1. areas so proposed to be added to the said area of supply are hereinafter referred to as "the added areas."

2. To authorise the Corporation to generate, supply, distribute and sell electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, within all portions of the added areas except the said urban districts of Grange and Ulverston, and to authorise the Corporation to generate, supply and sell electrical energy in bulk to any local authority, company or person for the time being authorised to supply electricity within those urban districts. To provide that electricity supplied by the Corporation to any company, body or person owning or working a railway, light railway, tramway, canal, navigation or waterworks undertaking, partly within and partly without the said urban districts may be used on any part of any such undertaking and for all or any of the purposes thereof.

3. To extend and make applicable to the added areas all or some of the provisions contained in the Barrow-in-Furness Corporation Electric Lighting Order, 1894, and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order, subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

4. To incorporate in the Order such of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as are applicable, and to apply such provisions to the undertaking authorised by the said Order of 1894 or to be authorised by the Order, subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

5. To authorise the Corporation to open, break up, and interfere with all streets, roads and public places, ways, footpaths, bridges, culverts, sewers, drains, and gas and water mains and pipes and telegraph and telephone and other wires within the area of supply, and to lay down, erect, maintain, renew and remove either above or under ground or otherwise electric lines, conductors, mains, pipes, tubes, wires, posts, street or distributing boxes, meters, apparatus or other works or things required for the purpose of enabling the Corporation to generate, supply, store, convey, transmit or distribute electricity within the added areas, and to confer all such other powers upon the Corporation as may be necessary for effecting the objects of the proposed undertaking.

6. To prescribe the maximum price or maximum prices that may be demanded and taken by the Corporation in respect of the supply of electrical energy within the added areas and to prescribe the minimum prices to be paid by persons supplied with electricity by the Corporation or connected to their electricity undertaking in those areas.

7. To authorise the Corporation in cases where they supply electricity for the purposes of haulage or traction on railways, tramways, or canals, situate partly within or partly without the area of supply or for lighting vehicles or vessels used thereon, to supply electricity for other purposes incidental to the working thereof, and also to authorise the Corporation to fit up show rooms, offices and installations and to give demonstrations as to the use of electricity.

8. To authorise the Corporation to sell electric lines, fittings apparatus and appliances for lighting, heating, motive power and all purposes for which electricity can be used.

9. To authorise the Corporation to open and break up in the added areas the following streets and parts of streets which are not repairable by the local authority (namely):—

North Lonsdale Road.

(c) In the Rural District of Ulverston—
Jack Hill (parish of Lower Allithwaite).

10. To alter, extend and amend the provisions of the Barrow-in-Furness Corporation Electric Lighting Order, 1894, or some of those provisions.

11. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, and the enactments incorporated therewith, and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would, or might, interfere with any of the objects of the Order and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

BOROUGH OF TODMORDEN.

NOTICE is hereby given, that on the 27th day of August, 1924, the Town Council of Todmorden, in pursuance of Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, duly made the following Bye-Laws:—

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

Under the powers conferred on them by the Todmorden Corporation Act 1906, the Todmorden Order 1923, confirmed by the Ministry

of Health Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 10) Act 1923, and the Tramways Act 1870, and every other power enabling them in that behalf.

1. From and after the date of these Bye-laws and Regulations coming into force the Bye-laws and Regulations made by the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Todmorden pursuant to a resolution of the Council of the said Borough passed on the 24th day of April, 1907, for regulating the travelling upon motor omnibuses and for the prevention of nuisances shall be repealed but any proceedings pending at the time of such repeal may be continued and prosecuted as if such repeal had not taken effect.

2. The expression "the Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Todmorden. The expression "motor omnibus" means any stage carriage for the conveyance of passengers moved by mechanical power obtained from some internal source including in that expression steam, electrical and every other motive power which the Corporation may provide and run under their statutory powers. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Corporation and having charge of or helping in the charge of a motor omnibus. The expression "premises" shall mean any station, shelter, waiting-room, or other place or premises used in connection with the Motor Omnibus undertaking of the Corporation. The expression "interior of a motor omnibus" shall not include the upper deck of a double-deck motor omnibus.

3. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all motor omnibuses of the Corporation and to all places, premises and things with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

4. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a motor omnibus by the hindermost or conductor's platform and not otherwise. When a motor omnibus stops, no person shall board the motor omnibus until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom at that place shall have done so.

5. No person shall enter, or mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave, any motor omnibus in motion.

6. No passenger shall smoke or carry any lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in the interior of any motor omnibus except in a compartment specially set apart for the purpose, and no person shall spit, in, on, from or against any motor omnibus.

7. No passenger or other person shall play or perform upon any musical instrument or distribute any advertisement or tract of any kind or beg money alms or subscription or sell any article or play any game or gamble or deposit remnants of any food or fruit in or upon any motor omnibus or premises.

8. A person in a state of intoxication shall not enter or mount upon any motor omnibus, and if found in or upon any motor omnibus shall leave the motor omnibus immediately on being requested to do so by the conductor.

9. No person shall swear or use obscene, abusive or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any motor omnibus or premises or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

10. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on, or against any motor omnibus or premises.

11. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage any cushion, seat, curtain or lining, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice or any advertisement in or on any motor omnibus or premises or mark, break or scratch any window, or place his feet upon or lie upon the seat of or otherwise wilfully damage any motor omnibus or premises. Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law or Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

12. No person who has any dangerous, infectious or contagious disorder or disease shall board, enter or travel on any motor omnibus, or enter or remain on any premises, or attempt so to do, and no conductor or other authorised officer or servant of the Corporation shall suffer or permit any such person so to do. No clothing or other article likely to spread any infectious or contagious disease or disorder shall be brought into or placed by any person on any motor omnibus or premises, and any such person, clothing or other article found in or upon any motor omnibus or premises shall be removed from the motor omnibus by or under the direction of the conductor.

13. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the motor omnibus or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter or remain on or in any motor omnibus, and may be prevented from so doing, and, if found on or in any motor omnibus, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the same upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned: Provided that on motor omnibuses specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a motor omnibus under the provisions of this Bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

14. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable for the journey and accept a ticket therefor and in any case, whether demanded or not, shall pay such fare before leaving the motor omnibus. Any person leaving a motor omnibus shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

15. On any motor omnibus each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorised officer or servant of the Corporation or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger. A ticket shall not be transferable from person to person and (except a special ticket, if any, for transfer to another motor omnibus) shall only be available on the motor omnibus and for the journey for which it is issued, but this Bye-law shall not apply to prevent any passenger who has taken a return ticket from using the same himself in accordance with the terms of its issue.

16. No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface any ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible or know-

ingly or wilfully use or attempt to use any ticket which shall have been, in any respect materially altered or defaced.

17. No person shall bring in or on any motor omnibus any luggage other than his own personal luggage and any such personal luggage shall be placed by the passenger in such position on the motor omnibus as shall be directed by the conductor and shall not exceed 28lbs. in weight. In no case shall any luggage be put upon or occupy any part of a seat or be of a size, bulk, form, description or character likely to annoy, hinder or inconvenience any other passenger or damage any motor omnibus or obstruct any driver, conductor or other office or servant of the Corporation.

18. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall travel on the steps of any motor omnibus or stand on the upper deck, or sit on the railing, guards or cover of any motor omnibus, and any person so travelling, standing, or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

19. No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any motor omnibus.

20. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any motor omnibus or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the motor omnibus with the consent of the conductor.

21. When any motor omnibus contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such motor omnibus when warned by the conductor not to do so.

22. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in the interior of any motor omnibus except by permission of the conductor on any motor omnibus, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal is or in the opinion of the conductor is likely to be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. Every person who takes any dog or other animal in or on any motor omnibus shall securely hold the same in leash and keep it under control so as to prevent it from causing any injury or damage. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any motor omnibus after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any motor omnibus in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the motor omnibus immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

23. No person shall travel in or on any motor omnibus of the Corporation with any fire-arm or any explosive substance or with any article, instrument, tool or implement or any material or substance which may in the opinion of the conductor or other authorised officer of the Corporation be dangerous or offensive to the passengers provided that nothing contained in this Bye-law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Reserve or Auxiliary Forces carrying unloaded fire-arms.

24. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connec-

tion with any motor omnibus and no person other than the conductor or driver or other officer or servant of the Corporation shall change or remove any route indicator or destination board or touch handle or interfere with the steering gear, brakes, lights, ventilators, signalling apparatus or any machine or appliance in, under, upon or about any motor omnibus, except that a passenger may use the signalling apparatus (if any) provided for the use of passengers to stop the motor omnibus only to enable him to alight therefrom and only by giving one ring and not otherwise.

25. If at any time a motor omnibus becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available motor omnibus, the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged motor omnibus.

26. On occasions when six or more persons being intending passengers by any motor omnibus are waiting to enter such motor omnibuses or any of them at any stopping place or terminus, they shall form up in a line or queue and no such intending passenger nor any other person shall take or endeavour to take any position in such line or queue when formed except in proper order behind the last person in such line or queue or shall enter or endeavour to enter any such motor omnibus otherwise than in the order in which he was entitled to take up his position as aforesaid.

27. No male person shall, unless duly authorised by the Corporation, mount or attempt to mount upon any motor omnibus which is run and reserved by the Corporation for female persons only, and on which a notice to that effect is conspicuously exhibited. In any case in which a motor omnibus is run and reserved for any special purpose, which shall be indicated by a notice conspicuously exhibited upon such motor omnibus, no person other than the person or persons for whose conveyance the same motor omnibus is reserved shall mount or attempt to mount upon such motor omnibus.

28. No persons other than intending passengers and servants of the Corporation shall enter any shelter or waiting-room provided for

the accommodation of intending passengers and servants of the Corporation.

29. Any person who shall commit whilst in or on any motor omnibus any breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the motor omnibus by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to claim its return. Any person who shall commit any breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations in relation to any premises or queue shall, if the offence is continued be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from such premises or queue respectively by or under the direction of any officer or servant of the Corporation.

30. The conductor to the best of his ability shall enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof.

31. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings.

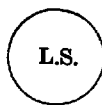
32. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each motor omnibus in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.
