#### UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE.

BANKING INDUSTRY SPECIAL SCHEME  
ORDER, 1924.

The Unemployment Insurance (Banking Industry Special Scheme) Order, 1924. Special Order dated June 18, 1924, made by the Minister of Labour under the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920 (10 and 11 Geo. 5. c. 30). (a)

Whereas the Minister of Labour (hereinafter called "the Minister") has determined the classes of undertakings specified in the Special Scheme set forth in the Schedule hereto to be the Banking Industry for the purposes of Section eighteen of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"):

And whereas the said Special Scheme has been made by an Association of employers and employees so constituted that the members of the Association who are employers consist of persons employing a substantial majority of the employees in the said Industry, and the members who are employees consist of persons representing a substantial majority of the employees in the said Industry:

And whereas the said Special Scheme provides for the insurance against unemployment of all the employed persons in the Industry other than the classes specified in the said Special Scheme and the benefits are in the opinion of the Minister not less favourable on the whole than the benefits provided by the Unemployment Insurance Acts, 1920 to 1924.

And whereas it appears to the Minister that insurance against unemployment can be more satisfactorily provided for by a Scheme under section eighteen of the Act than by the general provisions of the Unemployment Insurance Acts, 1920 to 1924:

Now therefore the Minister by virtue of the powers conferred on him by section eighteen of the Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby makes the following Special Order:—

(i) The Minister hereby approves the Special Scheme set forth in the Schedule hereto,

(ii) this Order may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Banking Industry Special Scheme) Order, 1924.

##### BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL (1) TO FIX CERTAIN GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES AND TO VARY THE OVERTIME RATES FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON SUCH GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES, AND (2) TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE APPRENTICES, FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT UPON THE " COST OF LIVING " FIGURE.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated respectively 31st October, 1918 and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain, for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to

fix certain general minimum piece-rates for work preparatory to Rounding and Channelling Machines and to vary the overtime rates for male and female workers employed on piece-work to which the proposed general minimum piece-rates are applicable, and to vary the general minimum time-rates and overtime rates at present applicable to Male apprentices as set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice D (25), dated 29th February, 1924 (including the consequential variation of the minimum rates set out in the Trade Board's Notice D (24)), the proposed rates to be operative for periods dependent upon the " Cost of Living " Figure.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice of Proposal.

Information in respect of the Trade Board's Proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board at the address given below.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 19th day of August, 1924. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

*Declaration of Infected Areas.*

1. The Areas described in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 70), hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order."

*Additional Restrictions applicable to certain Infected Areas.*

and exceptions as may be indicated in the Order and to extend them to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order.

5. To authorise the Corporation to open, break up and interfere with all streets, roads and public places, ways, footpaths, bridges, culverts, sewers, drains and gas and water mains and pipes and telegraph and telephone and other wires within the area of supply and to lay down, erect, maintain, renew, and remove, either above or underground or otherwise, electric lines, conductors, mains, pipes, tubes, wires, posts, street or distributing boxes, meters, apparatus, or other works or things required for the purpose of enabling the Corporation to generate, supply, store, convey, transmit or distribute electricity within the area of supply, and to confer all such other powers upon the Corporation as may be necessary for effecting the objects of the proposed undertaking.

6. To empower the Corporation to connect their area of supply with the electric mains of the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Walsall (hereinafter called "the Walsall Corporation") and to authorise the Walsall Corporation to supply electricity in bulk to the Corporation for use within their area of supply and for that purpose to enable the Corporation to break up the following streets or roads and railways in the rural district of Lichfield in the County of Stafford:—

Birch Lane from the Boundary of the Parish of Aldridge (crossing the Chester Main Road) to Gravelly Lane; Gravelly Lane; Footherley Lane (crossing the county bridge over Footherley Brook); Hollyhill Lane (crossing the bridge over the Sutton Coldfield and Lichfield branch of the London Midland and Scottish Railway); New Road to its junction with Station Road, Shenstone; the London Midland and Scottish Railway's private road approach to Shenstone Station, Station Road, Shenstone; the Lichfield and Birmingham Main Road (crossing the bridge over Crane Brook and crossing Watling Street) to Lichfield City Boundary.

7. To empower the Corporation to supply electrical energy for purposes incidental to the working or lighting of any railway or canal situate partly within and partly without the area of supply and to fit up show rooms and offices and give exhibitions and demonstrations of the uses of electricity.

8. To authorise the Corporation to take collect and recover rents, rates and charges for the supply of electricity for lighting, heating, power or other purposes, and for the use of any machines lamps meters fittings or apparatus connected therewith and to prescribe and limit the price to be charged therefor.

9. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, and the enactments incorporated therewith and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

Every local or other public authority, company or person desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objection re-

specting the application may do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Gwydyr House, Whitehall, S.W. 1, and despatched on or before the 30th day of September, 1924, and a copy of such objection must also be forwarded to the undersigned Town Clerk or Parliamentary Agents.

#### BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that on the 12th day of August, 1924, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Bradford as the promoters and owners of the Bradford Tramways and the Bradford & Leeds Light Railway under the powers conferred on them by the Tramways Act, 1870, the Bradford Tramways & Improvement Act, 1897, the Bradford & Leeds Light Railway Order, 1899, the Bradford Corporation Act, 1910, and the Railway Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, duly made the Bye-laws and Regulations hereunder set out.

1. In the Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth the expression "the Corporation" means "the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Bradford," the expression "car" includes a tramway car and a trackless trolley vehicle and the expression "conductor" includes any officer or servant in the employment of the Corporation and having charge (sole or otherwise) of a car.

2. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall extend and apply to all cars of the Corporation and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

3. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the hindermost or conductor's platform and not otherwise, except at a terminus when the car is stationary. When a car stops, no person shall board the same until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

4. No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave, any car when the same is in motion

5. No passenger shall smoke whilst in or on any car except when in a compartment or on a seat specially set apart by the Corporation for that purpose, and no person shall spit in, on, from or against any car.

6. No passenger shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

7. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or mount upon any car, or attempt to do so. Any person offending against this Bye-law or Regulation shall, in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed, be liable to be summarily removed, or prevented from entering or mounting, by or under the direction of the conductor.

8. No person whilst in or upon any car shall swear or use obscene or offensive language, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

9. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on or against any car or any tramway station, waiting room or other premises used in connection with the tramways of the Corporation.

10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, or any printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise damage any car. Any person offending against this Bye-law or Regulation shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter prescribed in addition to being liable to pay to the Corporation the amount of any damage done.

11. A person whose dress or clothing might, and a person carrying any article which might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the seats, linings or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter or remain on or in any car, and may be prevented from so doing, and, if found on or in any car, shall, on request of the conductor leave the same upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned. Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car under the provisions of this Bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

12. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable for the journey, and in any case, whether the said fare has been demanded or not, shall pay such fare before leaving the car.

13. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do, to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

14. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics and daily labourers) not exceeding 28lbs. in weight shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and



not elsewhere. The conductor may decline to take into or upon the car any luggage of a form or nature calculated in his opinion to annoy or inconvenience any passenger.

15. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall travel on any of the steps or platforms of any car, or stand on the upper deck, or sit on any railing, guard, or buffer of any car, and any person so travelling, standing, or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

16. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, or a duly authorised officer of the Corporation, shall enter or mount any car.

17. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any car, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the lower deck of the car with the consent of the conductor.

18. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such car when warned by the conductor not to do so.

19. Except as hereinafter mentioned no person shall allow or permit any dog or other animal to be in or on any car or any part thereof, provided that any person may allow a dog to accompany him on the floor of the top deck of a car if he first obtain the consent of the conductor and pay on demand the prescribed charge for the dog. Any person who shall be accompanied by a dog or other animal in or on any part of a car shall, notwithstanding any such consent as is hereinbefore mentioned, on the request of the conductor immediately remove from the car such dog or other animal, and if he shall fail to comply with such request forthwith the dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

20. No person shall enter, or mount, or attempt to enter, or mount, any car, or travel or attempt to travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement which may, in the opinion of the conductor be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

21. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car, and no person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord or any other part of a car or its equipment.

22. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand the return of the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel, by the next available car, the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the consent of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged car.

23. Any person who shall offend against or commit any breach of these Bye-laws or Regu-

lations shall be liable, if the offence is continued, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter prescribed, to be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to its return.

24. The conductor shall enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof to the best of his ability.

25. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding FORTY SHILLINGS.

26. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

27. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of November, 1924, and from that date the Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Corporation on the 10th day of June, 1902, and the 14th day of December, 1909, respectively are hereby repealed.

1.
