## COUNTY COURT DISTRICTS.

I, RICHARD BURDON VISCOUNT HALDANE OF CLOAN, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, by virtue of section 4 of the County Courts Act, 1888, as amended by section 9 of the County Courts Act, 1924, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order as follows:—

1. The District of the County Court of Leicestershire held at Lutterworth shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Warwickshire held at Rugby, and the holding of the said Court at Lutterworth shall be discontinued, and the said Court held at Rugby shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation, and shall have jurisdiction to deal with all proceedings which shall be pending in the said Court held at Lutterworth when this Order comes into operation.

2. This Order may be cited as the COUNTY COURT DISTRICTS (LUTTERWORTH) ORDER, 1924, and shall come into operation on the 5th day of October, 1924, and the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899, as amended, shall have effect as further amended by this Order.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 10th October, 1924, at 1 o'clock, for:—

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, The National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

## TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 13th October, 1924, to Saturday, the 18th October, 1924, inclusive, and will be payable at three months' after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date

on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

#### 4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 30th September, 1924, rank *paripassu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 13th October, 1924, to Saturday, the 18th October, 1924, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th April, 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

**SPECIAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING A COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION AMONG WOMEN FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE CLERICAL CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.**

1. Candidates must be not less than 22 years of age on the first day of July, 1924. A candidate born on 1st July, 1902, would be admitted. A candidate who becomes eligible for the offer of an appointment on the result of this examination will be assigned for un-pensionable service if she has attained the age of 50 at the date of the examination. No offer of any appointment will be made to any candidate after she has reached the age of 60.

No exception on any grounds will be made to this rule.

2. In order to be eligible a candidate must either—

(a) have rendered, prior to the 1st July, 1920, and at least in part after the 4th August, 1914, one full year's approved service in a temporary clerical post in a British Government Department, or in the War Department, Admiralty or Air Ministry Establishments, or in National Factories, Stores, Bonds, Depots, &c., where the services were remunerated direct from public funds; part of which service must have been rendered in a post ranking above that of Grade I Temporary Clerk or carrying a substantive salary of not less than £186 a year; or

(b) have served, between the 4th August, 1914, and the 31st December, 1919, as an enrolled member in Queen Mary's Army Auxiliary Corps, the Women's Royal Naval Service, the Women's Royal Air Force, or the Voluntary Aid Detachments General Service.

3. In order to be eligible a candidate must also either—

(a) have been serving on the 31st May, 1924, in a British Government Department or in one of the War Department, Admiralty or Air Ministry Establishments and have rendered not less than six months' approved service in a temporary clerical or administrative post in any such Department or Establishment, or such Departments or Establishments, prior to that date; or

(b) have rendered not less than six months' approved service in a temporary clerical or administrative capacity in any such Department or Establishment, or such

Departments or Establishments, between the 1st September, 1923, and the 31st May, 1924

Established Civil Servants are not eligible to compete.

4. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners:—

- (a) That they are unmarried or widows;
- (b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the daughter of a father also a natural-born British subject.

5. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

6. Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a sufficiently high standard of general proficiency.

7. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service and will consult, so far as possible, the wishes of Departments for the assignment of particular candidates who have served under them.
