### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of the Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, JAMES WILLIAM OLIVE, Acting Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for Twenty-three Hackney Carriages at Kensington Road, W., in three portions, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz.;—

First portion.—Nine carriages, on North side of roadway, commencing at a point 4 yards east of Cabmen's Shelter, extending Eastward, by kerb, as far as necessary for nine carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the West.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:

#### Declaration of Infected Areas.

1. The Areas described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 70) hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order."

Additional Restrictions applicable to certain Infected Area.
