The Senate have this day adopted a Resolution for the amendment of No. 108 of the Statutes of the University, as follows:—

[NOTE.—The amendment consists in the addition of the words “ (9) Bachelor of Pharmacy.”]

108. The following degrees may be granted by the University (that is to say):—

- (1) Bachelor and Doctor of Divinity;
- (2) Bachelor and Master of Arts and Doctor of Literature;
- (3) Bachelor and Master and Doctor of Laws;
- (4) Bachelor and Doctor of Music;
- (5) Bachelor and Doctor of Medicine, Bachelor and Master of Surgery, and Bachelor of Dental Surgery;

- (6) Bachelor and Master and Doctor of Science;
- (7) Bachelor and Master of Commerce;
- (8) Doctor of Philosophy;
- (9) Bachelor of Pharmacy.

(2) When imported animals have, under a licence in that behalf, been moved to premises (other than an authorised market or slaughterhouse) whether from an Approved Landing Place, or from an authorised market, the detention period of twenty-eight days shall be substituted for the detention period of six days specified in the Regulations and provisions mentioned in Article 1 of this Order except where the premises to which the animals are moved under the licence are in Scotland.

(3) This provision applies, as from the commencement of this Order, to animals moved before or after such commencement, and the licence in any such case authorising the movement shall have effect as if the period of detention required by the licence were the period of detention required by the Regulations as amended by this Article."

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby subject as hereinafter mentioned, Grant out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent of each of the Benefices whereof the names and the names of the Counties and Dioceses wherein the same are respectively situate are stated in the first three columns of the Schedule hereto, and to his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice, one yearly sum or stipend of the amount stated in the fourth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, such yearly sum or stipend to be calculated as from the date stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, and to be payable in equal quarterly portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each and every year. Provided always that if at any time lands,

tithes or other hereditaments sufficient in our opinion to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the Benefice in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend or for such part thereof our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine. Provided also that such yearly sum or stipend is granted upon and is payable only subject to satisfaction of the conditions (if any) stated with reference thereto at the foot of the said Schedule. Provided lastly that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned), shall only operate as one single Grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.

In witness whereof we have hereunto set our Common Seal this sixteenth day of October in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of the Benefaction which has been duly secured for the permanent spiritual benefit of each of the Parishes and Benefices whereof the names and the names of the Counties and Dioceses wherein the same are respectively situate are stated in the first three columns of the Schedule hereto which Benefaction is described in the fourth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, and in respect of which Benefaction we have undertaken to pay out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent of the Benefice the yearly sum stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice subject to the conditions hereinafter stated in respect to our Grant hereinafter made, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, Section five, grant, subject as hereinafter mentioned, out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice, and to his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice, one yearly sum or stipend of the amount stated in the sixth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, such yearly sum or stipend to be calculated as from the date stated in the seventh column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, and to be payable in four equal portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always that such yearly sum or stipend or any quarterly

portion thereof shall be payable only upon the production to us on or after each of the said last-mentioned quarterly days of payment of a certificate (in such form as may be required by us) under the hand of the Bishop of the Diocese in which the Benefice is situate certifying that, during the quarter then ended, there has been employed within the Parish of the Benefice and duly licensed by such Bishop such number of Assistant Curates as is stated in the eighth column of the said Schedule, and that the last in order of such number of Assistant Curates has been in receipt of a stipend after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum: Provided also that the yearly sum or stipend so granted shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the Parish and Benefice in favour of which it is granted: Provided further that such yearly sum or stipend is granted upon and is payable only subject to satisfaction of the further conditions (if any) stated with reference thereto at the foot of the said Schedule. Provided lastly that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall only operate as one single Grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.

In witness whereof we have hereunto set our Common Seal this sixteenth day of October in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, Grant out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of St. Peter, Bradford, in the County of York and the Diocese of Bradford, one yearly sum or stipend of sixty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable for the period commencing on the seventh day of June in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four and terminating on the first day of November in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, unless at any time before the expiration of the said period the grant of such stipend shall have been cancelled or withdrawn by a resolution of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and to be payable so long as the same shall continue in four equal portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each year. Provided always that such yearly sum or stipend or any

quarterly portion thereof shall be payable only on the production to us on, or after each of the said last-mentioned quarterly days of payment of a certificate (in such form as may be required by us) under the hand of the Bishop of Bradford certifying that, during the quarter then ended, there has been employed within the Parish an Assistant Curate at a stipend after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum. Provided also that such yearly sum or stipend shall be, and be taken to be in lieu of and in full substitution for the grant of one yearly sum or stipend of sixty pounds secured to the District of St. Saviour, Bradford, in the County of York and the Diocese of Bradford, by an Instrument published in the London Gazette on the twenty-eighth day of October in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

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A Notice of Dissolution of Partnership not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it relates.
