FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE:
INFECTED PLACE.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922; and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The premises mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

Description and Limits of Infected Place.

The farm buildings and premises and the pastures adjoining thereto known as Vicarage Grounds, in the occupation of the Rev. George Moore, in the parish of Cowley, in the administrative county of Oxford.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED
AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 107).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Extension of Infected Area.

1 The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 106) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule hereto were included in and formed part of the Infected Area, No. 8, described in the First Schedule to that Order.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 107).

SCHEDULE.

Area added to Infected Area No. 8.

An Area comprising:—

In the parts of Kesteven Division of Lincolnshire.

The petty sessional division of Lincoln (Kesteven) (*except such parts of the parishes of Heighington, Branston, Potter Hanworth, Nocton, Dunston and Metheringham as lie to the east of the Railway from Sleaford to Lincoln*).

The parishes of Brant Broughton, Beckingham, Stragglethorpe, Fulbeck, Leadenham, Welbourn, Wellingore, Temple Bruer with Temple High Grange, and such part of the parish of Blankney as lies to the west of the Railway from Sleaford to Lincoln.

In the parts of Lindsey Division of Lincolnshire.

The City and County Borough of Lincoln.

The petty sessional divisions of Lincoln Castle, Lincoln (Lindsey) (*except the parishes of Fiskerton, Barlings, Coldstead Snarford, Cold Hanworth, Spirdlington, West Firsby, East Firsby, Saxby, Owmbly, Normanby by Spital, Glentworth, Caenby, Glentham, Bishop Norton, and Atterby*), and

The parishes of Lea, Upton, Knaith, Kexby, Willingham, Gate Burton, and Marton.

In the county of Nottingham.

The borough of East Retford.

The parishes of Broadholme, Thorney, Harby, Wigsley, Spalford, South Clifton, North Clifton, Fledborough, Marnham, Ragnall, Darlton, East Markham, Markham Clinton, West Drayton, Bothamsall, Elkesley, Gamston, Askham, East Drayton, Dunham, Laneham, Rampton, Stokeham, Headon, Eaton, Babworth, Barnby Moor (including its detached part), Sutton, Hayton, Clarbrough, North Wheatley, South Wheatley, South Leverton, Grove, Treswell, Cottam, North Leverton with Harblesthorpe, Littleborough, Sturton le Steeple, West Burton, and Bole, and the detached part of the parish of Tuxford.
