Whitehall, July 29, 1924.

Amongst the matters discussed at the Imperial Conference, 1923, was the question of the precedence of the High Commissioners in London. In accordance with the undertaking then given (see Page 17 of Cmd. 1987), the matter was examined and suggestions were put forward, with His Majesty's approval, by the late Government for the consideration of Dominion Prime Ministers and Government of India. These proposals have proved generally acceptable, and His Majesty has now been pleased to direct that the High Commissioners for Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia, New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State, Newfoundland and India should be given precedence, on ceremonial occasions, according to the following principles:

(a) When British or Dominion Ministers, being at the time members of their respective Cabinets, are present, the High Commissioners should take precedence immediately after them; this precedence is subject to the qualification that the High Commissioner should not on any occasion be given a precedence higher than that accorded by the Table of Precedence to Secretaries of State.

(b) When no members of the British or Dominion Cabinets are present, the High Commissioners should take precedence immediately after that accorded by the Table of Precedence to Secretaries of State. At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 25th day of July, 1924.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of certain neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Templeton, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Lobbeare, and a portion of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Withleigh, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Templeton and Loxbeare

toether with a portion of the said Benefice of Withleigh duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended such union of Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for such union of Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop of Exeter embodies certain modi-

fications thereof:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices of Templeton, Loxbeare, and Withleigh are now full, the Reverend John Finlay Rutherford being the present Incumbent of the said Benefices of Templeton and Loxbeare and the Reverend Fitzwilliam Carter being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Withleigh:

"And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice of Templeton with Loxbeare when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Templeton and such house will accordingly become the Parsonage House of the United Benefice:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Exeter, and with the consent also of the said John Finlay Rutherford (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme respectively), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as

follows, that is to say:-

### " PART I.

"As to the union of the said Benefices of Templeton and Loxbeare we recommend and

propose:

"1. That the said Benefice of Templeton and the said Benefice of Loxbeare shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of The United Benefice of Templeton with Loxbeare, but the Parish of the said Benefice of Loxbeare and the Parish of the said Benefice of Templeton shall continue distinct in all respects.

That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said John Finlay Rutherford if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Templeton and Loxbeare shall be the first Incumbent of the

United Benefice.

"3. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Templeton with Loxbeare from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of Templeton and Loxbeare alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Loxbeare having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Templeton having the right of presentation upon the

second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

### " PART II.

"As to the union of a portion of the said Benefice of Withleigh with the United Benefice of Templeton with Loxbeare (referred to in Part I of this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"1. That a portion of the said Benefice of Withleigh, that is to say, so much of the said Benefice of Withleigh as is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the west by the said Benefice of Templeton, upon the north and north east partly by the Benefice of Stoodleigh and partly by the said Benefice of Loxbeare, upon the east partly by the said Benefice of Loxbeare and partly by the Benefice of Calverleigh, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south east and upon the south by an imaginary line following the middle of the road called Titchen's Lane (all which portion is more particularly delineated upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and is thereon coloured pink) shall be severed from the said Benefice of Withleigh and the portion so severed (in which portion there is not any Church or Parsonage House standing) shall for the purpose of the union of such portion with the said United Benefice of Templeton and Loxbeare and with the Parish of Templeton be deemed a separate Benefice and Parish.

"2. That the Benefice comprising the said portion of the said Benefice of Withleigh and the said United Benefice of Templeton with Loxbeare shall be permanently united together and form one United Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Templeton with Loxbeare' and that the Parish of the Benefice comprising the said portion of the said Benefice of Withleigh and the Parish of the said Benefice of Templeton shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes

as in the said Act provided.

"3. That if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the said Benefice of Withleigh shall be vacant the union of the severed portion of the said Benefice of Withleigh with the said United Benefice of Templeton with Loxbeare shall forthwith take effect, but if upon that day the said Benefice of Withleigh shall not be vacant then such union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacation of the said Benefice of Withleigh.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, or of any other

Act of Parliament.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected, together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Eccle-

siastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain

alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas one of the Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or

Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for
—"The Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Falmouth and partly out of the Parish of Budock, both in the County of Cornwall and in the Diocese of

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Falmouth and the said Parish of Budock are Parishes wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Falmouth and of the said Parish of Budock which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District or New Parish in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is within the limits of the said proposed separate District or New Parish a consecrated Church in use for the purposes of Divine Worship and such Church is named 'The Church of All Saints,

Falmouth':

" And whereas by a certain Indenture bearing date on or about the 26th day of June, 1924, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856,' or some or one of them, between the Venerable Montague Blamire Williamson, Archdeacon of Bodmin and Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Falmouth, of the first part, the Right Reverend Walter, Bishop of Truro, as the Patron in right of his See, and also as the ordinary of the said Rectory of Falmouth, of the second part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the third part (which Indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said Montague Blamire Williamson did, with the consent of the said Walter, Bishop of Truro, as such Bishop and also as such Patron as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the Minister or Incumbent of the District or New Parish hereinafter recommended to be constituted and to his successors first a perpetual clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £450 to be payable quarterly on the usual quarter days in every year free from and clear of all charges for First Fruits and Tenths and of all deductions, taxes, charges, rates, assessments, and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any) the first of such quarterly payments in respect of the said clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £450 to be made on such of the said quarter days as shall happen next after the date of the licence of the first Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed District or New Parish and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of the said licence to the said quarterly day of payment and to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon all that the annual sum of £1,100 payable to the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Rectory of Falmouth by the Corporation of Falmouth in respect of the Falmouth Rectory Rate and in accordance with the provisions of the Falmouth Rectory Act, 1896; and secondly, certain Tithe Rent Charges commuted at £46 9s. 9d. arising from lands and hereditaments situate in the said Parish of Falmouth and belonging to the said Rectory of Falmouth, free from and clear of all charges for First Fruits and Tenths, the said conveyance of the Tithe Rent Charges to take effect from the date of the said licence of the first Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed District or

New Parish:
"And whereas the said yearly rent charge of £450 and the said Tithe Commutation Rent Charges have been so granted and confirmed as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

And whereas the said Montague Blamire Williamson has nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Truro, as the person to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Walter, Bishop of Truro (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Falmouth and of the said Parish of Budock which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The New Parish of All Saints, Falmouth.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the said Church of All Saints, Falmouth, shall as from the day last mentioned be and for that purpose we hereby specify the same Church as the Parish Church of the said New

Parish of All Saints, Falmouth.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Walter, Bishop of the said Diocese of Truro, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Falmouth and of the Parish of Budock, both in the County of Cornwall and in the Diocesc of Truro, which taken together, are bounded upon part of the north-west and upon the north by the New Parish of Penwerris, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north-east by Falmouth Harbour and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east, upon the south, upon the south-west, upon the west and upon the remaining part of the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary of the said Parish of Falmouth at a point in the middle of the pierhead of the Prince of Wales' Pier, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said pier and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 81 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the road called Market Strand, and extending thence southward along the middle of Market Strand for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Killigrew Street, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Killigrew Street for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the north-eastern side of Market Place, and exthence south-westward and in straight line across Market Place for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the northern end of the road called Berkeley Place, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Berkeley Place for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Quarry Hill and the road called Berkeley Vale, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Berkeley Vale for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Brook Street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Brook Street for a distance of 41 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Killigrew Road and Trelawney Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Trelawney Road for a distance of 251 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wood Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Wood Lane for a distance of  $16\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Western Terrace and Pennance Road, and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the middle of Pennance Road for a distance of 42½ chains or thereabouts to its southern end at Swanpool Beach, and extending thence in a straight line due south for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts, to the low water mark of ordinary tides in Falmouth Bay on the southern boundary of the said Parish of Falmouth, and extending thence first westward and then south-westward along the southern boundary of the said Parish of Falmouth (thereby following the said low water mark) for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the boundary which divides the said Parish of Budock from the said Parish of Falmouth, and extending thence first westward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of 77 chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary crosses the middle of the Falmouth Branch Line of the Great Western Railway, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 411 chains or thereabouts to the point where such line of railway is crossed by the footpath leading from the house and premises known as Tregoniggie to Union Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the southern side of Union Road, and extending thence north-eastward and in a straight line across Union Road for a distance of 12 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the western end of the footpath leading from Union Road to the Penryn Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 71 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the angle formed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Budock from the said Parish of Falmouth, and extending thence first southeastward to and then north-eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the southern side of the last mentioned footpath) for a distance of 2½ chains or theresbouts to the point where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Penwerris from the said Parish of Falmouth."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the Parishes out of which it is intended that the District, recommended in such Scheme to be constituted, shall be taken, and such Patron and the Incumbent of the Parish of Falmouth have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the Incumbent of the Parish of Budock has offered an objection to the said Scheme:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since the transmission of such drafts as aforesaid:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objection the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Truro.

A STATUTE TO AMEND THE STATUTES OF THE College Concerning the Qualifications of CANDIDATES FOR SCHOLARSHIPS AND EXHIBI-

WE, the Warden and Fellows of Winchester College, being the Governing Body of Winchester College, do hereby, in exercise of the powers of the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of the Acts amending the same, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, resolve and enact as follows :-

A Statute to amend the Statutes of the College concerning the qualifications of candidates for Scholarships and Exhibitions.

1. This Statute shall apply (1) to the Scholarships now regulated by Statute XI of the body of Statutes approved by His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council on the 24th day of October, 1904, and by an amending Statute approved by His Majesty the King in Council on the 26th day of April, 1920, and (2) to the Exhibitions now regulated by section 1 of Statute XII of the said body of Statutes and by an amending Statute approved by His Majesty the King in Council on the 14th day of October, 1914.

2. The Scholarships and Exhibitions shall be open to every candidate, if otherwise duly qualified, who shall be (1) a natural-born British subject, and (2) the son of a father also a natural-born British subject. These qualifications concerning nationality are hereinafter referred to as "the qualifications required by this Statute."

3. Every candidate shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Warden and Fellows that he has the qualifications required by this

Otherwise his candidature shall be disallowed, unless he shall have obtained, or shall obtain, under section 4 of this Statute, special leave to be a candidate.

4. The Warden and Fellows shall have a discretionary power, which they may exercise in any case which shall, in their judgment, be proper for the exercise thereof, of granting special leave to be a candidate for a Scholarship or Exhibition to any applicant who, being otherwise duly qualified to be a candidate, shall not have the qualifications required by this Statute, or shall not be able to produce satisfactory evidence that he has them. cations for such special leave shall be made at such time and in such manner as the Warden and Fellows shall from time to time direct.

5. The qualifications required by this Statute shall, as regards Scholarships, be additional to those now required for Scholarships, and shall, as regards Exhibitions, be additional

to those now required for Exhibitions.

6. Nothing in this Statute shall in any wise affect the right of any boy to any Scholarship or Exhibition to which he shall have been elected or appointed before the commencement of this Statute.

7. This Statute shall come into force and commence immediately upon the approval thereof by His Majesty the King in Council.

TRAMWAY AND MOTOR OMNIBUS BYE-LAWS.

PAKE notice that the Lord Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Cardiff, acting by the Council on the 14th day of July, 1924, made the following Bye-laws relating to their Tramway and Omnibus system under the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Cardiff Corporation Act, 1920:-

### INTERPRETATION.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say, "Corporation" means The Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Cardiff and any Lessee or other persons for the time being working the

Tramways hereinafter defined; "Tramways" means the Tramway and Motor Omnibus System worked by the Corporation, whether situate within the City of Cardiff, or in any other district where the Corporation have running powers; "Car" means any Carriage or Car run upon the Tramways, and any Motor Omnibus owned and used by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers; "Passenger" means every person being carried or conveyed upon or by a Car; "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of, or helping in the charge of a Car; "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a Car; "Tramway Premises" means any Station, Waiting Room, or other premises used in connection with the Tramways; "Full Car" means any Car containing the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided.

### OFFENSIVE LANGUAGE OR CONDUCT.

2. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any Car or Tramway Premises, or spit, or commit any nuisance in, upon, from, or against any Car or Tramway Premises, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

No person shall, whilst travelling in or upon any Car, or whilst upon any Tramway Premises, sing or play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or throw down and leave in or upon Tramway Premises or any Car, any waste paper or other refuse, or deposit remnants of food or fruit or any objectionable matter in or upon any Tramway Premises or any Car.

### OBJECTIONABLE PERSONS.

3. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, and no person who from any other cause or for any other reason in the opinion of the Conductor might be offensive or objectionable to any passenger, shall board or enter any Car, and any such person found in or upon any Car shall leave the Car on being requested by the Conductor to do so, and on his refusal he may be immediately removed from the Car by or under the direction of the Conductor.

### Dogs.

4. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any Car, except by permission of the Conductor or the Tramways General Manager. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any Car shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the Car immediately upon request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, such dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

### DAMAGE TO CAR.

5. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any Car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any Car or its equipment.

Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, be liable to pay the amount of any damage so done.

### SMOKING.

6. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in or upon any Car, except in a compartment or on seats especially set apart for the purpose.

### PAYMENT OF FARES.

7. Each passenger shall pay to the Conductor the fare legally demandable for the journey, whether the same shall or shall not be demanded.

Upon payment of the fare, the Conductor shall give, and the passenger shall accept, a ticket for the journey or stage in respect of which the fare is paid. Such ticket shall only be available by the Car on which it is issued, and by the passenger to whom it is given, or in respect of whom it is issued.

A passenger travelling beyond the destination to which his ticket is available shall pay to the Conductor the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by him beyond the destination for which he has paid his fare.

### TICKETS.

8. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required to do so to the Conductor, or other duly authorized servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required to do so, either deliver up his ticket in such a condition that the number and other material portion thereof can be read and identified, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

### OFFENSIVE CLOTHING.

9. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor of a Car, soil, injure, or damage the seats, linings, curtains, or cushions of the Car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, shall enter, or remain in or upon any Car, and the Conductor may prevent any such person entering the Car.

No such person shall enter in or upon any Car after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any Car, he shall on the request of the Conductor, leave such Car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned or tendered to him, and on his refusal to do so he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Provided that no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon a Car under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Provided further that on top covered Cars any such person as last mentioned shall, if so directed by the Conductor, travel on the upper deck when there is seating accommodation available thereon. Interference with the Duties of Driver or Conductor.

10. No person other than the Conductor or Driver shall change or remove the Route indicators, or Destination Boards, or interfere with the Controller, Brakes, Switches, Lights, Trolley Cord or any part of the Car or its equipment.

### LUGGAGE.

11. No passenger shall bring into or upon any Car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight.

The Conductor may decline to take, and may prevent any person from taking upon any Car, any personal or other luggage exceeding 28 lbs. in weight and any luggage which from its size or otherwise is, in the opinion of the Conductor, unsuitable for the conveyance in or upon the Car.

### FULL NUMBER OF PASSENGERS.

12. No person shall board or enter a full Car, or remain therein or thereon except by permission of the Conductor, and any such permission shall be confined to the lower deck only.

The Conductor shall have power to prevent any person boarding or entering a full Car, and any person already upon a full Car shall immediately leave the same when requested to do so by the Conductor, and upon refusal he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

### DISABLED CARS.

13. If at any time a Car becomes disabled, or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, all passengers shall, upon the request of the Conductor, leave the Car, and shall not be entitled to the return of the amount of fares paid by them, but shall be entitled to continue their journey by the next available Car on any section. No person shall board or enter a disabled or damaged Car.

### CARS PROCEEDING TO SHEDS.

14. No person shall travel upon a Car which is proceeding to a shed, and is not on its usual route unless permitted so to do by the Conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

### TRAVELLING ON STEPS, ETC.

15. No person other than the Driver or the Conductor of the Car, or other duly authorised Servant of the Corporation, shall travel or ride upon the platform, steps, outside rails, buffers, or any external part of a Car, or stand on the upper deck.

### FIREARMS, ETC.

16. No person shall place or carry in or upon any Car loaded firearms, or any article, instrument, or implement or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers or likely to cause a nuisance, or to soil or damage any Car or the clothing of any passenger.

### ENTERING CARS.

17. Every passenger shall enter and depart from a Car by the hindermost or Conductor's

platform, unless otherwise directed by the Conductor at places appointed by the Corporation, providing that this Bye-law shall not apply to any Car which can, with the approval of the Ministry of Transport, be worked by one man in charge only.

Except at a terminus, no person shall board the Car until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

### Entering or Leaving Car in Motion.

18. No person shall board or leave, or attempt to board or leave, any Car in motion.

### USE OF SIGNAL BELLS.

19. No person shall ring or cause to be rung any of the signal bells upon any Car, so as to effect the unnecessary stoppage of any Car, nor signal a Car to start.

### ILLEGAL OFFENCE.

20. Any person who shall commit whilst in or on any Car any breach of these Bye-laws shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be removed immediately from the Car by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to have the amount thereof refunded.

### Passengers to form a Queue.

21. On occasions when six or more persons being intending passengers are waiting at any stopping station or terminus upon the Tramways to board a Car, they shall form up in a line or queue and board the Car in the order in which they stand, and no person shall take or endeavour to take a place in such line or queue when formed out of proper order, or shall board or endeavour to board a Car out of the order in which he stood in such line or queue, or before any person who stood in front of him in such line or queue.

### OBSTRUCTION.

22. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any Conductor, Driver or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any Caror the Tramways.

### CONDUCTORS AND DRIVERS TO ENFORCE BYE-LAWS.

23. Every Inspector, Conductor and Driverof a Car shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and prevent any breach, thereof.

### PENALTY.

24. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable in respect of each offence to a penalty-not exceeding Forty Shillings.

### BYE-LAWS TO BE KEPT IN CARS.

25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each Car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

### REFEAL OF EXISTING BYE-LAWS.

26. From and after the date of these Byelaws coming into force, the Byelaws made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Cardiff on the 8th day of

September, 1902, the 8th day of August, 1904, and the 8th day of August, 1905, shall be repealed.

### OPERATION.

27. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of October, 1924.

The foregoing Bye-laws were made at a Meeting of the Council held on the fourteenth day of July, 1924.
