COFFIN FURNITURE AND CEREMENT MAKING TRADE BOARD  
(GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS  
IN THE CEREMENT MAKING SECTION OF THE TRADE FOR PERIODS  
DEPENDENT UPON THE COST OF LIVING INDEX FIGURE.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Coffin Furniture and Cerement Making) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates, Piece Work Basis Time Rates, and Overtime Rates for Female Workers in the Cerement Making Section of the Trade at present effective and set out in the Schedule to the Notice U (14) issued by the Trade Board and dated 31st December, 1923, the proposed Minimum Rates being as set out in the Schedule below, and to be operative in the manner and for the periods specified therein.

This Notice is issued with the consent of the Minister of Labour.

SECTION II.

PINKERS.—The Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Pinkers shall be the rates proposed as set out in Section I above with the addition thereto of 1d. per hour in each case.

SECTION III.

CHOPPERS.—The Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Choppers shall be the rates proposed as set out in Section I above, with the addition thereto of ½d. per hour in each case.

PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME RATES.

The Proposed Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Female Piece-Workers of 18 years of age and over in the Cerement-Making Section of the Trade shall be 1d. per hour higher than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as proposed and set out or referred to in Sections I, II and III of Part I of this Schedule.

In cases where a worker is employed on Piece-Work each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, or, in the case of female workers under 18 years of age, not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate.

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES.

As respects the classes of Female Workers for whom variations in the Minimum Rates of Wages are proposed in Parts I and II of this Schedule Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates specified or referred to in Parts I and II of this Schedule, in the manner set

out in Part III of the Schedule to the Notice U (14) issued by the Trade Board, dated 31st December, 1923, shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates otherwise applicable, as set out or referred to in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all time worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the above mentioned Notice U (14) to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

## PART IV.

## APPLICABILITY OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES.

The respective proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out or referred to in Parts I, II and III of this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all female workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in the Cerement-Making Section of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Coffin Furniture and Cerement-Making) Order, 1919, as set out in Part IV of the Schedule to the above mentioned Notice U (14).

## PART V.

## COST OF LIVING CLAUSES.

## SECTION I.

Each "Cost of Living" period referred to in Columns I and II of Part I of this Schedule is a period from the first day of the month following the publication in the "Ministry of Labour Gazette" of a "Cost of Living" Figure (as defined in Section II below) within the range specified in the appropriate column, until the first day of the month following the publication of a figure within the range specified in the other column.

Provided that, in cases where the first day of the month does not coincide with the beginning of the weekly pay period, the "Cost of Living" period shall begin or end (as the case may be) at the beginning of the next following weekly pay period.

## SECTION II.

The "Cost of Living" Figure specified in this Schedule is the average percentage increase since July, 1914, in retail prices (all items) in the United Kingdom, as published each month in the "Ministry of Labour Gazette."

## SECTION III.

The proposed minimum rates set out in the Schedule to this Notice shall be operative only during the several periods specified in this Schedule or until such time as the cancellation or variation thereof may become effective.

## SECTION IV.

The rates payable on the date to be specified by the Minister of Labour as the date from which the proposed minimum rates shall become effective shall be the rates payable in accordance with Parts I, II, and III of this Schedule and the provisions of this Part of this Schedule.

## PART VI.

The proposed minimum rates of wages as provided in this Notice shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

NOTE.—NO VARIATION IS PROPOSED by the TRADE BOARD in the Minimum Rates of Wages at present effective for Male and Female Workers in the Coffin Furniture Section of the Trade as set out in the Notices U (13) and U (14) issued by the Trade Board.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSAL to VARY which may be lodged with them within two months from the 9th day of September, 1924. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Coffin Furniture and Cerement Making Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order, shall be read and have effect as if the following additional provisions were inserted in paragraph (3) of Article 3 thereof relating to the restrictions applicable to the landing from Ireland of fat swine intended for immediate slaughter:—

“ A licence granted under this Article authorising the landing of fat swine intended for immediate slaughter may specify as the place of destination either the Landing Place in Great Britain or a particular bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or any particular lairs, market or saleyard specially authorised as aforesaid. Where the Landing Place is specified as the place of destination the swine shall not be moved therefrom except to a particular bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or to any particular lairs, market or saleyard specially authorised as aforesaid

and then only if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry.

“ In the case of fat swine intended for immediate slaughter which have been landed under a licence authorising their movement to a particular bacon factory or slaughterhouse or to any particular lairs, market or saleyard specially authorised as aforesaid, the licence may, on the application of the consignee or his authorised agent, be altered by the Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place, so as to authorise movement to any other specified bacon factory or slaughterhouse or to any other specified lairs, market or saleyard specially authorised as aforesaid. Such alterations shall be initialled by the Inspector of the Ministry, and the licence shall thereupon be available for movement to the altered place of destination and to no other premises.”

ANIMALS (TRANSIT AND GENERAL)  
(AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Watering of Sheep during Transit.*

1. The provisions in Section 28 of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, relating to the provision of water to animals in transit by railway shall, in the case of sheep, apply with the substitution of the period of thirty-six consecutive hours for the period of twenty-four consecutive hours referred to therein.

*Water Supply at Railway Stations.*

2. At every railway station at which animals are habitually loaded, unloaded or detained during transit, the railway company or companies concerned shall make a provision of water to the satisfaction of the Ministry for the animals carried, or about to be or having been carried, on the railway, and such provision of water shall be easily accessible to all animals so carried.

*Revocation.*

3. The Water Supply on Railways Order of 1895 is hereby revoked.

*Buxton*, thence along the northern side of that road to the junction of *Station Road* with *The Quadrant*, thence along the northern sides of *The Quadrant* and *Spring Gardens* to the *River Wye*, thence southerly and westerly along the course of that river to the footbridge at *Upperdale*, thence in a south-easterly direction along the north-eastern side of the road through *Upperdale* to the junction of *Castlegate Lane* with *Ashford Lane* and the road to *Hassop* at *Headstone Head*, thence southerly along the eastern side of the main road to *Ashford* to the point where that road crosses the *London Midland and Scottish Railway*, thence south-easterly along the north-eastern side of that railway to where it crosses the main road at *Great Rowsley*, thence easterly and north-easterly along the northern side of the main road via *Walton*, *Baythorpe Road* and *West Bars* to the *Market Hall* at *Chesterfield*, and continuing thence in a generally northerly direction along the western side of the main road from *Chesterfield* to *Sheffield* via *Holywell Street*, *Sheffield Road*, *Unstone*, *Dronfield*, *Chesterfield Road*, and *London Road South* to the point where the last-mentioned road meets the railway from *Dronfield* to *Sheffield*, thence proceeding along the western side of that railway to the point of intersection with the railway from *Sheffield* to *Penistone*, thence north-westerly along the western side of that railway to its junction with the *London, Midland and Scottish Railway* at *Penistone*, thence north-westerly and westerly along the south-western and southern sides of that railway, via *Huddersfield Bradley* and *Sowerby*, to its junction with the eastern boundary of the parish of *Mytholmroyd*, thence proceeding in a south-westerly direction along the eastern boundary of that parish to its junction with the county boundary thence continuing in a southerly direction along the county boundary to the point where it is crossed by the road from *Milnrow* to *Denshaw*, thence proceeding along the northern and eastern sides of the main road via *Denshaw* and *Delph* to *Dob-Cross* at the point where the *London, Midland and Scottish Railway* (*Huddersfield and Manchester Line*) crosses that road, thence southerly along the eastern side of that railway to where it is crossed by the main road from *Mossley* to *Stalybridge* at *Stalybridge*, thence southerly along the eastern side of that road to its junction with the main road from *Stalybridge* to *Glossop*, thence south-easterly along the north-eastern side of the latter road via *Mottram-in-Longdendale* and the *Roman Road* to the point where it is crossed by the *London and North Eastern Railway* (*Great Central Section*), and thence in a south-westerly direction along the southern side of the *London and North Eastern Railway* (*Great Central Section*) to the *Railway Bridge* over the *River Etherow* at *Broadbottom*, thence south-westerly along the centre of the *River Etherow* to the confluence of that river with the *River Goyt*, thence southerly along the centre of the latter river to the point of commencement.
