

PART III.

PROPOSED DEFINITION OF MALE LEARNER.

For the purpose of this Notice a Male Learner in the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade is a worker under 21 years of age who:—

(1) Whilst employed is provided by his employer with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade as carried on by the employer in such a manner as to offer a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate appropriate for male workers of 21 years of age or over.

(2) Is employed under conditions where the employment of learners is limited as follows:—
As respects the period from—

1st July, 1925 to 30th June, 1926.	Not more than 5	Male learners	} To each Male worker of 21 years of age or over employed in the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade.
" 1926 " " 1927.	" " 4	" "	
" 1927 " " 1928.	" " 3	" "	
" 1928 and thereafter	" " 2	" "	

(3) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board or has made application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that

(i) The certification or registration of a Male Learner may be cancelled if any of the other conditions referred to above are not complied with.

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the rates and under the conditions specified in this Schedule for Male Learners in the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade without certification or registration for a probationary period not exceeding one month.

PART IV.

PROPOSED DEFINITION OF THE ERINOID BUTTON SECTION OF THE TRADE.

For the purpose of this Notice the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade is that branch of the trade specified in Part V of this Notice which is concerned with the manufacture (including the other specified operations) of articles from Erinoid or similar caseine products.

PART V.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

The above proposed minimum rates shall apply to all Male Workers under 21 years of age employed in Great Britain in the Erinoid Button Section of those branches of the Button Making Trade specified in the Trade Board (Button Making) Order, 1919, which are also included by the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Button Making) Order, 1924.

NOTE.—The Piece Work Basis Time Rate for Male Workers employed in Stamping, Burnishing, Spinning (including Setting), Dipping, Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes), in its application to Workers in the Erinoid Button Section of the Trade, is unaffected by the above Proposal to Vary.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 25th day of November, 1924. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, The Button Making Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
