in the Tanganyika Territory shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs, and for the 26th day of July, 1910, in Section 24 (1) (b).

2. This Order may be cited as the Copyright Act, 1911, (Extension to the Tanganyika Territory) Order, 1924.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Albert, late Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Nayland and Wiston (or Wissington) duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Nayland and Wiston (or Wissington) are now

acant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, now Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"I. That the said Benefice of Nayland and the said Benefice of Wiston (or Wissington) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Nayland and Wiston (or Wissington)' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the

union shall forthwith take effect.

accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

Whereas by the Public Schools Act, 1868, 31 and 32 Vic., Cap.118, it is inter alia enacted as follows:—

Section 25. Any Scheme authorised to be made under this Act may contain all powers and provisions that may be thought expedient for carrying into effect its objects and where any Scheme authorises the purchase or acquisition of any lands there shall be deemed to be incorporated with such Scheme "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845" with the exception of the provisions relating to the purchase of lands otherwise than by agreement and of the provisions relating to entry upon land to intersected lands and to the recovery of forfeitures penalties and costs and of the provisions relating to access to the special Act.

By Section 26 it is provided (among other things) that the new Governing Body of Shrewsbury School may if they deem it expedient at any time after the passing of the Act lay a Scheme before Her Majesty in Council for the removal of the School from its actual site to some other place and may provide in such Scheme for the sale or mortgage of any property belonging to such School and for the purchase of other property and generally for all matters required to effect such removal in a convenient manner to the same extent as if such Governing Body were the absolute owners of any property they might be dealing with under this Section as purchasers vendors or otherwise.

And whereas divers other Acts of Parliament have since been passed continuing and enlarging the powers conferred by the above mentioned Act and in particular it was by the 2nd section of the Public Schools Act, 1869, enacted that "Any Governing Body established for any of the Schools to which the said Act (meaning the Public Schools Act, 1868) applies shall as in the case of Westminster School be a Body Corporate with perpetual succession and a Common Seal and with power to hold lands for the purposes of the School for which it is established without license of mortmain."

And whereas in the years One thousand eight hundred and ninety and One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one the Governing Body acquired by purchase divers other lands (which are adjacent to the said lands coloured pink on the said plan and are thereon coloured green) for the purposes of the said School and such purchase was sanctioned by an Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body on the twenty-fifth day of May One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two which Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of October One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

And whereas in the year One thousand nine hundred and twelve the Governing Body acquired the freehold land delineated and coloured yellow on the said plan and the leasehold land delineated and coloured blue thereon for the purposes of the School and such purchases were sanctioned by a Scheme proposed by the Governing Body dated the eighteenth day of January One thousand nine hundred and twelve which Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by His Majesty King George V in Council on the fourteenth day of May One thousand nine hundred and twelve.

And whereas in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty the Governing Body acquired by purchase the freehold messuage land and hereditaments delineated on the said plan and therein coloured orange for the purposes of the School and in the year One thousand nine hundred and seventeen the Governing Body acquired the leasehold land delineated on the plan and therein coloured brown for the purposes of the School and the said purchases were sanctioned by a further Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body and dated the twenty-first day of April One thousand nine hundred and twenty which Amending Scheme was approved and sanctioned by an Order of His Majesty King George V in Council dated the twenty-second day of July One thousand nine hundred and twenty.

And whereas in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one the Governing Body acquired by purchase the freehold messuages land and hereditaments delineated and coloured mauve on the said plan for the purposes of the School in consideration of an annual rent charge of Three hundred pounds for twenty years and at or about the same time the Governing Body acquired the leasehold hereditaments delineated on the said plan and therein coloured magenta for the purposes of the School and the said purchases were sanctioned by a further Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body dated the eighth day of August One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one which Amending Scheme was approved and sanctioned by an Order of His Majesty King George V in Council dated the thirty-first day of October One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

And whereas all of the said purchases were greatly for the benefit of the School and were rendered necessary chiefly by the increase of the number of boys attending the School.

And whereas it has now become necessary to provide further accommodation for boarders attending the said School under the following circumstances. Mr. Arthur Frederick Chance who has for many years past used a leasehold house of his own as a boarding house for the accommodation of thirty-two boys or thereabouts attending the School has intimated to the Headmaster that he wishes to be relieved

of the cares of keeping a boarding house and while willing to continue to teach he wishes to retain his house for his own private use.

And whereas the cost of building a boarding house is still almost if not quite prohibitive and it is inadvisable to appropriate any part of the land already belonging to the School as a site for a boarding house when additional space especially for football grounds is urgently needed.

And whereas in these circumstances by an agreement dated the fifth day of April One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four and made between John Henry Barker of No. 19, College Hill, Shrewsbury, Solicitor, of the one part and The Governing Body of Shrewsbury School of the other part the said John Henry Barker agreed to sell and the Governing Body agreed to purchase the freehold messuage known as Severn Hill House together with the lodge and other buildings and the land and hereditaments described in the First Schedule hereto and delineated on the said plan and therein coloured dark green for Five thousand two hundred and fifty pounds.

And whereas the said John Henry Barker required the Governing Body to decide at once whether they would purchase the said premises of him or not as he was unwilling to keep them

And whereas the purchase of the said premises from the said John Henry Barker is very desirable in the interest of the School for the following reasons in addition to those hereinbefore appearing namely (1) The house is substantial and well built and roomy and can be added to at comparatively small expense so as to afford suitable accommodation for thirty or forty boys (2) It would be impossible to find another suitable house in the immediate neighbourhood (3) There is a paddock adjoining the house which could be converted into a football ground (4) Except where it is bounded by the road the property is entirely surrounded by the property of the School and the grounds and drive of "Ridgemount" belonging to the School and shown on the said plan can be overlooked from Severn Hill House aforesaid and if the site of Severn Hill House was developed for building purposes it might seriously diminish the value of Ridgemount.

And whereas it is apprehended that the Governing Body have not power under the Original Scheme or the said Amending Schemes to acquire the said freehold hereditaments described in the said Schedule hereto.

The Governing Body of Shrewsbury School do hereby propose by virtue of and in pursuance of the powers hereinbefore mentioned to alter the Original Scheme as follows (that is to say):—

The Original Scheme shall throughout be read and construed as though the messuage lodge and other buildings land and hereditaments described in the said Schedule hereto and delineated and coloured dark green on the said plan annexed hereto had been described in the Schedule to the said Original Scheme and delineated on the plan thereto annexed and therein coloured pink And that the said agreement of the fifth day of April One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four and the carrying into effect thereof may be deemed to have been authorised by the Original Scheme.

The Schedule above referred to:-

First all that messuage or dwelling house called Severn Hill House with the offices outbuildings yard gardens and appurtenances thereunto belonging together with the piece of land adjoining thereto containing in the whole by admeasurement four acres one rood thirty-seven perches seventeen yards or thereabouts situate at or near Kingsland in the Parish of Meole Brace in the County of Salop.

And secondly all that messuage or lodge known as the "Upper Lodge" with the land and appurtenances thereto belonging situate at Port Hill Shrewsbury aforesaid and adjoining the High Road between Shrewsbury aforesaid and Hanwood at or near the top of Port Hill aforesaid.

Authorisation of Landing of Animals for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The animals, on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.
