On 27th March, 1924 :—

BELSIZE ROAD,
KILBURN.

Fifteen vehicles :

First Portion.—One carriage on south side of roadway, to stand at a point 3 yards from the building line east of High Road, Kilburn.

Front of vehicle toward the West.

Second Portion.—Fourteen carriages on south side of roadway, commencing at a point 15 yards from the building line east of High Road, Kilburn, extending eastward, by kerb, as far as necessary for fourteen carriages.

At north-east corner of the Square, commencing at the angle opposite Chandos Street and Cavendish Place, and extending southward by kerb of garden enclosure.

Front of vehicles facing West.

On 27th March, 1924 :—

BELSIZE ROAD,
KILBURN.

Twenty vehicles :

Commencing at the foot crossing at junction of High Road, Kilburn, and extending eastward along south side of road.

Front of vehicles facing High Road.

On 1st April, 1924 :—

MARYLEBONE ROAD,
NOTTINGHAM TERRACE.

Three vehicles :

In Marylebone Road on the North side, commencing East of lamp-post by Western entrance to Nottingham Terrace, extending Eastwards along the kerb by the railings as far as necessary.
