The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Declaration of Infected Areas.*

1. The Areas described in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 164) hereinafter referred to as the "Principal" Order.

*Revocation of Certain Orders.*

2. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

*Commencement.*

3. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

*Short Title.*

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 167), and shall be read with the Principal Order.
