

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 25TH NOVEMBER, 1924.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED
AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 170).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Infected Areas.

1. The Areas described in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 164), hereinafter referred to as the "Principal" Order.

Revocation of Certain Orders.

2. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 170), and shall be read with the Principal Order.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Infected Areas.

1. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Derby.

The county borough of Derby.

The petty sessional divisions of Alfreton, Belper, Ilkeston, Derby (*except the parish of Brailsford*), Repton and Swadlincote, and the parishes of Sutton-on-the-Hill, Hatton, Hoon, Marston-on-Dove, Hilton, Wirksworth, Cromford, Matlock Bath, Matlock, Tansley and Dethick Lea and Holloway.

In the county of Leicester.

Such portion of the petty sessional division of Market Bosworth as lies to the west of the railway from Nuneaton to Coalville, and the parishes of Chilcote, Stretton en le Field, Appleby Magna, Snarestone, Swebstone, Heather, Normanton le Heath, Packington, Measham, Oakthorpe and Donisthorpe, Willesley, Ashby Woulds, Blackfordby and Ashby de la Zouch.

In the county of Stafford.

The county boroughs of Burton-upon-Trent and Walsall;

The boroughs of Lichfield and Tamworth;

The petty sessional divisions of Burton-upon-Trent (including its detached part), Rugeley (including its detached part), Lichfield and Brownhills, Tamworth and Rushall and the parishes of Draycott in the Clay, Newborough, Abbotts Bromley, Blithfield, Cannock, Norton Canes, Great Wirley, Chesslynhay, Saredon, Sharehills, Featherstone, Hilton, Essington, Short Heath and Bentley, and the detached parts of the parishes of Marchington Woodlands and Marchington which adjoin the parish of Newborough.

In the county of Warwick.

The borough of Sutton Coldfield.

The petty sessional divisions of Wilnecote, Atherstone and Coleshill (*except the parishes of Fillongley, Meriden, Great Packington, Little Packington and Bickenhill*).

2. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Kent.

The city of Rochester.

The boroughs of Chatham, Gillingham, Maidstone, Gravesend and Queenborough.

The petty sessional divisions of Sittingbourne (including its detached part), North Aylesford, Dartford (*except the parishes of Erith, Crayford and Bexley*), Malling, Bearsted and Faversham (*except the parishes of Graveney, Hernhill, Dunkirk, Boughton-under-Blean, North Preston Without, South Preston Without, Selling, Badlesmere, Leaveland, Sheldwich, Godnestone and Faversham Without, and any detached parts of such parishes*) but not excluding the detached part of the parish of Faversham Without which adjoins the parish of Luddenham, and the parishes of Shoreham, Otford, Kemsing (including its detached part), Seal, Shipbourne, Hildenborough, Hadlow, Tonbridge Urban, Capel, Brenchley, Horsmonden, Marden, Staplehurst, Frittenden, Smarden, Egerton, Little Chart (including its detached part), Pluckley and Charing.
