

maintenance and removal of pipes or apparatus and agreements.

8. To authorise the Council to raise further moneys on the security of their water undertaking or any rates and revenues of the Council and to exempt from application Section 234 of the Public Health Act, 1875.

9. To make applicable any provisions of the Leek Improvement Act, 1855, the Leek Order, 1920 and any other Act or Order relating to the Council or their water undertaking.

Duplicate plans and sections describing the lines situation and levels of the intended works and plans showing the lands or houses in or through which the works will be made or which may be taken or used compulsorily under the powers of the intended Act together with a book of reference to such plans will on or before the 29th day of November instant be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Stafford at his office at Stafford and on or before the same day a copy of so much of the said plans and sections and book of reference as relates to the several areas hereinafter mentioned will be deposited as follows (that is to say): With the Clerk to the Urban District Council of Leek at his office at the Town Hall, Leek, the Clerk to the Rural District Council of Leek at his office at 6, Russell Street, Leek, the Clerk to the Leekfrith Parish Council at his residence Roches House, Upperhulme, Leek, the Clerk to the Bradnop and Cawdry Parish Council at his residence Apesford, Bradnop, Leek, the Chairman of the Heathleye Parish Meeting at his residence Riddings, Upperhulme, Leek, the Chairman of the Lowe Parish Meeting at his residence, Cow Hay Farm, Lowe, Leek, and the Chairman of the Tittesworth Parish Meeting at his residence Easing, Tittesworth, Leek.

(NOTTINGHAM AND RETFORD RAILWAY.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the London and North Eastern Railway Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") for an Act for the following amongst other purposes:—

1. To empower the Company to make and maintain a new railway from Nottingham to Retford comprising the following works:—

Railway (No. 1) (about 17 miles 4 furlongs 4.20 chains in length) in the parishes of Gedling, Burton Joyce, Lambley and Woodborough in the Rural District of Basford; and Lowdham, Epperstone, Oxton, Farnsfield, Bilsthorpe, Bakring, Rufford, Ollerton and Boughton in the Rural District of Southwell.

Railway (No. 2) (about 9 miles 4 furlongs 9.80 chains in length) in the parishes of Boughton Wellow and Walesby in the Rural District of Southwell; Haughton, Bothamsall (otherwise Bothamsel), Elkesley, Babworth, Gamston and Eaton in the Rural District of East Retford and the Borough of East Retford.

Railway (No. 3) (about 3 furlongs 2.70 chains in length) in the said Parish of Gedling.

Railway (No. 4) (about 7 furlongs 9.50 chains in length) in the said Parish of Ollerton.

Railway (No. 5) (about 1 mile 4 furlongs 2.50 chains in length) in the said Parishes of Ollerton, Boughton and Wellow.

Railway (No. 6) (about 1 mile 1 furlong 6.85 chains in length) in the said Parish of Eaton and in the Borough of East Retford.

Railways (Nos. 7, 8 and 9) (respectively about 6 furlongs .20 chain, 7 furlongs 2.80 chains and 5 furlongs 9 chains in length) all in the Borough of East Retford.

A Widening of the Derbyshire and Staffordshire Railway (about 6 furlongs 3 chains in length) in the said Parish of Gedling.

2. To empower the Company to acquire lands (including common lands) by compulsion or agreement in the said areas and elsewhere and for the purposes of the intended Act to stop up discontinue or divert roads footpaths and level crossings and to extinguish rights of way.

3. To increase the capital and borrowing powers of the Company.
