

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 10TH JUNE, 1924.)

FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE (IN-
FECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924
(No. 98).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Infected Areas.

1.—(1) The areas described in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 70) hereinafter referred to as the "existing Order."

(2) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 71) shall be read and have effect as if it referred only to the Infected Area No. 3 described in the First Schedule to this Order.

Revocation of Certain Orders.

2. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 98) and shall be read with the existing Order.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Infected Areas.

1. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Perth.

The parishes of Dron and Arngask and such parts of the parishes of Forteviot, Forgan-denny, Dunbarney, and Abernethy as lie to the south of the Railways from Dunblane to Perth and from Perth to Newburgh.

In the county of Kinross.

The parish of Orwell, and

In the county of Fife.

The parishes of Strathmiglo and Auchtermuchty.

2. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Linlithgow.

The parishes of Whitburn, Livingston, Bathgate and Torphichen.

In the county of Midlothian.

Such portion of the parish of West Calder as lies to the north-west of the Railway from Kirknewton to Carnwath.

In the county of Lanark.

Such parts of the parishes of Shotts and Cambusnethan as lie to the east of the road from the Hillend Reservoir via Dewshills, Blairmains, Hassockrig and Stane to Forth.

3. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Ayr.

The burghs of Irvine and Kilmarnock:

The parishes of Largs, Kilbirnie, Dalry, West Kilbride, Ardrossan, Stevenston, Irvine, Kilwinning, Beith, Dunlop, Stewarton, Dreghorn, Kilmaurs, Fenwick, and Kilmarnock.

The county of Renfrew, including all burghs situated therein (*except the burghs of Renfrew, Greenock and Port Glasgow, and the parishes of Inverkip, Greenock, Port Glasgow, Erskine, Inchinnan and Renfrew*).

In the county of Lanark.

The parishes of Cathcart and Carmunnock, and such part of the parish of East Kilbride as lies to the north-west of the road from Eaglesham via Millhouse, Dikeneuk, Whitehills, East Kilbride and Nerston to Glasgow (*but excluding any portions of those parishes within the city of Glasgow*).

4. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Northumberland.

The county boroughs of Newcastle-upon-Tyne and Tynemouth.

The borough of Wallsend;

The petty sessional divisions of East Castle Ward and West Castle Ward; and

The parishes of Shilvington, Twizell, Ogle, and Newnham.

In the county of Durham.

The county boroughs of Gateshead and South Shields;

The borough of Jarrow.

The petty sessional divisions of Gateshead and South Shields, and

The parish of Lamesley.

5. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Lancaster.

The county boroughs of St. Helens and Warrington.

The borough of Leigh.

The petty sessional division of Warrington, and

The parishes of Bold, Ashton-in-Makerfield, Abram, Lowton, Kenyon, and Culcheth.

6. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Chester.

The county borough of Chester.

The petty sessional divisions of Chester Castle (*except the parishes of Inch, Elton,*
