WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means, His Majesty has power and jurisdiction in the territories of West Africa known as the Gambia Protectorate, the Sierra Leone Protectorate, the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, the Nigeria Protectorate and the mandated territories known as the British Sphere of Togoland and the British Cameroons :

And whereas by reason of the contiguity of the said territories and of the colonies and possessions of His Majesty in West Africa known as the Gambia, Sierra Leone, the Gold Coast, Ashanti, and Nigeria, and the frequent inter-communication between them, it seems expedient to His Majesty and conducive to the better administration of justice therein that Part II. of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, should apply to the said colonies, possessions and territories, and that subject to the provisions of this Order the Fugitive Offenders

Act, 1881, should apply as if the said territories respectively were British possessions :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as "The West African (Fugitive Offenders) Order in Council, 1923."

2. Subject to the provisions of this Order the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, shall apply as if each of the territories named in Schedule I. of this Order were a British possession.

3. In the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, as hereby applied to the territories named in Schedule I. of this Order and in this Order with reference to the said territories unless the context otherwise requires the expression "Governor" means the Officer for the time being exercising the functions :—

(a) As regards the Gambia Protectorate, the Sierra Leone Protectorate, and the Nigeria Protectorate, of Governor of the Gambia, Sierra Leone, and Nigeria respectively ;

(b) As regards the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, of Chief Commissioner ;

(c) As regards the British Sphere of Togoland, of Governor of the Gold Coast, and as regards the British Cameroons, of Governor of Nigeria.

4. The jurisdiction under Part I. of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, to hear a case and commit a fugitive to prison to await his return may be exercised in the territories named in Schedule I. of this Order by any person having in the said territories authority to issue a warrant for the apprehension of persons accused of crime and to commit such persons for trial.

5. Part II. of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, shall apply to the group consisting of the territories mentioned in Schedule I. and the colonies and possessions mentioned in Schedule II. of this Order.

6. The Governor (as hereinbefore defined) of each of the colonies, possessions, and territories named in the Schedules to this Order shall cause this Order to be proclaimed therein and this Order shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by such Proclamation.

7. The Order of His late Majesty King Edward the VIIth in Council dated the 11th day of June, 1902, and known as the West African Possessions and Protectorates (Fugitive Offenders) Order in Council, 1902, shall, as from the date of coming into operation of this Order, be revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, or to any proceedings commenced before the said date.

8. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to or amend this Order.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924
(No. 88).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Infected Areas.

1.—(1) The areas described in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 70) hereinafter referred to as the "existing Order."

(2) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 71) shall be read and have effect as if it referred only to the Infected Area No. 3 described in the First Schedule to this Order.

Revocation of Certain Orders.

2. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

Landing of Imported Animals.

3. Article 3 (f) of the existing Order shall cease to apply to the approved Landing Place at the Port of Manchester.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 88) and shall be read with the existing Order.
