TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 16th May, 1924, at 1 o'clock, for:—

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, The National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £30,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 19th May, 1924, to Saturday, the 24th May, 1924, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will as indicated in the Notice of 1st April, 1924, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 19th May, 1924, to Saturday, the 24th May, 1924, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th October,

1924, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of One shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS CONSOLIDATION AND AMENDMENT ACT, 1913.

PRESERVATION ORDER IN RELATION TO THE EARTHWORKS IN THE PARISH OF COLCHESTER IN THE COUNTY OF ESSEX.

Whereas by Section 6 (1) of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act 1913 it is enacted that if the Ancient Monuments Board constituted under the Act report to the Commissioners of Works that any monument is in danger of destruction or removal or damage from neglect or injudicious treatment and that the preservation of the monument is of national importance the Commissioners may if they think fit and if it appears to them that the monument is an ancient monument within the meaning of the Act make an Order (in the Act referred to as a Preservation Order) placing the monument under the protection of the Commissioners. And whereas the Ancient Monuments Board constituted under the said Act have reported to the Commissioners of Works that the monument hereinafter mentioned is in danger of destruction or removal and that the preservation thereof is of national importance. Now therefore the Commissioners of Works in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the said Act and of every other power enabling them do hereby Order that the Earthworks in the Parish of Colchester in the County of Essex more particularly delineated and shown upon the plan attached hereto being in the opinion of the Commissioners of Works an ancient monument within the meaning of the said Act shall as from the date hereof be and remain under the protection of the Commissioners of Works.

This Order shall cease to have effect on the expiration of the period of eighteen months after the date hereof unless it is confirmed by Parliament.

Nothing in the Order shall prevent the driving on the highways or portions of highways specified in the Schedules hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said roads") of—

(i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said roads or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;

(ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said roads; or

(iii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads.

"The Order" means any such Order of the Electricity Commissioners as aforesaid;

"The District" means any such Electricity District as aforesaid;

"The reserved area" means such of the areas comprised in the District as are referred to under the foregoing head (A).

To extend the area of supply of the Company by the addition thereto of the Rural District of Riccall in the East Riding of the County of York and such parts of the Rural Districts of Tadcaster (except the parish of Askham Bryan) and Wetherby in the West Riding of the said County as lie to the north of the River Wharfe.

To provide for the transfer to the Joint Authority and to Electrical Distribution of Yorkshire Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Distribution Company") respectively of a main transmission line and certain cables lines lands works and apparatus of the Company and of the benefit and obligations of the Company under certain agreements for the supply of electricity.

To constitute the Company authorised distributors in respect of an area (hereinafter referred to as "the distribution area") consisting of such parts of

(a) the area to be added to the existing area of supply as aforesaid; and

(b) so much of the said existing area as is not within the District

as do not form the area of supply of any other authorised distributor and to make other provisions in connection therewith.

The distribution area comprises the following (that is to say):—

The Rural District and parts of Rural Districts to be added to the existing area of supply of the Company as hereinbefore mentioned (except the parish of Barlby in the Rural District of Riccall and an area consisting of the parish of Tadcaster East and parts of the parishes of Healaugh Catterton and Oxtan all in the rural district of Tadcaster which is bounded by an imaginary line commencing at and drawn from the centre of the River Wharfe at the North End of Hornington Ings proceeding thence along the Oxtan township boundary in a northerly direction over the Tadcaster and Bolton Percy Road to a point 43 chains or thereabouts north of where the said boundary leaves the said road thence due north for a distance of $27\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts again joining the Oxtan township boundary and following the same until it joins the Catterton township boundary 5 chains or thereabouts north of "Rolling Bridge" thence following the Catterton township boundary for a distance of 33 chains

To make provisions as to the terms and conditions as to price and otherwise of the supply of electricity by the Company.

To amend section 47 of the Yorkshire Electric Power Act 1901 as to the laying of pipes and sections 53 54 and 59 of that Act as to the laying of electric lines in the Boroughs of Huddersfield Halifax and Barnsley.

To authorise the Company to supply electricity to premises in private streets and to break up such streets; to confer further powers upon the Company with reference to the breaking up of tramways and railways.

To confer powers upon the Company and other authorised undertakers with respect to the acquisition taking on lease use management and maintenance of generating stations and main transmission lines and other works and the exercise of powers of such other undertakers and other matters.

To incorporate or apply or render applicable all or some of the provisions of the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1922 and of the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 and to repeal or amend Acts and Orders of or relating to the Company.
