

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 15TH JULY, 1924.)

FOOT- AND- MOUTH DISEASE (IN-
FECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924
(No. 121).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Infected Areas.

1. The areas described in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 70) hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order." Provided, however, that no licence shall be granted authorising movement of animals into the Area No. 8 described in the Schedule hereto from a licensed fat stock market, or from a farm, or from other premises in any other infected area to which the Principal Order applies.

Revocation of Certain Orders.

2. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 121), and shall be read with the Principal Order.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Infected Areas.

1. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Chester.

The parishes of Duddon, Clotton Hoofield, Iddenshall, Huxley, Foulk Stapleford, Burton, Bruen Stapleford, such part of the parish of Tiverton as lies to the west of the road from Tarporley via Birch Heath, Hulgrove Farm and Hortons Mill to Beeston Castle, and such parts of the parishes of Newton by Tattenhall and Hatton as lie to the north of the Shropshire Union Canal.

2. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Nottingham.

The city of Nottingham.

The boroughs of Newark, Mansfield and East Retford.

The petty sessional divisions of Nottingham, Southwell, Bingham, Mansfield, Newark, and Retford (*except the parishes of Finningley, Misson, Misterton, West Stockwith, Walkeringham, Gringley-on-the-Hill, Everton, Scaftworth, Scrooby, Mattersey, Wiseton, Beckingham, Saundby, Clayworth, Lound, Torworth, Blyth, and Ranskill*), and

The parishes of Cuckney and Nether Langwith.

In the county of Derby.

The county borough of Derby.

The petty sessional divisions of Alfreton (including its detached part), Belper, Ilkeston, Derby (*except the parish of Brailsford*), and Repton, and

The parishes of Upper Langwith, Shirebrook, Pleasley, Clapwell, Heath, Ault Hucknall, North Wingfield, Tupton, Hasland, Woodthorpe, Wingerworth, Tarsley, Dethick, Lea and Holloway, and Mercaston.

In the county of Leicester.

The borough of Loughborough,

The petty sessional divisions of Belvoir, Loughborough, and Melton Mowbray (*except the parishes of Gaddesby, Barsby, Ashby Folville, Thorpe Satchville, Twyford, Burrough-on-the-Hill, Somerby, Owston and Newbold, Knossington, Cold Overton, Pickwell-with-Leesthorpe, Little Dalby, Great Dalby, Kirby Bellairs, Frisby-on-the-Wreak, Brooksby, Rotherby and Hoby*), and

The parishes of Breedon-on-the-Hill, Staunton Harold, Worthington, Osgerthorpe, Thringstone, Swannington, Whitwick, and Bardon.

In the parts of Kesteven Division of Lincolnshire.

The borough of Grantham.

The petty sessional divisions of Spitalgate (including its detached part, but *excluding the parishes of Colsterworth, Stainby, Gunby, North Witham, and South Witham*), Lincoln (Kesteven) (*except such parts of the parishes of Heighington, Branston, Potter Hanworth, Nocton, Dunston, and Metheringham, as lie to the east of the Railway from Sleaford to Lincoln*), and

The parishes of Heydour, Kelby, Wilsford, Ancaster, Caythorpe, Fulbeck, Leadenham, Welbourn, Wellingore, Temple Bruer with Temple High Grange, and such part of the parish of Blankney as lies to the west of the Railway from Sleaford to Lincoln.

In the parts of Lindsey Division of Lincolnshire.

The city and county borough of Lincoln.

The petty sessional divisions of Lincoln Castle, Lincoln (Lindsey) (*except the parishes of Fiskerton, Barlings, Snarford, Cold Hanworth, Spridlington, West Firsby, East Firsby, Saxby, Owmbly, Normanby-by-Spital, Glentworth, Caenby, Glentham, Bishop Norton, and Atterby*), and

The parishes of Lea, Upton, Knaith, Kexby, Willingham, Gate Burton, and Marton.
