TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 12th December, 1924, at 1 o'clock, for:—

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, The National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £45,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £4,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 15th December, 1924, to Saturday, the 20th December, 1924, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the notice of 30th September, 1924, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 15th December, 1924, to Saturday, the 20th December, 1924, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th April, 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of One shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

The Minimum Rates in this Section of the Trade became EFFECTIVE AS FROM 1ST JANUARY, 1924 (except those applicable to Heavy Hand Press Workers or Stampers of all ages and to Blackers of 18 years of age and over, which became effective as from 1st July, 1924).

CEREMENT MAKING SECTION OF THE TRADE.

Piece-rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker at least the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, or where no Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has been fixed the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable, with the addition in either case of one-fifth of the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable as set out above.

SECTION III.

Overtime Rates for time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, so far as it is lawful under the Factory and Workshop Acts and any other legislation governing employment for the worker to work on such days :—

- (1) Time-Workers :
 - (a) Sundays :
Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.
 - (b) Customary Public and Statutory Holidays :
One-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

(2) Piece-Workers : PART III—*continued*.

(a) Sundays :

Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an *ordinary worker* at least the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, or where no Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has been fixed the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable, *with the addition* in either case of the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable as set out above.

(b) Customary Public and Statutory Holidays :

Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an *ordinary worker* at least the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, or where no Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has been fixed the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable, *with the addition* in either case of one-half of the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable as set out above.

SECTION IV.

The Overtime Rates are payable in respect of all time worked in excess of 5 hours on a Saturday and in respect of all time worked in excess of 9 hours on any other day (not being a Sunday or Customary Public or Statutory Holiday), notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 47.

PART IV.

CEREMENT MAKING SECTION OF THE TRADE.
COST OF LIVING CLAUSES.

SECTION I.

Each "Cost of Living" period referred to in Columns I. and II. of Section VI. of Part I. of this Schedule is a period from the first day of the month following the publication in the "Ministry of Labour Gazette" of a "Cost of Living" Figure (as defined in Section II. below) within the range specified in the appropriate column, until the first day of the month following the publication of a figure within the range specified in the other column.

Provided that, in cases where the first day of the month does not coincide with the beginning of the weekly pay period, the "Cost of Living" period shall begin or end (as the case may be) at the beginning of the next following weekly pay period.

SECTION II.

The "Cost of Living" Figure specified in this Schedule is the average percentage increase since July, 1914, in retail prices (all items) in the United Kingdom, as published each month in the "Ministry of Labour Gazette."

SECTION III.

The minimum rates set out or referred to in Sections VI., VII. and VIII. of Part I. of this Schedule shall be operative only during the several periods specified or until such time as the cancellation or variation thereof may become effective.

SECTION IV.

The minimum rates payable on the date specified by the Minister of Labour as the date from which the minimum rates shall become effective, viz., 5th December 1924, are the General Minimum Time-Rates payable in accordance with Sections VI. (Column I.), VII. and VIII. of Part I. of this Schedule, and the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates as specified in Part II. and III. respectively of this Schedule.

PART V.

Applicability of Rates.

The respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Parts I., II. and III. of this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all female workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Coffin Furniture and Cerement-Making) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

Description of Trade to which Trade Boards Acts apply.

- (a) The manufacture, wherever carried on, of Coffin Furniture from any metal by any process.
- (b) The manufacture of Cerements, including shrouds, face curtains, face cloths, sidecloths, winding sheets, pillow covers, coffin pads, sleeves or frilling.

Including—

- (c) The operations of folding, packing, warehousing, despatching or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

NOTE.—The employment of women, young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts; the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920; the Education Acts, and the Shop Acts.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—Rates to be paid clear of deductions.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—Rates without prejudice to workers earning higher rates.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between Employers and Workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of Orders of the Minister of Labour confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied by the Trade Board and set out out above, and specifying the dates provided in this Notice as the dates from which the rates become effective.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR SITUATIONS IN THE JUNIOR GRADE OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE CLASS.

Competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 22 and must not have attained the age of 24 on the first day of August in the year in which the Examination is held.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served for two full consecutive years in the Royal Irish Constabulary may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

(c) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of Candidates who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

3. No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

4. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

No Candidate may offer in Sections A and C together two languages of the group Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, or two of the group Norwegian, Swedish, Danish.

Only a Candidate who takes two modern languages in Section B may offer Latin or Ancient Greek as an auxiliary language.

8. In subjects 50 to 65 the civilization subject associated with a language can only be taken by Candidates who offer the language itself for examination in Section B.

9. A Candidate desiring to offer any of the subjects 30 to 42 or subject 47 must produce evidence satisfactory to the Commissioners of laboratory training in an institution of university rank. For Astronomy (28), Geography (43), Physical Anthropology (44), and Agriculture (46), other equivalent training will be required. There will be no laboratory test as part of the examination.

10. From the marks assigned to Candidates in each subject such deduction will be made as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary in order to secure that no credit be allowed for merely superficial knowledge.

11. Moreover, Candidates whose handwriting is not easily legible will suffer a further deduction of marks on that account.

12. Application for permission to attend one of these Examinations must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

13. A fee of £8 will be required from every Candidate attending an examination.

14. Out of the list resulting from each Examination will be filled (provided there be Candidates duly qualified):—

(a) All the vacancies in the Junior Grade of the Administrative Class which may have been reported to the Civil Service Commissioners up to the date of the announcement of the result of the Examination;

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.
