to Boon Hills Wood, and extending thence first south westward and then southward along the middle of the last mentioned roadway for a distance of 43 chains or thereabouts to the northern entrance of the last mentioned wood, and extending thence in a straight line due south across such wood for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the footpath leading along the southern side of such wood towards Upper Langwith, and extending thence south westward along the middle of the said footpath (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Norton Cuckney from the said Parish of Upper Langwith) for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such footpath across the said Mansfield and Worksop Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the same line of railway across the road leading from Nether Langwith to Upper Langwith, and extending thence south west-ward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 39 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Scarcliffe Lanes, and extending thence first north westward, then south westward and then again north westward along the middle of Scarcliffe Lanes (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Upper Langwith from the said Parish of Scarcliffe) for a distance of 1 mile or thereabouts to its junction with Moor Lane, and extending thence first westward, then north westward and then again westward along the middle of Moor Lane for a distance of 1 mile and 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the said road leading from Mansfield to Clowne upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Scarcliffe from the said Parish of Bolsover, at which point the said imaginary line commenced.'

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.
