

APPOINTMENTS OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of the Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, JAMES WILLIAM OLIVE, Acting Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT Standings for Hackney Carriages at the several places hereinafter mentioned; for such number of carriages at each Standing as specified, and within the boundaries set forth for each Standing, provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

APPOINTMENTS.

LUPUS STREET AND ST.
GEORGE'S SQUARE,
S.W.

Fourteen vehicles :

In two portions, viz. :—

First Portion.—Eight Carriages, at Lupus Street, on North side of roadway, commencing at a point 3 yards West from railings of garden enclosure at junction with Belgrave Road, extending Westward, by kerb, as far as necessary for eight carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

Second Portion.—Six Carriages, at St. George's Square, on East side of roadway, commencing at a point 3 yards North from railings of garden enclosure at junction with Lupus Street, extending Northward as far as necessary for six carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the South.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

On 4th August, 1924 :—

HIGH HOLBORN, W.C.

Twelve vehicles :

In centre of roadway, commencing at a point 10 feet East of the refuge at the entrance to Grays Inn, extending Eastward as far as necessary for twelve carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the West.
