APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of the Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices".

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for twelve Hackney Carriages at Haverstock Hill and Ornan Road, N.W., in two portions, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz.:—

First portion.—At Haverstock Hill, four Carriages on West side of roadway, commencing at a point 6 yards South of Northern building line of Ornan Mansions, extending Southward, by kerb, as far as necessary for four carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

Second portion.—At Ornan Road, eight Carriages on South side of roadway, commencing at a point 3 yards West of building line at junction with Haverstock Hill, extending Westward, by kerb, as far as necessary for eight carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any Street or Thoroughfare or opposite the end of any Street or Carriageway, or upon any place where Foot Passengers usually cross the Carriageway.

APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES CANCELLED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of the Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices".

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby CANCEL the appointment of the Standing for sixteen Hackney Carriages at Haverstock Hill, Belsize Lane, in two portions, viz.:—

First portion.—Eight Carriages on the West side of Haverstock Hill, commencing at the South-east corner of Belsize Lane, and extending Southward along the kerb to Ornan Road. Horses' heads Northward.

Second portion.—Eight Carriages on the South side of Ornan Road commencing at the junction of Haverstock Hill and extending Westward along the kerb as far as necessary.

DANGEROUS DRUGS.

THE DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS, 1924, DATED NOVEMBER 20, 1924, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 7 OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5, c. 46), FOR CONTROLLING THE MANUFACTURE, SALE, POSSESSION, AND DISTRIBUTION OF DANGEROUS DRUGS.

In pursuance of section 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5, c. 46), I hereby make the following Regulations amending the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1921 (S.R. & O. 1921, No. 865), hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1923 (S.R. & O. 1923, No. 312):—

1. Regulation 6 of the Principal Regulations shall be amended and shall take effect as if in lieu of the words added to that Regulation by Regulation 3 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1923, the following words were inserted at the end of paragraph (a):—

If an official form is not prescribed, a prescription for any of the drugs shall only be dispensed if either (i) the person dispensing the prescription is acquainted with the signature of the medical practitioner, registered dentist or registered veterinary surgeon by whom the prescription purports to be given and has no reason to suppose that the prescription is not genuine; or (ii) the prescription is on the form provided for National

Health Insurance purposes by the Insurance Committee and the person dispensing the prescription has no reason to suppose that the prescription is not genuine; or (iii) the person dispensing the prescription has taken reasonably sufficient steps to satisfy himself that the prescription is genuine.

2. The following Regulation shall be inserted in the Principal Regulations after Regulation 18:—

Diversion of drugs in transit.

19. If any consignment of the drugs to some destination outside the United Kingdom is brought into any port of the United Kingdom, no person shall, without the licence of the Secretary of State, divert, or cause or procure to be diverted, such consignment to any destination other than the destination to which it was originally consigned. The destination to which the consignment was originally consigned shall be deemed to be the destination stated in the licence, permit or other authority for the export of the consignment granted by the Government of the country of export.

3.—(a) The present Regulation 19 (*Commencement*) of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked; and

(b) Regulation 3 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1923, is hereby revoked, provided that any proceedings or other matter instituted under it shall not be invalidated and may be continued as though it had not been revoked.

4. These Regulations may be referred to as the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1924.

DANGEROUS DRUGS.

THE RAW OPIUM REGULATIONS, 1924, DATED NOVEMBER 20, 1924, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5. c. 46), FOR CONTROLLING THE MANUFACTURE, SALE, POSSESSION AND DISTRIBUTION OF RAW OPIUM.

In pursuance of Section 3 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5. c. 46), I hereby make the following Regulations amending the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921 (S.R. & O. 1921, No. 864), hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations:—

1. The following Regulation shall be inserted in the Principal Regulations after Regulation 9:—

Diversion of Raw Opium in Transit.

10. If any consignment of raw opium to some destination outside the United Kingdom is brought into any port of the United Kingdom, no person shall, without the licence of the Secretary of State, divert, or cause or procure to be diverted, such consignment to any destination other than the destination to which it was originally consigned. The destination to which the con-

signment was originally consigned shall be deemed to be the destination stated in the licence, permit or other authority for the export of the consignment granted by the Government of the country of export.

2. The present Regulation 10 (*Commencement*) of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked.

3. These Regulations may be referred to as the Raw Opium Regulations, 1924.

BUTTON MAKING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY THE GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE WORKERS UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE IN THE ERINOID BUTTON SECTION OF THE TRADE.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, respectively, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, in Great Britain for the branches of trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Button Making) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates at present effective and set out in the Trade Board's Notice V. (12), dated 3rd January, 1924, in their application to MALE WORKERS under 21 years of age in the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade, the Minimum Rates as proposed being as shown in the Schedule below.

SCHEDULE.

MALE WORKERS UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE employed in the ERINOID BUTTON SECTION of the TRADE.

PART I.

PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES.

SECTION I.

Male Learners (as defined in, and whose employment complies with the conditions set out in, Part III of this Schedule) employed in the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade :

- (a) Learners of 18 and under 21 years of age employed in Stamping, Burnishing, Spinning (including Setting), Dipping, Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes) :—

Male Workers under 21 years of age employed in the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade other than Male Learners included in Section I above.

PART II.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime Rates calculated on the minimum rates of wages specified in Part I of this Schedule in the manner set out in Part III of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice V. (12) dated 3rd January, 1924, shall apply in substitution for the rates set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all time worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Part III of the Schedule to the above mentioned Notice V. (12) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

PROPOSED DEFINITION OF MALE LEARNER.

For the purpose of this Notice a Male Learner in the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade is a worker under 21 years of age who:—

- (1) Whilst employed is provided by his employer with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade as carried on by the employer in such a manner as to offer a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate appropriate for male workers of 21 years of age or over.
- (2) Is employed under conditions where the employment of learners is limited as follows:—
As respects the period from—

- (3) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board or has made application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that

- (i) The certification or registration of a Male Learner may be cancelled if any of the other conditions referred to above are not complied with.
- (ii) An employer may employ a worker at the rates and under the conditions specified in this Schedule for Male Learners in the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade without certification or registration for a probationary period not exceeding one month.

PART IV.

PROPOSED DEFINITION OF THE ERINOID BUTTON SECTION OF THE TRADE.

For the purpose of this Notice the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade is that branch of the trade specified in Part V of this Notice which is concerned with the manufacture (including the other specified operations) of articles from Erinoid or similar caseine products.

PART V.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

The above proposed minimum rates shall apply to all Male Workers under 21 years of age employed in Great Britain in the Erinoid Button Section of those branches of the Button Making Trade specified in the Trade Board (Button Making) Order, 1919, which are also included by the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Button Making) Order, 1924.

NOTE.—The Piece Work Basis Time Rate for Male Workers employed in Stamping, Burnishing, Spinning (including Setting), Dipping, Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes), in its application to Workers in the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade, is unaffected by the above Proposal to Vary.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 25th day of November, 1924. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, The Button Making Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

THAMES CONSERVANCY.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Conservators of the River Thames propose to make the following Bye-laws for the more effectually preventing contraventions of the provisions of the Thames Conservancy Acts, 1894 to 1924, prohibiting the user of house-

boats and other pleasure boats (not being launches) unless certificated, for appointing tolls for ferries, and for other purposes.

BYE-LAWS

For the more effectually preventing contraventions of the provisions of the Thames Conservancy Acts, 1894 to 1924, prohibiting the user of houseboats and other pleasure boats (not being launches) unless certificated, for appointing tolls for ferries, and for other purposes made by the Conservators of the River Thames in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the said Thames Conservancy Acts, 1894 to 1924, and of every other power and authority them hereunto enabling.

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The Thames Conservancy (Registration) Bye-laws 192" and shall come into operation the day after the same are confirmed by the Minister of Transport.

2. The Thames Conservancy (Registration) Bye-laws, 1922, are hereby repealed.

3. These Bye-laws shall be applicable to:—

(A) so much of the River Thames and Isis as is between the east side of the Town Bridge at Cricklade in the County of Wilts and an imaginary straight line drawn from high-water mark on the bank of the River Thames at the boundary line between the parishes of Teddington and Twickenham in the County of Middlesex to high water mark on the Surrey bank of the River immediately opposite the last hereinbefore mentioned point; and

(B) so much of the River Kennet as is between the River Thames and an imaginary straight line drawn from a point on the north bank of the River Kennet seventy yards eastward of the east side of the High Bridge at Reading in the County of Berks to a point on the south bank of the River Kennet immediately opposite the last hereinbefore mentioned point;

and all locks cuts and works within the said portions of rivers. Provided that no dock lock canal or cut existing at the passing of the Act of 1894 and constructed under the authority of Parliament and belonging to any body corporate established under such authority and no bridge over the Thames or the River Kennet belonging to or vested in any county council municipal authority railway company or any company body or person other than the Conservators shall be deemed to form part of the Thames.

4. In these Bye-laws the following words and expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively unless there is something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction, viz.:—

"The Thames" or "the River" means and includes those parts of the River Thames and Isis and Kennet respectively to which these Bye-laws are made applicable by the provisions of Bye-law 3.

"The Acts of 1894 to 1924" mean the Thames Conservancy Acts, 1894 to 1924.

"Pleasure boat" includes any boat randan wherry skiff dinghy shallop punt canoe or yacht however navigated not being

a vessel used by any person following the business of a fisherman on the Thames and in respect of which vessel the requirements of the Thames Fishery Bye-laws 1914 are for the time being fulfilled and not being a launch or a house-boat and not being used solely as a tug or for the carriage of goods and, not being certified by the Board of Trade as a passenger steamer to carry two hundred or more passengers.

"Pleasure boat for hire" means any pleasure boat let for hire or used or intended to be used for any purpose of profit.

"Private pleasure boat" means any pleasure boat other than a pleasure boat for hire.

"Houseboat Certificate" means a certificate of registration of a houseboat pursuant to the Acts of 1894 to 1924 and includes any renewal of such certificate.

"Boat Certificate" means a certificate of registration of a private pleasure boat or of a pleasure boat for hire as the case may be pursuant to the Acts of 1894 to 1924 and includes any renewal of such certificate.

Except as hereinbefore otherwise provided words and expressions to which a special meaning is assigned by the Acts of 1894 to 1924 have respectively the same meaning in these Bye-laws as they have in the said Acts.

5.—(1) No person shall use on the Thames or hire or let for hire for use on the Thames any houseboat unless a houseboat certificate relating thereto be then in force.

(2) Every person applying to the Conservators for the registration of a houseboat or for the renewal of a houseboat certificate in respect thereof shall deliver to the Conservators in writing on the appropriate form mentioned in the Schedule hereto the particulars therein prescribed concerning such houseboat and shall afford to the Conservators all reasonable facilities for satisfying themselves as to the accuracy of the particulars aforesaid.

(3) The Conservators may decline to register two or more houseboats in the same name and may decline to register any houseboat in a name which is likely to deceive and in case of any dispute as to which houseboat shall bear the name the houseboat which has longest borne the name shall be the houseboat to be registered in such name and registration of the other houseboat shall be deferred until the owner thereof shall have furnished a name for it which can be properly registered.

(4) Every houseboat in respect of which there is a houseboat certificate in force shall have legibly and conspicuously painted upon each side thereof either the registered number or the registered name thereof.

(5) No person shall knowingly conceal or cover the registered name or number painted on a houseboat on the Thames.

(6) No person shall display upon or about any houseboat on the Thames any number except in accordance with the provisions of these Bye-laws.

6.—(1) No person shall use on the Thames or hire or let for hire for use on the Thames any pleasure boat unless a boat certificate relating thereto be then in force.

(2) Every person applying to the Conservators for the registration of a private pleasure boat or of a pleasure boat for hire or for re-

newal of a boat certificate in respect of any such pleasure boat shall deliver to the Conservators in writing on the appropriate form mentioned in the Schedule hereto the particulars therein prescribed concerning such pleasure boat.

(3) The Conservators may provide the owner of a pleasure boat in respect of which a boat certificate is in force with a plate (hereinafter in these Bye-laws referred to as a registration plate) bearing such particulars for the more effectually identifying the pleasure boat as the Conservators may think fit.

(4) Every registration plate shall be and remain the property of the Conservators and shall on demand by the Conservators be returned to them within three months after the expiration of the boat certificate to which the registration plate relates unless the certificate shall in the meantime have been renewed.

(5) Every registration plate shall be placed and kept in upon or about the pleasure boat to which the plate refers in a conspicuous position and if outside the boat above the water line and shall be maintained in a clean and plainly distinguishable condition and to the satisfaction of the Conservators or their officers.

(6) No person shall use on the Thames or hire or let for hire for use on the Thames any pleasure boat without there being affixed thereto a registration plate relating to a boat certificate then in force respecting such pleasure boat.

(7) No person shall knowingly conceal or cover a registration plate affixed to any pleasure boat or affix any registration plate in or upon any other pleasure boat than that in relation to which the plate is provided.

7.—(1) For the purposes of registration under the Acts of 1894 to 1924 the Conservators may classify and keep a separate list of skiffs punts and canoes owned by any rowing club punting club or canoe club or by the members of such club and of sailing boats owned by any sailing club or by the members of such club.

(2) The Conservators in their absolute discretion may refuse to classify as aforesaid the boats of any club or of the members thereof or they may cancel any such classification.

(3) Where the pleasure boats of any club or of the members thereof are classified as aforesaid the Conservators may keep a record in the case of a rowing club punting club or canoe club of the approved colours of the club and in the case of a sailing club of the approved burgee or ensign of the club. And upon being requested so to do the Conservators may assign to any such pleasure boat as aforesaid in respect of which a boat certificate is in force the said colours burgee or ensign as the case may be as a crest badge or mark in addition to the number assigned to the boat pursuant to the Acts of 1894 to 1924. And may provide the owner thereof with a special registration plate (in lieu of the registration plate mentioned in Bye-law 6 hereof) bearing the colours burgee or ensign of the club as the case may be and such other particulars as the Conservators may think fit on payment to them of a reasonable sum (not exceeding 2s. 6d.) in respect of such plate in addition to the sum payable for the registration of such boat and thereupon the provisions

of Bye-law 6 hereof relating to the placing keeping and affixing of registration plates shall apply to such special registration plate in like manner in all respects as if it were a registration plate provided under the provisions of the said last-mentioned Bye-law.

(4) If and whenever any private pleasure boat for the time being classified as aforesaid shall cease to belong to the club in respect of which the boat is classified or to any member of such club there shall for all purposes of the Acts of 1894 to 1924 be deemed to be an alteration in the class of such pleasure boat.

8. The Conservators may on application made to them in that behalf furnish to the registered owner of a houseboat or pleasure boat a duplicate houseboat certificate or boat certificate as the case may be or a duplicate registration plate in the place of a lost certificate or registration plate on his giving to the Conservators such indemnity in writing in that behalf as they may deem necessary and on his paying to them a reasonable sum (not exceeding 2s. 6d.) in respect of each duplicate certificate or plate.

9.—(1) The Conservators in their absolute discretion and with a view to the encouragement and promotion of boat-racing on the Thames may by licence in writing under the hand of the Secretary exempt from the provisions of the Acts of 1894 to 1924 and of these Bye-laws respecting the registration and marking of pleasure boats such number as they think fit of the pleasure boats owned or hired by any club and used on the Thames for the purpose of racing and every such exemption may be for such period and subject to such conditions as the Conservators think fit and the Conservators may at any time if they think fit to do so cancel any such licence.

(2) The members of any club applying to the Conservators for their licence under this Bye-law shall do so in writing signed by the secretary of the club or other authorized person and shall furnish to the Conservators at their request all such information as they may require in relation to such application.

(3) The master of every pleasure boat in respect of which the Conservators shall have granted an exemption licence under the provisions of this Bye-law shall obey and conform to the conditions of such licence. And every person who shall contravene or fail to obey and conform to any of such conditions shall be deemed to have committed an offence against these Bye-laws.

10. There shall be paid to the ferryman or other authorized persons for every time of passing across the Thames by a ferry boat belonging to the Conservators the following sums namely:—

For every person	...	1d.
For every bicycle or tricycle (in addition to the toll on the person accompanying the same)	...	1d.
For every horse not engaged in towing	...	3d.
For every carriage wagon cart or other similar vehicle (in addition to the toll on the horse and on the occupants of the vehicle)	...	3d.
For every motor-bicycle or motor-tricycle (in addition to the toll on the person or persons accompanying the same)	...	3d.
For every motor-car (in addition to the toll on the occupants thereof)	...	6d.

11. No person shall elude or evade or attempt to elude or evade the payment of any toll for the time being payable for the passage across the Thames by a ferry boat belonging to the Conservators or for the passage of any vessel by through or over any lock on the Thames.

12. The master of every launch in respect of which the Conservators shall have issued a licence for a *bona fide* trial trip pursuant to the Acts of 1894 to 1924 shall obey and conform to the conditions of such licence. And every person who shall contravene or fail to obey and conform to any of such conditions shall be deemed to have committed an offence against these Bye-laws.

13.—(1) Any person contravening the provisions of these Bye-laws shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty not exceeding the like amount which said penalties shall be recoverable enforced and applied according to the provisions of the Acts of 1894 to 1924.

(2) When any offence against the provisions of these Bye-laws is committed in respect of any vessel the person in charge and the owner of the vessel shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished. Provided that the person in charge and the owner of the vessel be not both punished in respect of the same offence.

In the urban district of Bridgend:—

Lines of pipes.

2. To enable the Board to acquire lands and easements by compulsion and agreement and to modify the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts in their application to the Board

3. To empower the Board to maintain and use the intakes lines of pipes and tank which they have already constructed in the Fairy Glen in the parish of Llangeinor in the urban district of Ogmore and Garw for the purpose of impounding some of the springs found on enclosure numbered 237 on the ²⁵⁰⁰ Ordnance Map Glamorgan Sheet XXVI-12 (1918 Edition) of that parish and to impound and take those waters and supply the same within their area of supply and to confirm the construction of those works and the taking of the waters which the Board have already effected thereby.

4. To empower the Board to stop up and extinguish all rights of way over and to appropriate the site and soil of any footpaths situate upon any lands acquired by the Board under the powers of the Bill and to make new footpaths in the parishes of St. Bride's Major and Merthyr Mawr aforesaid.

5. To confer further powers on the Board with reference to their undertaking and the management thereof and amongst other things to provide that the Board may have enjoy and exercise all or some of the powers rights and authorities of a rural sanitary authority under the Public Health Acts and in particular to enable the Board to provide erect and place stand-pipes in public roads and elsewhere in rural districts within their area of supply and recover rates and charges from the owners or occupiers of premises within such distance therefrom as may be prescribed by the Bill in the same manner as if the supply had been given on the premises.

6. To provide that any department highway local or other authority or any combination of all or some of such bodies who may make or maintain any road across along over or in any gathering ground the waters flowing or percolating from which the Board are already or will by the Bill be authorised to take for the purpose of supply shall fence off such road or work and construct works and take steps to secure the free uninterrupted flow of such waters and to prevent or prevent the risk of the pollution fouling or contamination thereof and to make such other and better provision for protecting the waters and water supplies of the Board as may be prescribed by the Bill.

7. To extend the period limited by the Mid Glamorgan Water Act 1920 for the completion of the Works numbered 43, 44, 45, 49, 50 and 51 described in section 27 of that Act.

8. To empower the Board to borrow money for the purposes of the Bill and working

capital, to lend money to and borrow from its constituent authorities, to extend section 77 (Alternative application of sinking fund) of the Mid Glamorgan Water Act 1920 to any redemption fund of the Board established under the Stock Regulations 1891 to 1921 and other financial provisions.

9. To provide for the appointment of the members of the Board by each of the constituent authorities at a meeting to be held in the month of April in each year instead of at their respective annual meetings and to provide that section 57 (Notice to be given of contracts to the amount of £100 and upwards) of the Commissioners Clauses Act 1847 shall cease to apply to the Board.

10. To exclude from the jurisdiction of the River Thaw Drainage Board any works which may be constructed by the Board under the powers of the intended Act within that jurisdiction and to provide that that Drainage Board shall have no jurisdiction over those works and to amend or partially repeal the River Thaw Drainage Order 1923 accordingly.

11. To exclude from the jurisdiction of the Ogmore and Ewenny Board of Conservators the portions of the River Ewenny and of the tail race of the water power pumping station of the Board in the parish of St. Bride's Major aforesaid and some of the works to be authorised by the said intended Act and to confer upon those Conservators in respect of other of those works when constructed and the waters therein the same rights powers and privileges as they now have in respect of the said portions of the river and tail race or such other rights powers and privileges as may be prescribed by the Bill.

12. To incorporate repeal apply and amend Acts and Orders and to enact all such provisions as may be incidental to or consequent upon the objects of the Bill; and to vary and extinguish all powers rights authorities and privileges inconsistent therewith, and to confer others.

2. To empower the Board to purchase and acquire by compulsion or agreement for the protection of the existing and proposed waterworks of the Board against risk of pollution and for other the purposes of their undertaking certain lands in the townships of Easington, Gisburn Forest, Bowland Forest (High) and Slaidburn in the West Riding of the County of York.

3. To make provision for preventing and with regard to the waste and misuse and to provide against contamination of water supplied by the Company and as to fittings to be used for the purpose of such supply and to enable the Company to make bye-laws and to impose thereby penalties in reference to such matters and to enter premises and remove meters and fittings in certain cases.

7. To authorise the Company to establish a fund to be called the Renewal Fund by contributions thereto out of the revenue of the

13. The intended Order will or may incorporate with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts and the Waterworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863.
