“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 12th day of March, 1923, to sanction revised rates of submarine allowance for Officers and men employed in the Submarine Service and to provide that submarine allowances to Officers forming part of the crew should be payable continuously at the full rates

to those below the rank of Captain, but, for Captains, should be payable only when they are appointed in command:

“And whereas Captains are sometimes actually in command of new submarines prior to the vessels commissioning although they are not appointed in command until the date of commissioning:

“And whereas we consider that no distinction should be made in the regulations governing the issue of the appropriate allowance to Captains and Officers of other ranks actually serving as part crew of new submarines as from the date of commencement of trials prior to commissioning:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to direct that, as from the 24th August, 1923, a Captain actually in command of a new submarine prior to commissioning although not so appointed, may receive continuous payment of submarine allowance at the full rate as from the date of commencement of trials.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 31st May, 1923, it is provided that Seamen Gunners, or Royal Marines, employed as Turret Trainers or Turret Director Trainers in Your Majesty's Fleet should receive an allowance of 6d. a day for so long as they perform the duties :

"And whereas we consider that this allowance should also be payable for the performance of the combined duty of Trainer and Director Trainer in Your Majesty's Ships of the 'Nelson' and 'Hawkins' classes :

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment of an allowance of 6d. a day to the Seaman or Royal Marine performing the combined duty of trainer and director trainer for each twin 6" turret in ships of the 'Nelson' class or the combined duty of Gun Trainer and Gun Director Trainer for each 7.5" gun in ships of the 'Hawkins' class.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS on the 20th day of January, 1914, an International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea, and for purposes incidental thereto, was duly entered into by His Majesty and the other Signatory Powers more especially referred to and set out in the said Convention :

And whereas a Statute 4 & 5 Geo. V. c. 50, intituled "An Act to make such amendments of the law relating to Merchant Shipping as are necessary or expedient to give effect to an International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea" (being the Convention above referred to) was passed on the 10th day of August, 1914, the short title of which is "The Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914" :

And whereas by Section 29, Sub-section 5, of the said Act it was provided as follows :—

"This Act shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1915 :

"Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, from time to time postpone the coming into operation of this Act for such period, not exceeding on any occasion of postponement one year, as may be specified in the Order" :

And whereas by divers Orders in Council the coming into operation of the said Act has been from time to time postponed, and now stands

postponed, by virtue of an Order in Council of the 28th day of November, 1923, until the 1st day of July, 1924:

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient that the provisions of the said Act should be further postponed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the above-recited provision and of all other powers Him thereunto enabling, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, shall be postponed from coming into operation until the 1st day of January, 1925.

WHEREAS by section sixty-nine of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty is, amongst other things, empowered by Order in Council to make such regulations as seem necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliament and Government of Northern Ireland and also for any other matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the said Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any provision of the said Act and in particular His Majesty is empowered, amongst other things, by any such Order in Council to make such adaptation of any enactments as appear to Him necessary or proper with respect to the execution of services with respect to which the Parliament of Northern Ireland has not power to make laws:

And whereas by section ten of the said Act it is, amongst other things, provided that any powers exercisable by any department of the Government of the United Kingdom at the appointed day with respect to the contagious diseases of animals and the power of making laws with respect to such diseases shall as from the appointed day become powers of the Council of Ireland:

And whereas by virtue of the Provisional Government (Council of Ireland) Order, 1922, and in the events which have happened the powers in Northern Ireland of the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland under the Diseases of Animals Acts and otherwise with respect to the contagious diseases of animals are exercisable by the Secretary of State until the appointed day:

And whereas by section one of the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, it is provided that subject to the provisions of the First Schedule to that Act, the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, shall cease to apply to any part of Ireland other than Northern Ireland, and shall, in the events which have happened, have effect subject to the modifications set out in the said Schedule; and by section six of the same Act it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in

Council make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to any of His Majesty's Dominions other than the Irish Free State as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of the establishment of the Irish Free State, and by the said First Schedule to the same Act it is provided that the appointed day for the transfer in relation to Northern Ireland of the powers which by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, are made powers of the Council of Ireland, shall be such day as may hereafter be fixed by Order in Council:

And whereas the appointed day has not yet been fixed for the said transfer:

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) That this Order may be cited as the Diseases of Animals Acts (Northern Ireland) Order, 1924

(2) In this Order unless the context otherwise requires the expression " Diseases of Animals Acts " means the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and the Diseases of Animals (Ireland) Act, 1914, and any other enactment whereby the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, has been extended, amended or adapted in its application to Northern Ireland.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2.—(1) The Diseases of Animals Acts shall have effect in their application to Northern Ireland subject to the modifications and adaptations set out in this Order save where inconsistent with the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, or the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, or the provisions of any subsequent Order in Council under any of those Acts, and subject, as respects matters within the powers of the Parliament of Northern Ireland, to repeal or alteration by Acts of that Parliament.

(2) Subject to the express adaptations and modifications made by this Order, the General Adaptation of Enactments (Northern Ireland) Order, 1921, and any other Order made under the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, or the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, containing adaptations of general application, shall, if and so far as they are applicable to the Diseases of Animals Acts apply thereto in like manner as they apply to other enactments after the day of transfer.

(3) The adaptations and modifications made by this Order shall apply to any order, scheme, rule, regulation or instrument made or issued under any of the Diseases of Animals Acts and in force as respects Northern Ireland immediately before the date of this Order, in like manner as they apply to the enactment under which it was made or issued, and any such order, scheme, rule, regulation or instrument shall continue in force as respects Northern Ireland in like manner and subject to the like powers of revocation and alteration as if it had been made or issued under the said enactment as so adapted and modified.

3.—(1) For the purposes of the administration of the Diseases of Animals Acts in Northern Ireland there shall be established a General Cattle Diseases Fund for Northern Ireland to be called the General Cattle Diseases (Northern Ireland) Fund, and a separate account in that Fund to be called the Cattle Pleuro-Pneumonia (Northern Ireland) Account.

(2) The General Cattle Diseases (Northern Ireland) Fund and the Cattle Pleuro-Pneumonia (Northern Ireland) Account shall be treated respectively as taking the place as regards Northern Ireland of the General Cattle Diseases Fund and the Cattle Pleuro-Pneumonia Account for Ireland as from the 21st day of November, 1921, and accordingly, such sum as may be determined to represent the share of Northern Ireland in the amount standing to the credit of the general account of the General Cattle Diseases Fund on that day shall be credited to the general account of the General Cattle Diseases (Northern Ireland) Fund and such sum as may be determined to represent the share of Northern Ireland in the amount standing to the credit of the Cattle Pleuro-Pneumonia Account for Ireland on that day shall be credited to the Cattle Pleuro-Pneumonia (Northern Ireland) Account; and such adjustments shall be made of the assets and liabilities of each of the said accounts as the Joint Exchequer Board may deem to be necessary by reason of assets of the said accounts or either of them having been applied to purposes other than purposes of the said accounts or either of them and by reason of liabilities of the said accounts or either of them having since that date been discharged from other sources.

4. In the Diseases of Animals Acts references to the General Cattle Diseases Fund shall be construed as references to the General Cattle Diseases (Northern Ireland) Fund, references to the Cattle Pleuro-Pneumonia Account of the first mentioned Fund or to the Cattle Pleuro-Pneumonia Account for Ireland shall be construed as references to the Cattle Pleuro-Pneumonia (Northern Ireland) Account, references to the Lord Lieutenant and Privy Council, to the Lord Lieutenant, to the Chief Secretary or to the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland shall be construed as references to the Secretary of State, and (without prejudice to the generality of the other provisions of this Order) references to the Local Government Board for Ireland shall be construed as references to the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland.

5.—(1) In subsection (1) of section seventy-three of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, £8,000 shall be substituted for £20,000.

(2) In calculating the maximum sum that may be levied in Northern Ireland by rates under section seventy-one of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, two-thirds of the money which before the commencement of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, was carried to the Cattle Plague Account and any sums levied under that Act or under the said Section elsewhere than in Northern Ireland shall be excluded.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 10th day of April, 1924, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Mary, Kelbrooke, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford:

"Whereas by the authority of an Instrument bearing date the 30th day of August, 1844, and being under the hand and seal of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas, then Bishop of Ripon, a Particular District was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Mary, Kelbrooke, situate in the Parish of Thornton in Craven, in the said County of York and at that time in the Diocese of Ripon, but now in the said Diocese of Bradford, and such Particular District was known as 'The Particular District of Saint Mary, Kelbrooke':

"And whereas the said Particular District of Saint Mary, Kelbrooke, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish, of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Kelbrooke, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Bradford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Kelbrooke, shall be altered so that all that portion of the Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Earby, in the said County of York and in the said Diocese of Bradford, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written:

and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such Consolidated Chapelry and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Kelbrooke.

" And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

" The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Mary, Kelbrooke, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford, being:—

" All that portion of the Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Earby, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the south east and upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Kelbrooke, upon the west by the Parish of Barnoldswick, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Barnoldswick from the said Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Earby, crosses the middle of Salterforth Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Salterforth Road for a distance of $13\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the north eastern boundary of the close numbered 503 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Thornton in Craven published in the year 1909 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this Scheme or Representation, and extending thence first south eastward to such fence and then first south eastward and then north eastward along such fence and along the fences forming the northern boundaries of the closes numbered 504 and 505 upon the said maps for a distance in all of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the northern boundary of the said close numbered 505 meets the southern side of the roadway leading from the house and premises known as White House to Colne Road, and extending thence first northward to and then eastward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Colne Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Colne Road for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence forming the northern boundary of the close numbered 510 upon the said maps, and extending thence first eastward to and then first eastward and then in various directions along such fence for a distance in all of 13 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the western side of the stream called New Cut, and extending thence first eastward to and then north eastward along the middle of such stream for a distance of $6\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries the road leading from Rostle Top Road to Long Royd

Road across the said stream, and extending thence first south eastward, then north eastward and then northward along the middle of the last described road for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence forming the northern boundary of the close numbered 513 upon the said maps, and extending thence first eastward to such fence and then first eastward and then in various directions along such fence and along the fence forming the north eastern boundary of the close numbered 429 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 16 chains or thereabouts to the first point where the last mentioned fence meets the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Earby, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Kelbrooke."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have with the exception hereinafter mentioned respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas one of the Patrons of the Vicarage of the New Parish of Saint Mary, Kelbrooke, has not signified his assent to the said Scheme or Representation:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since drafts of the said Scheme or Representation were transmitted to the said Patrons and Incumbents:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bradford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 20th day of March, 1924, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd

and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Catcott, in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Catcott is vested for an estate in fee simple in the Reverend Frederick William Bussell, of Number 18, Springfield Road, Wimbledon, London, S.W., Clerk in Holy Orders, Vicar of Northolt, in the County of Middlesex, and a Doctor in Divinity, subject to a mortgage upon the said Advowson and other hereditaments in favour of Percy Willis Russell and William Rowland Fisher, both of Number 3, Serjeants' Inn, Fleet Street, London, E.C., Solicitors, but otherwise free from incumbrances:

"And whereas the said Frederick William Bussell is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Catcott, now vested as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Bath and Wells for the time being, and the said Percy Willis Russell and William Rowland Fisher have agreed to concur in these presents for the purpose of enabling the said Advowson to be transferred as aforesaid freed and released from their said mortgage:

"And whereas the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, now Bishop of Bath and Wells, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Catcott which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same Benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Catcott:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Frederick William Bussell, Percy Willis Russell and William Rowland Fisher (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recom-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Helperthorpe and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Weaverthorpe both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Helperthorpe and Weaverthorpe duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of York and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Archbishop of York signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Helperthorpe and Weaverthorpe are at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Helperthorpe and the said Benefice of Weaverthorpe shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Weaverthorpe with Helperthorpe,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop

of Southwell, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, with a portion of the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, and further to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Saint Catharine, Nottingham, with the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Southwell, and therein recommended the severance from the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, of the western portion of such Benefice and the union of the portion so severed with the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, and therein further recommended the union of the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, with the said Benefice of Saint Catharine, Nottingham, and the terms for effecting the said two unions, and the said Bishop of Southwell signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for effecting the two unions of Benefices so recommended as aforesaid, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Saint Mary, Nottingham, and Saint Catharine, Nottingham, are now full, the Reverend Canon Thomas Field being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, and the Reverend John Michael Fyvie Lester being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Catharine, Nottingham, and the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, is now vacant:

"And whereas the right of presentation or nomination to each of the said Benefices of Saint Mary, Nottingham, Saint Paul, Nottingham, and Saint Catharine, Nottingham, at present belongs to the See of Southwell:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That so much of the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, as is bounded upon the north by the Benefice of Saint Mark, Nottingham, upon part of the west by the Benefice of Saint Thomas, Nottingham, upon the remaining part of the west and upon the south by the Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, and upon the east by the middle of Heathcote Street (which severed portion contains the Church of Saint Paul, Nottingham), shall be severed from the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, and for the purpose of the union of the portion so severed with the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, such severed portion shall be deemed a separate Benefice and Parish.

"2. That the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, and such severed portion of the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, shall be permanently united together and form one United Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham,' hereinafter called the United Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into

one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided.

" 3. That the said Benefice of Saint Catharine, Nottingham, and the portion of the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, remaining after the severance referred to in Clause I of this Scheme shall be permanently united together and form one United Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Saint Catharine, Nottingham,' hereinafter called the United Benefice of Saint Catharine, Nottingham, and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided.

" 4.—(a) That the Church of the Parish of Saint Mary, Nottingham, shall be the Parish Church of the United Benefice and Parish of Saint Mary, Nottingham, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Saint Mary, Nottingham, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish of Saint Mary, Nottingham.

" (b) That the Church of the Parish of Saint Catharine, Nottingham, shall be the Parish Church of the United Benefice and Parish of Saint Catharine, Nottingham, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Saint Catharine, Nottingham, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish of Saint Catharine, Nottingham.

" 5. That with the consents of the said Thomas Field, and of the said John Michael Fyvie Lester (testified by their signing this Scheme), the two unions shall take effect upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, and the said Thomas Field, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, and the said John Michael Fyvie Lester, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Catharine, Nottingham, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Saint Catharine, Nottingham.

" 6. That upon the unions taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Paul, Nottingham, shall be transferred to the Church of the United Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Paul, Nottingham, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 7. That upon the unions taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Saint Catharine, Nottingham, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Saint Catharine, Nottingham.

" 8. That upon the unions taking effect a part amounting to £172 per annum of the

annual payment now made by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, shall be held and accumulated by us towards the endowment of the District to be assigned to the proposed new Church of Saint Cyprian, hereinafter mentioned, and all the remaining endowments of the said Benefice of Saint Paul, Nottingham, shall belong to the United Benefice of Saint Catharine, Nottingham.

" 9.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the unions have taken effect, the Church of Saint Paul, Nottingham, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the provisions of the 17th section of the Union of Benefices Act, 1860, as incorporated with modifications in the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919.

" (b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Southwell under the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, removal of human remains and monuments and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be held and accumulated by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as a fund for and towards the erection of a Church for the proposed new District of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton, to be formed partly out of the New Parish of Saint Matthias, Sneinton, and partly out of the New Parish of Saint Paul, Carlton in the Willows, in the said Diocese of Southwell.

" (c) That the Font, Communion Table, Sacramental Plate, Bells and other furniture and fittings of the Church of Saint Paul, Nottingham, or such of them as may not be required for the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Saint Mary, Nottingham, or for the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Saint Catharine, Nottingham, shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Southwell for use in the proposed Church for the said District of Saint Cyprian, Sneinton, or be transferred to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Southwell which the Bishop may select.

" Provided always that this Scheme shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, are made requisite to the sale or letting or appropriation under the powers conferred by that Act of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale hereby proposed of the Church of Saint Paul, Nottingham, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Emsworth Saint James and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Warblington both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Edward, late Bishop of Winchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Emsworth Saint James and Warblington duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Winchester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the

union, and the said Bishop of Winchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Emsworth Saint James and Warblington are now full, the Reverend Oswald Andrew Hunt being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Emsworth Saint James, and the Reverend William Burrell Norris being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Warblington:

"And whereas the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Emsworth Saint James has been sold but there is in the hands of the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty a fund available for the provision of a new Parsonage House for the said Benefice of Emsworth Saint James:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Frank Theodore, now Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Emsworth Saint James and the said Benefice of Warblington shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'the United Benefice of Warblington with Emsworth' and that the parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided.

That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith and if the said Benefice of Warblington only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Emsworth Saint James and the then Incumbent of Warblington shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if the said Benefice of Emsworth Saint James only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Warblington and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Warblington if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Emsworth Saint James shall have been instituted to Emsworth Saint James subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council rati-

fying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall have been instituted to Emsworth Saint James before that date and shall not so consent, then the said Union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Emsworth Saint James following such avoidance of the Benefice of Warblington and the then Incumbent of Warblington shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Warblington shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 5. That a Curate be appointed to assist in performing the duties of the United Benefice.

That the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Emsworth Saint James when such house shall have been built or provided shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Warblington and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the fund created by the 13th Section of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919.

" 7. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Warblington having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Emsworth Saint James having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions of certain contiguous Benefices, that is to say (1) the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Woodborough and a portion of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun (2) the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Manningford Bruce and a further portion of the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun (3) the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Upavon and a portion of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Charlton with Rushall (4) the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun and the remaining portion of the said Benefice

of Charlton with Rushall and (5) the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Manningford Abbots and the said Benefice of Manningford Bruce all of which Benefices are situated in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

"Whereas certain Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Frederic Edward, late Bishop of Salisbury, and other Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, now Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the several hereinbefore mentioned unions of Benefices duly made their several Reports to the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, and therein recommended the several unions of Benefices and the terms for effecting such unions and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Reports:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the several unions aforesaid based upon the terms recommended in the said Reports:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices are now full, the Reverend William Albert Butler being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Woodborough; the Reverend Charles Edward Bolton Hewitt being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun; the Reverend Reginald Edward Coles being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Manningford Bruce; the Reverend George Ernest Morris Tonge being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Upavon; the Reverend Henry Basil McNeil-Smith being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Charlton with Rushall, and the Reverend Sydney Thomas being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Manningford Abbots:

"And whereas (a) the Patronage of the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun belongs to the Master or Keeper, Chaplain, Brethren and Sisters of the Hospital of Saint Nicholas in or near the City of Salisbury, hereinafter called St. Nicholas Hospital, Salisbury, and (b) the Patronage of the said United Benefice of Charlton with Rushall belongs as to one alternate turn or right of presentation to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Oxford of the Foundation of King Henry the Eighth, hereinafter called Christ Church, Oxford, and as to the other alternate turn or right of presentation to the Warden and Scholars of the House or College of Scholars of Merton, in the University of Oxford, hereinafter called Merton College, Oxford, and (c) the Patronage of the said Benefice of Upavon belongs to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors and is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of England for the time being, hereinafter called the Lord Chancellor:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty all that is in this Scheme contained under the several parts or headings hereinafter mentioned, as follows:—

"Part I.

"As to the severance of the Chapelry of Manningford Bohun from the Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun and the union of the severed portion partly to the Benefice of Woodborough and partly to the Benefice of Manningford Bruce we recommend and propose:—

"1. That so much of the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun as consists of the Chapelry of Manningford Bohun shall be severed from the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun, and that the Chapelry of Manningford Bohun so severed shall be divided into two parts hereinafter called the northern part and the southern part respectively, the northern part including the house or houses named 'Manningford Bohun Dairy' and separated from the southern part by a line running east and west as shown on the accompanying map or plan, and that for the purpose of the union of such parts with the said Benefices of Woodborough and Manningford Bruce respectively each of the said parts shall be deemed a separate Benefice and Parish.

That the northern part of the said Chapelry of Manningford Bohun so severed as aforesaid from the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun and the said Benefice of Woodborough shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided under the style of 'The United Benefice of Woodborough with Manningford Bohun.'

"3. That the southern part of the said Chapelry of Manningford Bohun so severed as aforesaid from the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun and the said Benefice of Manningford Bruce shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided under the style of 'The Benefice of Manningford Bruce' which said United Benefice is hereinafter called 'the United Benefice of Manningford Bruce.'

"4. That the Church of the Parish of Woodborough shall be the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Woodborough with Manningford Bohun and the Church of the Parish of Manningford Bruce shall be the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Manningford Bruce and that the Tables of Fees for the said Parishes of Woodborough and Manningford Bruce shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Tables of Fees for the United Parishes of Woodborough and Manningford Bohun and of Manningford Bruce respectively.

"5. That with consents of the said William Albert Butler and of the said Reginald Edward Coles and of the said Charles Edward Bolton Hewitt the unions of the said severed portions of the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun with the said Benefices of Woodborough and Manningford Bruce respectively shall take effect upon the next avoidance after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme either of the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford

Bohun or of the said Benefice of Charlton with Rushall, whichever shall first happen.

" 6. That upon the taking effect of the union of the said Benefice of Woodborough and the northern portion of the said Chapelry of Manningford Bohun the fund of £1,150 18s. 4d now held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun subject to certain trusts as to the performance of services in the Chapel of Manningford Bohun shall cease to be held in favour of the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun and shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Woodborough with Manningford Bohun subject to the same trusts as to the performance of services in the said Chapel of Manningford Bohun.

" 7. That upon the said unions taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Woodborough shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Woodborough with Manningford Bohun and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Manningford Bruce shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Manningford Bruce.

" 8. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Woodborough with Manningford Bohun from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination the first, third and fourth turns shall belong to and be exercised by the Patrons of the said Benefice of Woodborough and the second turn shall belong to and be exercised by the Patrons of the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun and (b) the whole right of Patronage of and presentation to the United Benefice of Manningford Bruce shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefice of Manningford Bruce.

" Part II.

" As to the union of the Benefice of Upavon with the Rushall portion of the United Benefice of Charlton with Rushall and the union of the Charlton portion with the Benefice of Wilsford, we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

" 1. That a portion of the said United Benefice of Charlton with Rushall that is to say the Benefice of Rushall shall be severed from the said United Benefice of Charlton with Rushall, and the said Benefice of Rushall so severed and the said Benefice of Upavon shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Upavon with Rushall' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That the said United Benefice of Charlton with Rushall after the severance of such portion as aforesaid and the said Benefice of Wilsford after the severance of the said Chapelry of Manningford Bohun as provided in Part I of this Scheme shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Wilsford with Charlton' but the

Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 3. That with the consents of the said George Ernest Morris Tonge and of the said Charles Edward Bolton Hewitt (a) the severance of the said Benefice of Rushall from the said United Benefice of Charlton with Rushall and the union of the severed portion with the said Benefice of Upavon and (b) the union of the remaining portion, namely the said Benefice of Charlton with the said Benefice of Wilsford shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said United Benefice of Charlton with Rushall after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

" 4. That upon the said unions taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Upavon shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Upavon with Rushall and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Charlton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wilsford with Charlton.

" 5. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the whole of the endowments at present belonging to the said Benefice of Wilsford with Manningford Bohun (apart from the fund referred to in Clause 6 of Part I of this Scheme) shall be transferred and annexed subject as hereinafter mentioned to the United Benefice of Wilsford with Charlton and (b) the properties, revenues and income at present constituting the endowments of the said United Benefice of Charlton with Rushall shall be divided as follows, that is to say, there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Upavon with Rushall all those tithe rent charges, glebe or other endowments, if any, which belonged to the said Benefice of Rushall prior to the union of that Benefice with the said Benefice of Charlton including any properties, funds, or investments representing or arising from the sale, exchange or other conversion of any of the said endowments, and there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Wilsford with Charlton all the remaining endowments of the said United Benefice of Charlton with Rushall.

" 6. That as from the date of the said unions taking effect all the Tithe Rent Charges, Glebe lands, and all (if any) other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice of Wilsford with Charlton or which may hereafter belong thereto shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice of Woodborough with Manningford Bohun (referred to in Part I of this Scheme) with the annual sum or yearly rent charge hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly rent charge equivalent in amount to the gross yearly value of a sum of £45 15s. 9d. Tithe Rent Charge as determined in accordance with the Statutory provisions for the time being and from time to time in force for ascertaining the sum payable in respect of Tithe Rent Charge and to be paid half yearly as hereinafter provided and so that the amount of the half yearly instalment of the said yearly rent charge to be paid on each half yearly day here-

under shall be the same or the like amount as would in accordance with the aforesaid Statutory provisions have become payable in respect of such sum of £45 15s. 9d. Tithe Rent Charge on the last preceding half yearly day for payment of Tithe Rent Charge. The said yearly rent charge to be as from the date aforesaid due and payable to the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Woodborough with Manningford Bohun and to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Woodborough with Manningford Bohun or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by half yearly instalments on the first day of May, and the first day of November, in every year. " As to the union of the Benefice of Manningford Bruce and the Benefice of Manningford Abbots, we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Manningford Bruce and the said Benefice of Manningford Abbots shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ' The United Benefice of Manningford Bruce with Manningford Abbots ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

In cases where a female worker, to whom the above Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applies, is employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 7½d. per hour to an ORDINARY WORKER, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR THE CLASSES OF FEMALE
PIECE-WORKERS SPECIFIED IN PART III OF THIS SCHEDULE.

The Trade Board propose to vary the Overtime Rates for female workers employed on piece-work at present fixed and set out in the Trade Board's Notice J. (26), dated 6th February, 1923, in their application to all female piece-workers of the classes specified in Part III of this Schedule so that such workers shall, in respect of each hour worked in excess of the normal number of hours of work in the trade, as declared by the Trade Board and set out in their Notice J. (26), receive, in addition to piece-rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 7½d. per hour, to an *ordinary* worker, an amount equal to one-half of, or the full amount of, the General Minimum Time-Rate which would have been applicable to the worker if she had been employed on time-work, according as the Overtime Rates which would have been payable, if the worker had been employed on time-work, were Time-and-a-Half or Double-Time.

The above Proposed Minimum Rates shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all female-piece-workers (other than weavers) employed outside the areas of Aberdeen, Barrow-in-Furness, Dundee and Tayport (as defined in Section II of this Part) and to all female piece-workers (other than workers employed on Hessian Weaving as defined in Section III of Part II of the Trade Board's Notice J. (29)) employed in the areas of Aberdeen, Barrow-in-Furness, Dundee and Tayport in respect of all time during which they are employed on piece-work, in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, and set out in Part VI of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J. (26), dated 6th February, 1923.

SECTION II.

The areas referred to in Section I of this Part are as follows :—

- (a) the MUNICIPAL BURGH OF ABERDEEN;
- (b) the COUNTY BOROUGH OF BARROW-IN-FURNESS;
- (c) the AREA OF DUNDEE, viz., the Municipal Burgh of Dundee and the Parish of Liff and Benvie, the Parish of Mains and Strathmartine, the Parish of Dundee and that Part of the Parish of Monifieth which lies south and west of Dighty Water; and
- (d) the AREA OF TAYPORT, viz., the Burgh of Tayport and the Parish of Ferry-Port-on-Craig.

NOTE.—The Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate and Overtime Rates for Female Weavers employed outside the areas of Aberdeen, Barrow-in-Furness, Dundee and Tayport, which are set out in the Trade Board's Notices J. NOTICE.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH (FOREIGN MEAT) REGULATIONS, 1908. THE PUBLIC HEALTH (FOREIGN MEAT) AMENDING REGULATIONS, 1909.

1. The Minister of Health, in pursuance of the above Regulations, hereby gives notice that, for the purposes of those Regulations the Official Certificate of which the details are set forth in the representation or design in the Schedule appended to and forming part of this Notice, is declared to be admissible, from the date of the publication of this Notice, in the manner, to the extent, and subject to the rules and conditions prescribed in this Notice, as evidence that the pig from which has been derived the meat in relation to which such Certificate is used, has been certified by a competent authority in the place of origin to be free from disease at the time of slaughter, and that the meat has been certified by the like authority to have been dressed or prepared, and packed, with the needful observance of all requirements for the prevention of danger arising to public health from the meat as an article of food;

And further, with respect to the manner, to the extent, and to the rules and conditions in, to, and subject to which every Official Certificate is admissible as evidence for any such purpose as is hereinbefore described, the Minister of Health hereby prescribes as follows, that is to say:—

(i) An Official Certificate used in relation to foreign meat, or in relation to a box, case, receptacle or package containing foreign meat, shall be admissible as aforesaid only where the meat is derived from a pig.

(ii) An Official Certificate in the form of a label shall be admissible as aforesaid only where the label is securely affixed or attached to any foreign meat, or to any box, case, receptacle or package containing foreign meat; and where the label so fixed or attached has not in any other circumstances, or on any other occasion, been used as an Official Certificate.

(iii) In this Notice, any word or expression to which a special meaning is assigned by the Public Health (Foreign Meat) Amending Regulations, 1909, has the same meaning as in those Regulations.

2. The Minister of Health in pursuance of the above Regulations also gives notice that the Official Certificates of the Imperial Russian Government specified in the Notices inserted in the London Gazette of 24th February, 1914 and 12th May, 1914, are no longer admissible for the purposes of those Regulations.
