The following Statute made by the Chancellor, Masters and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, and Sealed on the 30th day of June, 1924, and approved by the University of Cambridge Commissioners on the 9th day of August 1924, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes in relation to the University of Cambridge, made under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877" (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 48), which amending Statute is now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the 53rd section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and by the 11th section of the Schedule of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, in relation to our said University in manner following, that is to say:—

By repealing Statute B, Chapter II,

intituled—"For the Common University Fund", and substituting therefor the following Chapter II:—

The Accounts of the receipt and expenditure of money paid by the Colleges for University purposes shall be included in the Accounts of the University Chest.

A sum shall be set aside from the Chest annually for capital expenditure on sites and for the erection of Buildings (including interest and payments towards Sinking Funds for the repayment of money borrowed for such purposes). This sum shall be determined from time to time by Grace of the Senate on the recommendation of the Financial Board; and payments from this sum shall be made only on the authority of a Grace of the Senate.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

#### REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF PROBATIONARY ASSISTANT ENGINEER IN THE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT OF THE POST OFFICE.

*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. *Age.*—The limits of age for this situation are 20 and 23. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st March or the 1st September of the year in which they are examined, according as the examination is held in the first or second half of the year.

In reckoning age for this purpose a candidate may deduct any time, up to a maximum of two years, which he has spent in an approved engineering works; and candidates who have served, or are serving, in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

2. *Nationality.*—No person will be eligible for appointment who is not a natural-born British subject, and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

3. *Education*.—Candidates must have taken a complete engineering course at an institution of university rank and have passed an examination qualifying for a degree thereon, allowance being made for war and post-war conditions so far as recognised by the university regulations, provided that this requirement may be waived in the case of a man who is serving in the Post Office and is nominated by the Postmaster-General. Whitworth scholars, and students of the Imperial College of Science and Technology who have gained the Diploma of Membership of the Imperial College in physics or engineering, or who hold the Diploma of Associateship of the City and Guilds Institute, will be regarded as eligible, and the Civil Service Commissioners may in exceptional cases admit others who have satisfied them that they have undergone a suitable course of training and possess an equally high standard of qualification.

4. *Health and Character*.—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

5. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service and Apprentices in H.M. Dockyards must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

6. *Subjects*.—The examination will be in the following subjects:—

1. Mathematics.
2. Electro-Technology.
3. Materials.
4. Theory of Machines.
5. One of the following four subjects:—

- (a) Alternating Currents.
- (b) Electrical Machines.
- (c) Telegraphy and Telephony.
- (d) Heat Engines.

#### 6. Personal Qualities.

No candidate will be eligible who does not pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in each of the subjects 1, 2, 3, 4, 6.

The examination may be held in one part or in two parts, at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners. In the latter case the first part of the examination will be used to reduce the number of competitors to be

admitted to the second part. Of those who pass and obtain the highest aggregate marks on the first part a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be admitted to the second part of the examination. The successful list will consist of those candidates who pass and obtain the highest aggregate marks in the whole examination.

(No. 145).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested

in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Infected Areas.

1. The Areas described in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 70) hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order."

*Additional Restrictions applicable to certain Infected Areas.*

2.—(1) The Principal Order shall in its application to the Infected Area No. 6 described in the First Schedule hereto be read and have effect as if the words "five miles" were substituted for the words "two miles" wherever those words appear throughout the Order.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Principal Order, no licence shall be granted authorising the movement of animals into the Infected Area No. 5 described in the First Schedule hereto from any other infected area to which the Principal Order applies.

*Revocation of Certain Orders.*

3. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

*Commencement.*

4. This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

*Short Title.*

5. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 145), and shall be read with the Principal Order.
