The following Address was presented to The KING on Thursday, the 10th instant, on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the Star and Garter Home for Disabled Sailors and Soldiers at Richmond, Surrey:—

BOROUGH OF RICHMOND (SURREY).

TO THEIR MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTIES  
KING GEORGE V. AND QUEEN MARY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTIES:—

We, the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Richmond (Surrey), desire to express to Your Majesties our cordial thanks for being afforded this opportunity of welcoming Your Majesties to our Town on the auspicious occasion of your opening the Star and Garter Home for Disabled Sailors and Soldiers.

We recall with sincere pleasure, the many years during which Queen Mary resided in Richmond Park, when she became endeared to the Inhabitants of the Borough by her many acts of kindness and goodwill, and by her zealous interest in the benevolent Institutions of the District.

We also remember with lively satisfaction the many occasions upon which Your Majesties have been graciously please to honour our Town by your presence, particularly when

Your Majesty the King opened our Town Hall in 1893, and Your Majesty the Queen opened the " Princess May " Ward of the Richmond Royal Hospital in 1896, and again when Your Majesties jointly inaugurated a new Wing at the same Hospital in 1903.

We also bear in mind, with sincere gratification, the many less formal occasions upon which Your Majesties have been pleased to visit our Town and patronise its Institutions.

We desire most humbly and respectfully to avail ourselves of this opportunity which is so graciously afforded to us of welcoming Your Majesties to our Borough, comprised in which is Your Royal Manor of Richmond, and to declare afresh our unswerving loyalty to Your Royal Selves and Your Throne, expressing as we do, the fervent hope that Your Majesties may in health and happiness long be spared to reign over a loyal, peaceful and prosperous people.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—

I thank you very sincerely for your loyal and dutiful Address and for the cordiality of the reception which you have given to the Queen and myself.

We revisit Richmond with great pleasure. At White Lodge much of the Queen's girlhood was passed and it has many intimate associations for us both. We are touched and gratified to learn that the incidents of the Queen's home life and her efforts for the well-being of

her neighbours are still held in affectionate remembrance. Our interest in the prosperity of Richmond and its people will ever continue.

The special character of to-day's ceremony enhances our pleasure in again coming amongst you. The previous visits, to which you have referred with so much kind feeling, were on the occasions of opening extensions to the building of Richmond Royal Hospital. Our object this afternoon is to open an Institution, no less beneficent in character but of a wider and indeed of a truly Imperial scope. Thanks to the generous initiative of the Auctioneers' and Estate Agents' Institute of the United Kingdom, the site and buildings of the historic Star and Garter Hotel were bought and presented to the Queen as a Home for Disabled Sailors and Soldiers. Since then we have closely followed the progress of this admirable scheme: and it gives us great satisfaction to inaugurate the completed work and to witness the successful culmination of the effort and devotion which have been lavished upon it.

The building and equipment of the Home have been provided by the contributions of the women of the Empire, collected through the agency of the British Women's Hospital Committee. It is singularly happy that the object of a Women's War Memorial should be to alleviate the sufferings and to brighten the lives of those men who have sacrificed so much

in the cause of their country. As we honour the memory of those who laid down their lives in our defence, so do we testify our gratitude to the many who, in similar circumstances, have incurred bodily disabilities by assuring them of such relief and comfort as this Home will provide.

We deeply sympathise with these noble and humane endeavours and pray that God's Blessing may rest upon the Star and Garter Home.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

### *Markets to which this Order Applies.*

1. The markets to which this Order applies are the Pig Market at Montague Street, in the city of Birmingham, which market is hereby authorised by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries to be used for the purposes of this Order, and any other market which may subsequently be so authorised by the Minister; provided that whilst being so used no animals shall be kept in or moved into such market other than swine moved with a licence under this Order.

### *Movement of Swine to Markets.*

2. Swine intended for immediate slaughter may, notwithstanding the provisions of any Order made by the Minister restricting the movement of animals into an Infected Area, be moved to a market to which this Order applies with a licence granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market is situate; provided that no such licence shall be granted unless the owner of the swine shall sign and give to the Local Authority an undertaking in the form set out in the First Schedule to this Order.

### *Removal of Swine from certain Markets.*

3. Swine moved to a market to which this Order applies with a licence granted under this Order shall not be moved therefrom except with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market is situate, or to any place other than a slaughterhouse or bacon factory approved by the Inspector, and situate in the area described in the Second Schedule hereto; provided that no such licence shall be granted unless the owner of the swine shall sign and give to the

Local Authority an undertaking in the form set out in the First Schedule to this Order; and also provided that no such licence shall be deemed to authorise the movement of any animals out of an Infected Area.

### *Detention and Slaughter.*

4. Swine moved to a slaughterhouse or bacon factory with a licence under this Order shall be there detained until they are slaughtered, and shall be slaughtered within 36 hours after their arrival.

### *Undertakings to be Transmitted to Ministry.*

5. The undertakings, when received by the Local Authority, shall be forthwith transmitted to the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

### *Conditions of Movement.*

6. Swine moved under this Order shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall so far as practicable be kept separate from all animals which are not being moved, or have not been moved, with a licence under this Order.

### *Licences.*

7. Movement licences granted under this Order shall, unless a shorter period is therein specified by the Inspector granting the same, be available for six days including the day of the date thereof and no longer.

### *Saving for Orders and Regulations.*

8. No licence under this Order shall authorise the movement of animals in contravention of any Regulations made by a Local Authority other than the Local Authority by whom the licence was issued.

### *Short Title.*

9. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 124), and shall be read with the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 70).

*In the administrative county of Devon.*

The boroughs of Bideford and Great Torrington;

The petty sessional divisions of Bideford (excluding its detached part), Great Torrington, Holsworthy, Hatherleigh (except the parishes of Okehampton Hamlets, and Sourton) and Lifton (except the parishes of Bridestowe, Lewtrenchard, Coryton and that part of the parish of Thrushelton which lies to the east of the road from Lewtrenchard to Bratton Clovelly), and

The parishes of Lamerton, Sydenham Damerel, and Milton Abbot.

*Hereford.*—See under Brecknock.

**Merioneth.**—1. An Area comprising:—

*In the administrative county of Merioneth.*

Such portions of the parishes of Llangynog, Llanrhaiadr-ym-Mochnant, and Pennant as lie to the north, north-east and north-west of the road running from Bala via Llangynog,

Penybont Fawr, to the village of Llanrhaiadr-ym-Mochnant; and

*In the administrative county of Denbigh.*

Such portions of the parishes of Llanrhaiadr-ym-Mochnant, Llanarmon Mynydd Mawr, Llansilin, and Llanarmon Dyffryn Ceiriog as lie to the north-west of the road running from Penybont Fawr through the village of Llanrhaiadr-ym-Mochnant via Llidiart and Cae Hir to the village of Llanarmon Dyffryn Ceiriog, but excluding that portion of the parish of Llanarmon Dyffryn Ceiriog which lies to the north and north-east of the River Ceiriog.

2. An Area comprising so much of the administrative counties of Merioneth and Montgomery as lie within the following boundaries, namely:—

Commencing at the Ford at Dinas Mawddwy, and proceeding in a generally westerly direction along the road leading from the Ford to the Cross Foxes Inn; thence in a south-westerly direction along the road to Towyn and the sea; thence following the coast in a southerly and easterly direction to the River Dovey; thence along the course of that river to the point of commencement.

*Monmouth.*—See under Brecknock.

*Montgomery.*—See under Merioneth.

**Yorkshire, West Riding.**—An Area comprising:—

The administrative county of the West Riding of Yorkshire (except the petty sessional division of Saddleworth and such portions of the petty sessional divisions of West Morley, Upper Agbrigg, Staincross, and Upper Strafforth and Tickhill as lie to the west of the railway from East Retford via Sheffield, Penistone, Huddersfield, Brighouse, and Sowerby Bridge, to Todmorden).

And also comprising the county boroughs of Barnsley, Bradford, Dewsbury, Halifax, Leeds, Rotherham and Wakefield, and such portions of the county boroughs of Huddersfield and Sheffield as lie to the east of the above-mentioned railway.

**Inverness.**—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (except the islands of St. Kilda, Duns, Soay and Boreray), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness, comprising the islands known as Skye or Inner Hebrides.

**Ross and Cromarty.**—An Area comprising the Island of Lewis, including the smaller island adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

NOTE.—The term "administrative county" used in the description of Areas is the district for which a county council is elected under the Local Government Act, 1888, and includes all boroughs in which are not county boroughs.
