SECTION II.—THE PROPOSED WEEKLY RATES set out in Section I above are based on a week of 47 hours and are subject to a proportionate decrease according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 47.

SECTION III.—PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES.

As respects the classes of Male Workers for whom variations of the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates are proposed in Section I of this Part, Overtime Rates calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates specified in Section I of this Part, in the manner set out in Part II of the Notice Q (24), issued by the Trade Board, dated 4th April, 1923, shall apply in substitution for the Proposed Minimum Rates otherwise applicable, as set out in Section I of this Part, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the above-mentioned Notice Q (24) to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

PART II.

APPLICABILITY OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES.

The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts to all MALE WORKERS who are employed as Braziers, Burnishers, Drop-Stampers, Dippers, Dippers who are also Bronzers, or as Annealers or Polishers, in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, as set out in Part III of the above-mentioned Notice Q (24).

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSAL to VARY which may be lodged with them within two months from the 27th day of May, 1924. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
