WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORISATION (GILBERT DYET).

opium, and to carry on the business of manufacturing, selling or distributing the drugs to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 21st October, 1924.)

Whereas Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, empowers the Registrar General, with the sanction of the Minister of Health, from time to time to alter Registration Sub-districts by the alteration of the boundaries of Sub-districts by the formation of new Sub-districts, or by the union of Sub-districts:—

And whereas the Manchester Union comprises the Registration Districts of Manchester, Chorlton and Prestwich, and it is desirable that the boundaries of certain Sub-districts of those Registration Districts should be altered for the purpose of making such Sub-districts (subject nevertheless to the exceptions indicated in this Order) co-extensive with two or more Wards, for the purpose of the election of Councillors, into which the City of Manchester was divided by Section 45 of the Manchester Corporation Act, 1914:—

Now, therefore, I, Sylvanus Percival Vivian, Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Births and Deaths Registration Acts, 1836 to 1901, and with the sanction of the Minister of Health, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Manchester, Prestwich and Chorlton Registration of Births, &c., Order, 1924, and shall come into operation on the first day of November, 1924.

2. In this Order:

"Existing," when used in relation to any area, means existing immediately before the commencement of this Order;

"Ward" means a Ward of the City of Manchester for the election of Councillors.

- 3.—(1) The existing East Manchester Subdistrict of the Manchester Registration District shall be altered so as to be coextensive with the Exchange, New Cross, Oxford, St. Ann's, St. Clement's, St. John's, and St. Michael's Wards, and that Subdistrict, as altered by this Order, shall be called the Manchester Sub-district.
- (2) Any person in office, immediately before the commencement of this Order, as Registrar of the existing East Manchester Sub-district, shall be the Registrar of that Sub-district as altered and renamed by this Order.
- (3) The existing West Manchester Subdistrict of the Manchester Registration District shall cease to exist.
- 4. The following provisions shall have effect with respect to the boundaries of the existing Blackley, Bradford, Cheetham, and Newton Heath Sub-districts of the Prestwich Registration District:—
 - (1) The existing Blackley Sub-district shall be altered so as to comprise the whole of the Collyhurst and Harpurhey Wards, and that part of the Blackley Ward which is contained in the existing Blackley Sub-district;
 - (2) The existing Bradford Sub-district shall be altered so as to be co-extensive with the Beswick and Bradford Wards;
 - (3) The existing Cheetham Sub-district shall be altered so as to be co-extensive with the Cheetham, Crumpsall, and Collegiate Church Wards;
 - (4) The existing Newton Heath Subdistrict shall be altered so as to be coextensive with the Miles Platting and Newton Heath Wards.
- 5. The existing Ardwick Sub-district of the Chorlton Registration District shall be altered so as to comprise the Ardwick Ward, those parts of the Longsight, St. Luke's and St. Mark's Wards which are contained in the existing Ardwick Sub-district, and that part of the Longsight Ward which is comprised in the existing Bradford Sub-district of the Prestwich Registration District.
- 6. Subject to any further Order of the Registrar General, any Registrar of Births and Deaths for a Sub-district altered by any provision in Article 4 or Article 5 of this Order, and in office immediately before the commencement of this Order, shall continue to act for that Sub-district as so altered, and any Superintendent Registrar for a Registration District altered in consequence of any provision in this Order, and in office

immediately before the commencement of this Order, shall continue to act as Superintendent Registrar for that Registration District as so altered.

THE TRAMWAYS ACT 1870 AND THE SOUTH SHIELDS CORPORATION ACT 1921.

BYE-LAWS

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of South Shields acting by the Council as the promoters of the tramways in the said county borough authorised by the South Shields Corporation Acts 1903 1915 and 1921 and as the promoters of Motor Omnibuses under the South Shields Corporation Act 1921 did in pursuance of the Tramways Act 1870 and the said Act of 1921 on the 6th day of October 1924 make the following Bye-Laws:—

1 The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Corporation and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

INTERPRETATION OF TERMS.

- 2. Throughout these Bye-laws the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—
 - "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of South Shields, and shall include any lessees or other persons for the time being working or running over the tramways and light railways of the Corporation.
 - "Carriage" means any carriage or car run by the Corporation upon the Tramways or any motor omnibus run by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers.
 - "Conductor" means any officer or servant in the employ of the Corporation and having the charge of or helping in the charge of a carriage.
 - "Driver" means any servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a carriage.
 - "Officer" means any Inspector of Public Carriages or Tramway Inspector in the employ of the Corporation.
 - "Interior of a carriage" shall not include the upper deck of covered carriages.

OFFENSIVE LANGUAGE OR CONDUCT.

3. No person shall swear or use obscene indecent or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage or tramway station, tramway waiting room, or tramway premises used in connection with the carriages of the Corporation, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any carriage.

Objectionable Persons.

- 4. A person who is in a state of intoxication or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, shall not enter or mount upon any carriage, and any such person, if found in or upon any carriage, shall leave the carriage immediately on being requested to do so by the Conductor.
- 5. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the Conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from so doing, and if found in or upon any carriage shall, on the request of the Conductor, leave such carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned: Provided that, on carriages run for artizans, mechanics, clerks, shop assistants, female workers, and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or mounting, or be required to leave a carriage under the provisions of this Bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

6. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the Conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Damaging Carriages.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, for the amount of any damage so done.

SMOKING.

8. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette inside any carriage, except in such part thereof as may be specially set apart for the purpose.

SPITTING.

9. No person shall spit in or on, from or against any carriage.

PAYMENT OF FARES.

10. Each passenger shall on demand or before leaving the carriage, pay to the Conductor the fare legally payable for his journey, and accept a ticket therefor.

Any person leaving the carriage shall be deemed to have completed his journey, unless he holds a transfer ticket enabling him to leave the carriage in which he commenced his journey and to continue his journey in another carriage, in which case he shall be deemed to have completed his journey when he leaves the carriage into which he has transferred, and no ticket shall be used a second time for travelling on any carriage.

TICKETS.

- 11. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to the Conductor, or any duly authorised Officer of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.
- 12. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, clerk, shop assistant, female worker or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation, shall not use, or attempt to use, any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, clerks, shop assistants, female workers or daily labourers.

INTERFERENCE WITH THE DUTIES OF THE CONDUCTOR OR DRIVER.

13. No person other than the Conductor or Driver shall change or remove the route Indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord or any part of a carriage or its equipment, or ring any of the signal bells upon any carriage so as to effect the unnecessary stoppage of any carriage nor signal a carriage to start.

OBSTRUCTION.

14. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any tramcar or obstruct or impede any Conductor, Driver or other servant of the Corporation, acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage other than an omnibus.

PARCELS.

15. No passenger shall bring on to any carriage any parcels other than his own personal luggage, and any such personal luggage shall be placed by the passenger in such position on the carriage as shall be directed by the Conductor.

No person shall carry or deposit upon any carriage any luggage which shall cause hindrance or annoyance to passengers.

FULL NUMBER OF PASSENGERS.

16. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the carriage, is provided in the lower deck thereof no person beyond such number shall enter, mount or remain therein, except by the express permission of the Conductor first obtained.

When any carriage contains on the upper deck thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the carriage, is provided on such upper deck no person beyond such number shall enter, mount or remain thereon.

DISABLED CARRIAGES.

17. If at any time a carriage becomes disabled or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the Conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available carriage the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the Conductor, enter a disabled or damaged carriage.

TRAVELLING ON STEP, ETC.

18. No person except a Driver, Conductor or duly authorised officer of the Corporation shall travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers or guards of any carriage or stand either on the platforms or on the upper deck, or sit on the railing, guards, or buffers of any carriage, and any person so travelling, standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or board a carriage, and no person shall hold, or hang on by or to any part of a carriage or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the carriage with the consent of the Conductor.

FIREARMS.

19. No person shall travel in or on any carriage with firearms or dangerous articles or things, provided that nothing contained in this Bye-law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Reserve or Auxiliary Forces, or members of a Rifle Club, carrying unloaded firearms.

Entering and Leaving Carriages.

20. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the step of the hindermost or Conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

This Bye-law shall not apply to carriages provided with an exit at the front and entrance at the back, which the passenger shall enter by the step at the hindermost end or Conductor's Platform, and depart from by the front exit on the near side, and not otherwise, nor shall the first part of this Bye-law apply to a carriage provided with only one entry and exit at the front in which case he shall enter and depart by the front platform.

No person shall board a carriage before any person desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

Entering a Carriage when in Motion.

21. No person shall enter, board or leave or attempt to enter, board or leave any carriage in motion.

Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offence.

22. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any carriage, any breach of these Byelaws and Regulations, shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the carriage by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-laws.

23. Every Conductor and Driver shall, to the best of his ability enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations, and prevent the breach thereof; and if any such Conductor or Driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

PENALTY.

- 24. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings.
- 25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.
- 26. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.
- 27. From and after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, the Bye-laws made by the Corporation on the 3rd day of April, 1907, 13th day of July, 1910, and the 5th day of February, 1914, shall be repealed.

And notice is also given that a true copy of such Bye-laws has this day been laid before the Ministry of Transport and unless such Byelaws or any of them shall be disallowed by the said Ministry within two calendar months from the date hereof the same will come into force on the 1st day of January, 1925.
