### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 19th September, 1924, at 1 o'clock, for:—
  - (a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, The National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and
  - (b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1983.
- 2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

#### TREASURY BILLS.

- 3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 22nd September, 1924, to Saturday, the 27th September, 1924, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated,

and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

#### 4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

- 6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 1st April, 1924, rank pari passu with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 22nd September, 1924, to Saturday, the 27th September, 1924, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th October, 1924, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.
- 7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.
- 8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the

amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

- 10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

#### Whitehall, September 10, 1924.

The KING has been pleased to give and grant unto Commander Samuel Robinson, C.B.E., R.D., R.N.R. (retired), Captain of the Canadian Pacific s.s. "Empress of Canada," His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to wear the Cross of the Second Class of the Order of Naval Merit (with white badge), which Decoration has been conferred upon him by His Majesty the King of Spain, in recognition of valuable services rendered by him to the members of the Spanish Legation at Tokio at the time of the recent earthquake disaster.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Mr. William Roberts, Quarryman, in the following circumstances:—

On the 15th January, 1924, four men were engaged in clearing away the debris from a landslide which had blocked a road abutting on the Dorothea Slate Quarry in Carnarvonshire. Without any warning a portion of the road slipped into the quarry carrying with it one of the men who fell to the bottom and was killed. A second man named Robert Jones narrowly escaped the same fate but managed to clutch the edge of the road in his fall. Roberts, one of his fellow workers, at once went to his assistance; he seized Jones by the wrists and managed to drag him to safety.

Roberts undoubtedly performed a very courageous act; there was little firm ground left and such as it was it might well have given way at any moment. But for his action Robert Jones would certainly have lost his life as he could hold on no longer when Roberts reached him and there is a clear drop of 240 ft. to the bottom of the quarry.

THE GERMAN REPARATION (RECOVERY) No. 4 Order, 1924, dated September 8, 1924, made by the Board of Trade under the GERMAN REPARATION (RECOVERY) ACT, 1921 (11 & 12 GEO. 5. c. 5).

The Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 5 of the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, upon the recommendation of a Committee constituted under Section 5 of the said Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The German Reparation (Recovery) No. 4 Order, 1924."

2. Any article of the following description shall be exempt from the provisions of the said Act, that is to say, any article imported into Great Britain or Northern Ireland on or after the 9th day of September, 1924, in respect of which it is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise that-

(a) the proportion of the value of the said article payable under the said Act to the said Commissioners does not exceed 10s., and

(b) the said article is not included in the same consignment or order with other goods of such value that the sum payable to the said Commissioners under the said Act in respect of all goods so included exceeds 10s.

German Reparation 3. The (Recovery) No. 2 Order, 1924, is hereby revoked so far as it relates to goods imported on or after the 9th day of September, 1924.
