#### PENRITH.

Whereas the Urban District Council of Penrith have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Penrith Urban District Council Act, 1907, so as:—

(1) To increase the maximum rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes to two shillings and sixpence in the pound on the rateable value of the premises supplied;

(2) To increase the maximum price for the supply of water by measure to two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons;

(3) To empower the Council to charge additional sums not exceeding thirty shillings per annum in respect of the use of water for washing horses, carriages or motor cars or for other purposes in stables or premises where horses, carriages or motor cars are kept;

(4) To empower the Council to sell meters and to supply fittings; to make provision for the exemption of fittings etc., belonging to the Council from distress and from the landlord's remedy for rent; to enable the Council to open the ground for the maintenance of pipes and apparatus and to repair communication pipes; and to make provision in regard to contributions towards the expenses incurred by the Council in the maintenance and repair of common pipes;

(5) To provide that the rate of accumulation of the annual contributions to any Sinking Fund of the Council in connection with their water undertaking shall be such rate as the Minister of Health may from time to time approve;

(6) To empower the Council to borrow for the purpose of paying off moneys previously borrowed by them or for the purpose of replacing moneys which have been temporarily applied from other funds in repaying moneys borrowed by them; and

(7) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said Urban District as may be necessary or desirable;

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application and that such Provisional Order should if thought fit include a power to the Minister of Health to vary from time to

time the maximum charges for water proposed as aforesaid.

Notice is hereby given that E. H. #### COLWYN BAY AND COLWYN.

Whereas the Urban District Council of Colwyn Bay and Colwyn have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Colwyn Bay and Colwyn Urban District Council Act, 1902, and the Colwyn Bay and Colwyn Order, 1911, which was confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 8) Act, 1911, so as:—

(1) To enable the Council to borrow the sum of £3,317 for the purpose of works connected with the promenades and sea-walls authorised by the said Local Act of 1902, viz.: the extension or construction of certain slipways or similar works, and with the sanction of the Minister of Health to borrow such further sums as may from time to time be required for any of the purposes of the said Local Act;

(2) To provide that the Council may under section 6 of the said Local Act construct jetties in connection with the works authorised by that section; and

(3) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said Urban District as may be necessary or desirable;
