PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the seventh section of the South Staffordshire Stipendiary Justice Act, 1899, His Majesty is empowered, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, upon the petition of the local authority of any borough, district or parish comprised within the limits of the said Act, to order that such borough, district or parish shall cease to be within the limits of the said Act:

And whereas the Urban District Council of Tipton in the County of Stafford has, under the provisions of the above mentioned section, presented a petition praying for an Order of His Majesty in Council that the Urban District of Tipton shall cease to be within the limits of the South Staffordshire Stipendiary Justice Act, 1899:

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council of the 28th day of November, 1923, the said petition, together with any other petitions on the subject, was referred to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a Report of the said Committee dated the 16th day of April, 1924, in the words following, viz. :—

“ The Lords of the Committee in obedience to Your Majesty's said Order of Reference

have taken the petition of the Urban District Council of Tipton and counter petitions and representations into consideration and have agreed humbly to report as their opinion to Your Majesty that it may be advisable for Your Majesty to comply with the prayer of the petition of the Tipton Urban District Council, and order that from the 29th day of September, 1924, the Tipton Urban District shall cease to be within the limits of the South Staffordshire Stipendiary Justice Act, 1899 ”:

His Majesty, having taken the said report into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Urban District of Tipton in the County of Stafford, shall from the 29th day of September, 1924, cease to be within the limits of the South Staffordshire Stipendiary Justice Act, 1899.
