The following Statutes made by the University of Oxford and sealed by the University of Oxford Commissioners on the 8th day of July, 1924, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923":—

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONVOCATION ON
TUESDAY, MARCH 18, 1924.

Whereas it is expedient to provide that professors, readers, and other University teachers shall vacate office on attaining a certain age, but so that the provisions of this Statute shall not apply to any person appointed before the first day of January, 1924, unless and until he shall have consented to be subject thereto:

Now THE UNIVERSITY under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and of any other power enabling it, hereby ENACTS, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS:—

Section I. § 1 of Titulus IV shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and the provisions hereinafter contained shall be substituted in lieu thereof:—

“ § 1. Concerning Electoral Boards of Professorships and the Tenure of Professorships, Readerships, and Teacher-ships.

1. Wherever by a Statute made under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, it is provided that the election to a Professorship shall be vested in a Board of Electors, the Board shall, unless the Statute otherwise provide, be composed of not fewer than five nor more than seven persons.

The University may from time to time by Statute regulate or vary the constitution of any such Board: save only that, where by any clause or provision, not made subject to this power, it is provided that one or more of the electors shall always be a person or persons answering to a specified designation or nominated or appointed in a specified manner, the exercise of this power shall be subject to and controlled by such clause or provision.

2. No professor, reader, or other University teacher shall retain office after the 31st July next following his 65th birthday, or if his birthday falls on the 31st July then after his 65th birthday, unless by a vote of not less than two-thirds of the total number of members of the Visitatorial Board taken by ballot not less than six months before the day on which his office would terminate under this clause and confirmed by a Decree of Convocation he shall be permitted to retain office for a further term which shall be specified in the Decree and which shall in no case exceed five years.

3. Every professorship shall, unless it be otherwise provided in any Statute or instrument of foundation relating to it and in force for the time being, be tenable until the 31st

July next following the 65th birthday of its holder, or if his birthday falls on the 31st July then until his 65th birthday, subject, however, to the liability of the holder to vacate it by deprivation for sufficient cause; but this provision shall not affect any power which the University has to vary or limit by Statute the tenure of any professorship, nor the power to permit a professor to retain office for a further term not exceeding five years contained in clause 2 of this Subsection.

4. Every professor, reader, or other University teacher to whose office the Superannuation Scheme of the University applies shall on his appointment sign an agreement as required by Tit. XXIV providing for his being bound by that Scheme and giving effect thereto.

5. Clauses 2, 3, and 4 of this Statute shall not apply to any professorship to which a canonry is annexed, but every such professorship shall, unless it be otherwise provided in any Statute or instrument of foundation relating to it and in force for the time being, be deemed to be tenable for life, subject to the liability of the holder to vacate it by deprivation for sufficient cause; but this provision shall not affect any power which the University has to vary or limit by Statute the tenure of any such professorship.

6. No professorship shall, unless by virtue of express provision in any Statute or instrument of foundation relating to it and in force for the time being, be tenable with another professorship within the University, nor with a University readership.

Temporary Saving Clause.

7. No professor, reader, or other University teacher appointed before the 1st day of January, 1924, shall be subject to the provisions of this Statute unless and until he shall, by writing under his hand delivered to the Vice-Chancellor, have consented to be subject thereto, but every such professor, reader, or teacher shall continue to be subject to the statutory regulations relating to his office which were in force at the date of the approval of this Statute by the King in Council and to such power as the University then had to vary or add to those regulations."

In Tit. IV. Sectio I. § 2 (a), clause 6 shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and the provisions hereinafter contained shall be substituted in lieu thereof:—

" 6. The Hebdomadal Council may, at any time within six months before the day on which a professorship will become vacant, pass a resolution suspending the appointment in the manner prescribed by this Statute, or else may authorize proceedings to be taken for a new appointment as if the office had already become vacant. The Council may proceed in like manner in case any professor has notified in writing to the Vice-Chancellor his intention of resigning his professorship at any date within the six months following. Any professor who has been appointed under this clause before the occurrence of a vacancy shall, unless the Visitorial Board shall determine otherwise, enter upon the duties of his office on the day when the vacancy occurs, and shall be entitled to its emoluments from the same day."

In Sectio II. B. § 4. clause 3, for the words " shall hold his office for life " in line 6, substitute " shall hold his office until the 31st July next following his 65th birthday, or if his birthday falls on the 31st July then until his 65th birthday," and at the end of the clause add:—" and the power of the Visitorial Board to permit a professor to retain office for a further term not exceeding five years shall apply to him."

Whereas it is expedient to provide that the Accounts of the University shall in future be made up to the thirty-first day of July, and presented to the Vice-Chancellor on or before the thirtieth day of November, in each year, THE UNIVERSITY, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of any other power enabling it, hereby ENACTS, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS:—

1. In Statt, Tit. XIX. § 22. cl. 2 (p. 353, ed. 1923) the words " twenty-fourth day of March " shall be struck out and the words " thirtieth day of November " shall be substituted.

2. Ibid., in cl. 2 (a) (p. 354) the word " December " shall be struck out and the word " July " substituted.

3. Ibid., the following new clause shall be added:—

" 9. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Statute, in the year 1925 the period January 1 to July 31 shall be substituted for the year ending 31 July, 1925."

4. Ibid., in the Schedule of Forms (p. 356) the word " December," wherever it occurs,

shall be struck out and the word " July " shall be substituted.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONVOCATION ON
TUESDAY, JUNE 17, 1924.

Whereas it is expedient to amend *Statt. Tit. XIII. Sect. II.* of the Statutes of the University of Oxford, so far as it relates to the elected members of the Hebdomadal Council, by discontinuing their division into three classes, and by providing instead that all members of Convocation shall be eligible for election as members of the said Council, but so that the Council shall not contain at any time more than three elected members who are members of the same Society;

Now THE UNIVERSITY, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Oxford University Act, 1854, and of every other power enabling it, ENACTS, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS.

1. In *Statt. Tit. XIII. Sect. II. cl. 2* (ed. 1923, p. 279) the figure " 14 " shall be struck out, and the figure " 12 " shall be substituted.

2. *Ibid.*, clause 4 (p. 280) shall be struck out, and the following clause shall be substituted:—

" 4. The elected members of the Hebdomadal Council shall be eighteen members of Convocation, either men or women, to be elected by the Congregation of the University, but subject to the condition that there shall not be at any time more than three elected members of the Council who are shown by the Register of Convocation to be members of the same College or Hall, or of the Body of Non-Collegiate Students or of the same recognized Society of Women Students. The Vice-Chancellor shall have power to make Regulations to ensure the observance of this condition.

3. *Ibid.*, clauses 5, 6, and 7 (p. 280) shall

be struck out, and the following clause shall be substituted:—

" 5. In the year 1931 and in every second year thereafter an election shall be held of six persons to be members of the Council."

4. *Ibid.*, in clause 15 (p. 282) the words " possess the qualification for the class in which he was elected " shall be struck out, and the words " be a member of Convocation " shall be substituted.

5. *Ibid.*, clause 18 (p. 283) shall be struck out.

6. *Ibid.*, the whole of the clauses 19 to 24 following the words " Temporary Provisions " shall be struck out, and the following clauses shall be substituted for them:—

" 16. In Trinity Term, 1926, an election shall be held of nine members of the Council, of whom the six members who obtain the largest number of votes shall hold office until the first day of Michaelmas Term, 1931, and the remaining three shall hold office until the first day of Michaelmas Term, 1929.

17. In Trinity Term, 1929, an election shall be held of twelve members of the Council, of whom the six members who obtain the largest number of votes shall hold office until the first day of Michaelmas Term, 1935, and the remaining six shall hold office until the first day of Michaelmas Term, 1933.

18. Every person entitled to vote in the election in Trinity Term, 1926, shall have the power of giving six votes, and every person entitled to vote in the election in Trinity Term, 1929, shall have the power of giving eight votes; but at neither election shall any elector give more than one vote for any one candidate.

19. The tenure of members of the Council elected to fill casual vacancies occurring among the members elected in 1926 or in 1929 shall be subject to the provisions of clause 9 above.

20. Save as aforesaid the members of the Council elected before the day on which this Statute shall receive the approval of His Majesty in Council shall continue to hold office for the periods for which they were respectively elected under the provisions in force at the time of their election."

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matter herein submitted for your consideration:
