Order for Transfer of Parish.

AYLESBURY AND WYCOMBE UNIONS.

WENDOVER PARISH.

Whereas the Parish of Wendover is situate within the Wycombe Rural District and the Wycombe Union, and the County Council of Buckingham have made an order under section 57 of the Local Government Act, 1888, for the transfer of that Parish to the Rural District of Aylesbury;

And whereas the Parish Council of Wendover and the Rural District Council of Aylesbury have applied to the Minister of Health for an order for the transfer of the Parish of Wendover from the Wycombe Union to the Aylesbury Union:

Now, THEREFORE, the Minister of Health, in pursuance of section 32 of the Poor Law Amendment Act, 1834, and section 66 of the Poor Law Amendment Act, 1844, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Short Title and Commencement.

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Wendover Order, 1924, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1924:

Provided that for the purpose of the preparation of any precept or contribution order to be made on or after the 1st day of October, 1924, this Order shall operate from such earlier day as may be necessary.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, "the appointed day" means the 1st day of October, 1924.

Transfer of the Parish of Wendover.

2.—(1) On the appointed day, the Parish of Wendover in the Wycombe Union shall be separated from that Union, and shall be added to and form part of the Aylesbury Union.

(2) In this Order, "the transferred Parish" means the Parish of Wendover.

Rural District Councillors and Guardians.

3. Any person who, immediately before the appointed day, is in office as Rural District Councillor for the Parish of Wendover, shall, on and after the appointed day, represent that Parish on the Board of Guardians of the Aylesbury Union, and shall cease to act as a Guardian of the Wycombe Union.

Irremovability.

4. Every person, who immediately before the appointed day has acquired, or is in the course of acquiring, a status of irremovability from the Wycombe Union, by reason of residence in the transferred Parish, or any part thereof, shall be deemed to have acquired, or to be in the course of acquiring, a status of irremovability from the Aylesbury Union.

Property, Debts and Liabilities.

5.—(1) All property, debts and liabilities which, immediately before the appointed day, are vested in or attach to the Guardians of the Wycombe Union in relation exclusively to the transferred Parish, or to any part thereof, shall, by virtue of this Order, be transferred to, vest in and attach to the Guardians of the Aylesbury Union.
