

north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Patrick, Hove, from the said Parish of Hove at the junction of Holland Road with Cromwell Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Cromwell Road for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wilbury Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Wilbury Road for a distance of $9\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roads called Wilbury Crescent and Wilbury Villas, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Wilbury Villas for a distance of $11\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Old Shoreham Road upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hove from the said Consolidated Chapelry of the Good Shepherd, Preston, Brighton."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"We, William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Devon and Diocese of Exeter the United Benefice of Horwood with Newton Tracey the Parishes whereof contain respectively a population of One Hundred and sixty eight persons or thereabouts and One Hundred persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the respective Parish Churches for about One Hundred and about Ninety persons.

"The net annual value of the United Benefice of Horwood with Newton Tracey is Two Hundred and sixty eight pounds or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Benefice or Rectory of Alverdiscott the Parish whereof contains a population of Two Hundred and twenty six persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 160 persons.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Alverdiscott is Two Hundred and six pounds or thereabouts.

"That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, a small portion of the United Benefice of Horwood with Newton Tracey (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto and thereon edged with Pink) may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Alverdiscott to which it is contiguous.

"The Patrons of the United Benefice of Horwood with Newton Tracey are Colonel Humphrey Dene and The Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain in right of the Crown and the Reverend Gilbert Vernon Yonge is the Incumbent thereof. The Patron of the Benefice of Alverdiscott is The Right Reverend The Lord Bishop of Exeter and the Reverend Arthur Hogarth Oak-Rhind is the Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alteration above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same together with the consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the said United Benefice of Horwood with Newton Tracey and annex to the said Parish of Alverdiscott all that part of the United Benefice of Horwood with Newton Tracey comprising the localities known as West Woodland, Woodland Cross, East Woodland and South Woodland the boundaries of which are delineated on the Ordnance plan hereto annexed and edged with Pink.

"That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Alverdiscott shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be separated from Horwood with Newton Tracey.

"That any inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Alverdiscott but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Churches of Horwood and Newton Tracey.

"That any Inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have Marriages Baptisms Churchings and Burials solemnised and performed in the Parish Church of Alverdiscott as they might have had in the Parish Churches of Horwood and Newton Tracey.

"That all fees Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments which may arise from the said portion so to be separated from Horwood and
