This day the Lords being met a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod acquainting them that *The Lords authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to the Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to:—*

- Trade Facilities Act, 1924.
- Poor Law Emergency Provisions Continuance (Scotland) Act, 1924.
- Bombay, Baroda and Central India Railway Act, 1924.
- Queen's Ferry Bridge Act, 1924.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that

Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 23rd May, 1924, at 1 o'clock, for:—

- (a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, The National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and
  - (b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.
2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

## TREASURY BILLS.

- 3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 26th May, 1924, to Saturday, the 31st May, 1924, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

#### 4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will as indicated in the Notice of 1st April, 1924, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 26th May, 1924, to Saturday, the 31st May, 1924, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th October, 1924, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of One shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

ROYAL COURTS OF JUSTICE.

#### TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT.

##### VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, before the King's Remembrancer at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint, in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, both days inclusive. We found that there were no gold coins in the said Pyx and we ascertained that the number of coins of silver, in each packet produced to us, corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of silver coins, making altogether 182 half-crowns, 121 florins, 73 shillings, 21 sixpences, 1 fourpence, 1 threepence, 1 twopence, and 1 penny, and weighed each of the said silver coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as so amended was plus ten thousandths of an ounce (+.010 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said silver coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Trial Plate made of pure silver (as prescribed by the Coinage Act, 1920) produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Acts, 1891 and 1920, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as so amended was minus eighty-one hundred-thousandths (or -.00081), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue 5 half-crowns, 3 florins, 2 shillings and 1 sixpence, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such half-crowns weighed respectively—the first 217.855 grains, the second 218.533 grains, the third 217.603 grains, the fourth 218.038 grains and the fifth 219.115 grains; that such florins weighed respectively—the first 174.573 grains, the second 174.804 grains, the third 174.661 grains; that such shillings weighed respectively—the first 87.235 grains, the second 87.084 grains, and that such sixpence weighed 43.604 grains. We then assayed the said 5 half-crowns, the said 3 florins, the said 2 shillings and the said

1 sixpence separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such half-crowns to be the first 497·07, the second 497·60, the third 498·35, the fourth 499·02 and the fifth 500·77; of such florins to be the first 497·67, the second 497·62 and the third 500·90; of such shillings to be the first 498·37 and the second 500·85; and of such sixpence to be 503·80.

#### TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE SYDNEY MINT.

##### VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the twenty-sixth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Sydney, in the State of New South Wales, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, to the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, both day inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took fourteen coins from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to eighty-four sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus one thousandth of an ounce (+·001 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus four hundred

thousandths (or +·00004), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue two sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 123·121 grains and the second 123·269 grains.

We then assayed the said two sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916·76 and the second 916·69 respectively.

#### TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE PRETORIA MINT.

##### VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the twenty-sixth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Pretoria in the Union of South Africa, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, to the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took all the coins from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to two sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and to one half-sovereign or ten-shilling piece, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was minus four ten-thousandths of an ounce (-·0004oz.) on the whole of such coins. We found that such sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 123·144 grains and the second 123·233 grains, and that such half-sovereign weighed 61·597 grains.

We then assayed the said two sovereigns and one half-sovereign separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916·68 and the second 917·09 respectively, and the millesimal fineness of such half-sovereign to be 916·92.

##### VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Perth in the State of Western Australia, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took two coins from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to eighty-six sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus two thousandths of an ounce (+·002 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus seventeen hundred thousandths (or +·00017), and that, therefore, the said metal

was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue four sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 123·297 grains, the second 123·295 grains, the third 123·220 grains and the fourth 123·261 grains.

We then assayed the said four sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916·89, the second 916·69, the third 916·68 and the fourth 916·78 respectively.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Melbourne in the State of Victoria, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took all the coins from the first, third and sixth packets and fourteen coins from each of the remaining packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to seventy-six sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus two thousandths of an ounce (+·002 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold

Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus eighteen hundred-thousandths (or + 00018), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue two sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively—the first 123.269 grains, and the second 123.149 grains.

We then assayed the said two sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 917.01 and the second 916.67 respectively.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to James Frederick Porter, a machine minder and bleacher's assistant employed by Messrs. Jackson & Co., of Cheetham, Manchester, for bravery in the following circumstances:—

On January, 30th, 1924, during bleaching operations at the Smedley Bridge Dye Works, near Manchester, two boys named Bamford and Marriott were plaiting down cloth running into a large two ton "kier" which was filled with a mixture of water, caustic soda solution and tetralene. It was observed from the platform above the kier that the boys were not visible, being covered by the cloth, and, as a matter of fact, they had been overcome by the tetralene fumes. Two machine minders and bleacher's assistants named Porter and Ingham were summoned and Porter immediately descended into the kier to look for the boys but was unable to see them and was forced to return to the top, being overcome by the fumes. He recovered, however, and again descended accompanied by Ingham and they eventually succeeded in bringing out Marriott, who was quite unconscious. Porter too was badly gassed, and both men were taken to hospital. The other boy Bamford was eventually pulled out by a rope but was unfortunately already dead.

Porter and Ingham undertook the rescue quite voluntarily and but for their efforts there is little doubt that Marriott too would have lost his life. Both men behaved very gallantly but Porter showed exceptional courage in twice entering the dark enclosed vessel without any artificial light and his action was a very brave one. He is only 18 years of age.

*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. The limits of age for this situation are 19 and 25; candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the examination. A candidate who attained the age of 19 on the first day of the examination would be admitted, but a candidate who attained the age of 25 on that day would not be admitted.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made :—

*Regulation Applicable to the Animals on Landing.*

4. The animals, on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.
