bolsover, of the said Parish of Scarcliffe, of the said Parish of Upper Langwith, and of the said Parish

of Norton Cuckney, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Luke, Whaley Thorns, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, Whaley Thorns.’

“ We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

*Substitution of Infected Areas.*

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 34) shall be read and have effect as if the Areas described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Areas described in the First Schedule to that Order.

*Revocation of Certain Orders.*

2. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

*Restriction on Landing of Animals at Bristol.*

3. The Landing of Imported Animals at the approved Landing Places at the Port of Bristol is hereby prohibited.

*Commencement.*

4. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

*Short Title.*

5. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 45), and shall be read with the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 34).
