#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 24th day of November, 1924 (C.W. 9308/24), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to

such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Section VIII of Schedule V of Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, Your Majesty was graciously pleased, inter alia, to provide that Paymaster Lieutenant-Commanders of Your Majesty's Fleet shall be compulsorily retired on reaching the age of 45 years:

"And whereas Paymaster Lieutenant-Commander Oswy Lonsdale Parsons, who was reinstated on the Active List of Your Majesty's Navy after a period of absence from the Naval Service and whose seniority was consequently reduced in respect of such absence, will become due for retirement in his present rank on account of age on the 21st day of June, 1925:

"And whereas we desire to exempt the said Oswy Lonsdale Parsons from the operation of the above regulation and to retain him on the

Active List beyond the age of 45:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following arrangements, namely:—

"(1) The Admiralty to have discretionary power to retain Paymaster Lieutenant-Commander Oswy Lonsdale Parsons, on the Active List beyond the age of 45, until he attains the necessary seniority to qualify him for promotion to the rank of Paymaster Commander.

" (2) If promoted to the rank of Paymaster Commander, the Officer to be subject to the regulations applicable to that rank, his retired pay being assessed on the appropriate scale for such rank, subject to the proviso that whether such retirement takes place at the age of 50 years or earlier, the deduction to be made in respect of each full year wanting to complete the period of service prescribed in the scale, according to age at the date of retirement, shall not be limited to five years; provided always that the rate of retired pay awarded on this basis shall not be less than the amount for which the Officer would have been eligible had he been retired in the rank of Paymaster Lieutenant-Commander at the age of 45. "The

Commissioners Lords of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in these proposals.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of November, 1924 (N. 3860/24), in the words following,

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service provide that a man holding an acting rating is to receive the lowest scale of pay of that rating, and further that, in certain cases, when an acting rating is confirmed, his confirmation in rating may be antedated, with the result that in some instances he then becomes entitled to payment of progressive pay in respect of a period during which he has actually served in an acting rating:

" And whereas we consider it desirable to dispense with the necessity for antedating con-

firmation in rating:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to direct that, subject to such exceptions as may from time to time be provided for by the Regulations of Your Majesty's Naval Service, payment of progressive pay may be made in respect of a period during which an acting rating has been held, provided that such payment shall not be made until the man has been confirmed in his rating, when payment of progressive pay shall be made

as from the date of qualification.
"The Lords Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in His Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman, or marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas by sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Ministry of Pensions Act, 1916, as amended by section 1 of the War Pensions Act, 1920, it is enacted that there shall be transferred to the Minister of Pensions (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") certain powers and duties of the Admiralty with respect to pensions and grants to persons who have served as officers or men:

And whereas provision was made in His Majesty's Order in Council of 11th June, 1920, and by Regulations thereto annexed (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations of 1920") for pensions to certain seamen and marines disabled in consequence of the Great War (hereinafter referred to as "the war"):

And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty by the Minister that it is desirable to make further provision concerning the pensions of certain classes of such seamen and marines:

And whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have signified their

concurrence in these proposals:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said proposals into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof, and hereby sanctions the Regulations hereto annexed.

REGULATIONS FOR PENSIONS CLASSES OF BRITISH SEAMEN AND MARINES.

1. A seaman or marine who was discharged as medically unfit for further service on the recommendation of a Board of Medical Officers during the War, or, if after the 30th day of

September, 1921, in consequence of disability attributable to or aggravated by service therein, may be granted an allowance in respect of his service as set forth in the following Articles:

provided that he,

(a) if a continuous service man of the Royal Navy, was discharged as aforesaid with a total service of not less than 10 years on the continuous and general service system, and was in the opinion of the Minister prevented by such discharge from completing time for Long Service Pension;

(b) if a non-continuous service man of the Royal Navy, or if a Royal Marine, was discharged as aforesaid with a total service of not less than 14 years, and was in the opinion of the Minister prevented by such discharge from completing time for Long Service Pension.

2.—(1) A seaman or marine who fulfils the conditions set forth in the preceding Article, and who is eligible for a pension under Article 1 (1) of the Regulations of 1920, may be granted such pension, together with a service allowance calculated at the following rates:-

#### Allowance.Service.

10 years or over (continuous service men of the Royal Navy only) 0 a week. 14 years or over 8 0 ,, 16 years 9 0 ,, 18 years 20 years 10 0 ,, 11 0 • • •

(2) An allowance granted to a seaman or marine under this Article shall be in lieu of any service pension which might have been granted to him under the Order in Council of 8th May, 1919, with respect to service pensions, and, subject to Article 6 hereof, in lieu of any addition under Article 1 (4) of the Regulations of 1920.

3. The allowances set forth in the preceding Article shall be payable during the continuance of the pension under Article  $\bar{1}$  (1) of the Regulations of 1920. When pensionable disablement ceases the seaman or marine may be granted a service allowance under Article 5

of these Regulations.

A seaman or marine who fulfils the conditions of Article 1 hereof, and who is eligible for a gratuity or allowance under Article 1 (3) of the Regulations of 1920, may be granted the gratuity or allowance for which he is eligible under that Article, together with a service allowance under the following Article.

5. A seaman or marine who fulfils the conditions of Article 1 hereof, and who is eligible for a gratuity or allowance under Article 7 (1) of the Regulations of 1920, may be granted, in lieu of such gratuity or allowance and in lieu of any pension which might have been granted to him under the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, a service allowance calculated at the following rates:-

- There may be added to the service allowance specified in the foregoing Articles, additions for good conduct badges and medal at the rates and under the conditions set forth in the Order in Council of 7th February, 1921. Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers and Leading Rates of the Royal Navy, and Non-Commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines may receive the additions in respect of petty time at the rates and under the conditions set forth in the Order in Council of 7th February, 1921.
- 7. A seaman or marine who, being in receipt of any service allowance under these Regulations, re-enlists, shall cease to draw such allowance, but such allowance may re-issue on subsequent discharge if the man's further service has not qualified him for a service pension at a higher rate.
- 8. These Regulations shall be read with the Regulations of 1920: provided that:
  - (a) In the application of Article 3 of the Regulations of 1920, "disablement pension" in that Article shall mean the pension, allowances and additions specified in Articles 2 and 6 of these Regulations.
  - (b) In the application of Article 6 of the Regulations of 1920 to a seaman or marine in receipt of a service allowance under these Regulations, the treatment allowance, if any, payable to such seaman or marine shall be the allowance which would be payable under the Regulations of 1920, as if the man was pensioned only under those Regulations; provided that such treatment allowance shall not be less than the sum of any pension, allowances, and additions to which such seaman or marine would be entitled under these Regulations if not undergoing treatment, or, in any case under Article 6(1) (b), such sum reduced by 19s.
  - (c) For the purpose of Article 24 (a) of the Regulations of 1920 the following shall apply:—

Scheduled Rates. Pension under Article

Minimum Rates. The Minimum rate under Article 1 (1) of the Regulations of 1920.

12s. 19s. under Article 8 (b)

Unless the context otherwise requires:—

(1) "Service" means service which is allowed to reckon for Long Service pension under the conditions set forth in the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions.

(2) References to the Regulations of 1920 shall include references to the Regulations annexed to the Order in Council of the 14th January, 1919, for the pensions of seamen and marines disabled, etc., in consequence of the war.

10. The provisions of these Regulations shall, as from the 1st April, 1919, take effect in place of the provisions of previous Regulations with respect to the same matters; provided that no grant to a seaman or marine under previous Regulations shall be re-assessed to his disadvantage.

11. The Minister shall be empowered to issue such detailed instructions as he may deem necessary with respect to carrying these Regulations into effect.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section seventeen of the Finance Act, 1924, that, subject to the provisions of that section, a game certificate or a gun licence taken out in Northern Ireland shall, without further payment of duty, be available in Great Britain:

And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that the said section seventeen shall come into operation on the date which is declared by His Majesty in Council to be the date as on which by virtue of legislation passed by the Parliament of Northern Ireland a corresponding concession with respect to the availability in Northern Ireland of game licences and gun licences taken out in Great Britain comes into operation:

And whereas by section six of the Finance (Northern Ireland) Act, 1924, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of that section, a game licence or a gun licence taken out in Great Britain shall, without further payment of duty, be available in Northern Ireland:

And whereas by the said last-mentioned Act it is further enacted that the said section six shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-five:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, is for the purposes of section seventeen of the Finance Act, 1924, the date as on which by virtue of legislation passed by the Parliament of Northern Ireland a corresponding concession with respect to the availability in Northern Ireland of game licences and gun licences taken out in Great Britain comes into operation.

WHEREAS on the 20th day of January, 1914, an International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea, and for purposes incidental thereto, was duly entered into by His Majesty and the other Signatory Powers more especially referred to and set out in the said Convention:

And whereas a Statute 4 & 5 Geo. V. c. 50, intituled "An Act to make such amendments of the law relating to Merchant Shipping as are necessary or expedient to give effect to an International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea" (being the Convention above referred to) was passed on the 10th day of August, 1914, the short title of which is "The Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914":

And whereas by Section 29, Sub-section 5, of the said Act it was provided as follows:—

"This Act shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1915: "Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, from time to time postpone the coming into operation of this Act for such period, not exceeding on any occasion of postponement one year, as may be specified in the Order":

And whereas by divers Orders in Council the coming into operation of the said Act has been from time to time postponed, and now stands postponed, by virtue of an Order in Council of the 30th day of May, 1924, until the 1st day of January, 1925:

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient that the provisions of the said Act should be further postponed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the aboverecited provision and of all other powers Him thereunto enabling, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, shall be postponed from coming into operation until the 1st day of July, 1925.

WHEREAS it is provided by section four of the Forestry (Transfer of Woods) Act, 1923, that His Majesty may by Order in Council provide for altering the title of the Commissioners of Woods in such manner as may seem appropriate:

And whereas it is expedient that the title of the Commissioners of Woods shall be altered as hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. From and after the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, the Commissioners of Woods shall be styled and known as the Commissioners of Crown Lands.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Forestry (Title of Commissioners of Woods) Order, 1924.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of Section 4 of the Dangerous Drugs and Poisons (Amendment) Act, 1923, it is enacted that Section 17 of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, shall have effect as if for the words "labelled with the name of the article and the word poison, and with the name and address of the seller of the poison" there were substituted the words "labelled with the name and address of the seller of the poison, with the word

'poison,' and with the name of the poison, and, in the case of a preparation which contains a poison as one of the ingredients thereof, with such particulars as to the proportion which the poison contained in the preparation bears to the other ingredients as may be prescribed by Order in Council':

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to prescribe and doth hereby prescribe that as from the 1st day of January, 1926, in the case of every preparation containing as an ingredient thereof any poison to which the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended, applies, the particulars to be stated on the label as to the proportion which such poison bears to the other ingredients shall be the proportion (stated as a percentage or otherwise) which such poison bears to the total ingredients of the preparation.

Provided that in the case of any preparation of the British Pharmacopæia or the British Pharmaceutical Codex or Supplements thereto it shall be sufficient if that preparation whether sold with or without dilution or admixture is described on the label by its name or synonym or abbreviated name used in the British Pharmacopæia or its name or synonym or abbreviated name used in the British Pharmaceutical Codex, or the Supplements thereto, with the addition of the letters B.P., or B.P.C., as the case may be, and when sold with dilution or admixture the proportion which the preparation bears to the total ingredients.

Provided further that the provisions of this Order shall not apply in the case of tablets, pills, cachets, lozenges and similar articles contained in a package or bottle which is labelled to show the amount of the poison or roisons (or in the case of any preparation to which the preceding proviso applies, the amount of such preparation) contained in each article and the number of articles in the package or bottle.

This Order may be referred to as the Labelling of Poisons Order, 1924, and subject to any alterations that may be made by any subsequent Order in Council shall continue in force until revoked by Order in Council.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred on His Majesty by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, the Treaties of Peace (Austria and Bulgaria) Act, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Act, 1921, respectively, His Majesty in Council has been pleased to make the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, and various Orders amending the aforesaid Orders:

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid Orders as amended should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:— 1. The Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, as

1. The Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, as amended shall have effect, and be deemed always to have had effect, as if for the proviso to Article 1 (xvi) of that Order the following proviso were substituted:

"Provided that any particular property, right or interest may at any time be released by the Custodian, acting under the general direction of the Board of Trade, from the charge so created; and where the property, right or interest belonged to a person who has died since the charge attached, the Custodian acting as aforesaid may release it or any part thereof or any interest therein so as to make the release operate in favour of the persons who would have been entitled as beneficiaries under the will or on the intestacy of the deceased person, as the case may be, if the property, right, or interest had not been subject to the charge, or in favour of any of those persons to the exclusion of any one or more of them, on such terms (if any) as he may think proper with respect to the payment of debts and funeral and testamentary expenses and the discharge of any other obligations."

2. The Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, as amended, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, as amended, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, as amended, shall respectively have effect, and be deemed always to have had effect, as if for the first proviso to Article 1 (ix) of the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, as amended, for the first proviso to Article 1 (i) of the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, as amended, and for the first proviso to Article 1 (ix) of the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, as amended, the following proviso were substituted:

"Provided that any particular property, right, or interest may at any time be released by the Administrator, acting under the general direction of the Board of Trade, from the charge so created; and where the property, right or interest belonged to a person who has died since the charge attached, the Administrator acting as aforesaid may release it or any part thereof or any interest therein so as to make the release operate in favour of the persons who would have been entitled as beneficiaries under the will or on the intestacy of the deceased person, as the case may be, if the property, right or interest had not been subject to the charge, or in favour of any of those persons to the exclusion of any one or more of them, on such terms (if any) as he may think proper with respect to the payment of debts and funeral and testamentary expenses and the discharge of any other obligations."

3. This Order may be cited as the Treaties of Peace Orders (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1924, and shall be included amongst the Orders which may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace Orders, 1919 to 1924, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920 to 1924, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920 to 1924, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders, 1921 to 1924.

WHEREAS by Section 80 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, power is given to His Majesty by Order in Council to make Regulations as to the manner in which Government ships may be registered as British ships under the Merchant Shipping Acts:

And whereas by the said section it is provided that those Acts shall, subject to any exceptions or modifications which may be made by Order in Council, either generally or as respects any special class of such ships, apply to such ships when registered in accordance with such Regulations:

And whereas it is desirable that certain of the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts and any Act amending those Acts shall apply to ships belonging to the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia (not being ships of war forming part of the Navy of the Commonwealth of Australia) hereinafter referred to as "Government ships":

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been

complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following Regulations shall have effect as regards and apply to Government ships of the Commonwealth:—

- 1. An application for the registry of a Government ship shall be made in writing under the hand of the Permanent Head of the Department of State of the Commonwealth (hereinafter called the Department) controlling the ship. Such application shall contain the following particulars:—
  - (i) A statement of the name and description of the ship:
  - (ii) A statement of the time when and place where the ship was built; or, if the ship was foreign built and the time and place of building are unknown, a statement to that effect and of her foreign name:
  - (iii) A statement of the nature of the title to the said ship, whether by original construction by or for the Commonwealth, or by purchase, capture, condemnation or otherwise, and a list of the documents of title, if any, in case she was not originally constructed by or for the Commonwealth:
  - (iv) A statement of the name of the Master:
  - (v) A statement that the ship is controlled by the Department of which the applicant is Permanent Head.
- 2. The Registrar, on receiving an application under the last preceding regulation, shall—
  - (i) enter the ship in the Register Book as belonging to the Commonwealth of Australia, represented by the Department of (giving the name of the Department), and shall also enter therein—
  - (ii) the name of the port to which she belongs:

- (iii) the particulars stated in the application for registration:
- (iv) the details comprised in the Surveyor's Certificate.
- 3. On the registry of a Government ship, the Registrar shall retain in his possession the Surveyor's Certificate and the application for registry and any documents of title mentioned in such application.
- 4. Upon the transfer of a registered Government ship by Bill of Sale, the Permanent Head of the Department for the time being shall be the transferor, and the Bill of Sale shall be in Form A in the proper form prescribed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Act), omitting the covenant contained in that form.
- 5. The application for a Certificate of Sale, referred to in Sections 39 to 42 and Sections 44 to 46 of the Principal Act, may be made in respect of a Government ship by the Permanent Head of the Department.
- 6. The Permanent Head for the time being of the Department controlling a Government ship shall be deemed to be the managing owner of the ship, and shall be so registered, at the Customs House of her registered port by his official style and address.
- 7. The term "seaman" in Section 113 of the Principal Act shall not be deemed to mean or include any seaman in His Majesty's Navy or the Navy of the Commonwealth.
- 8. Nothing in this Order in Council shall be construed as excluding Government ships from the category of ships belonging to His Majesty within the meaning of Sections 557 to 564 of the Principal Act.
- 9. Where any section of the Merchant Shipping Acts which by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order in Council is applicable to Government ships imposes any duty or liability or confers any right or power upon or contemplates any act being performed by the owner of a ship, such duty, liability, right, or power shall, subject always to the other provisions of this Order in Council, be carried out, borne, or exercised by the Permanent Head of the Department in respect of which the ship is registered.
- 10. In this Order in Council the term "Merchant Shipping Acts" shall mean and include any of the Merchant Shipping Acts any provision of which is by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order applicable to Government ships.
- 11. The following sections and provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts shall not apply to Government ships registered in pursuance of the provisions of this Order in Council, namely:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Berwick, Saint James, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Stapleford, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Berwick, Saint James, and Stapleford, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Salisbury and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Berwick, Saint James, and Stapleford, are now full, the Reverend Philip Melancthon Mulholland being the present Incumbent

thereof:

"And whereas the said Philip Melancthon Mulholland has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Stapleford and such house will accordingly become the Parsonage House of the United Benefice:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Berwick, Saint James, and Stapleford now belongs to the same Patron or Patrons:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Berwick, Saint James, and the said Benefice of Stapleford shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'the United Benefice of Stapleford with Berwick, St. James,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Philip Melancthon Mulholland if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Berwick, Saint James, and Stapleford shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act, and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected, together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Salisbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme, and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

"I, the Right Reverend Arthur, Lord Bishop of Bradford, do in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Act of Parliament 1 & 2 Victoria, Chapter 106, hereby represent to your Grace that there are in the Parishof Rilston-with-Coniston in the County of York and in my Diocese of Bradford and subject to my jurisdiction duly constituted by an Order of Her late Majesty in Council dated the twenty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and duly published in the London Gazette. two Townships known by the name of Coniston and Kilnsey distant from the Parish Church of Saint Peter in the Township of Rilston which under the said Order in Council is the Parish Church of the Benefice and Rectory of Rilston-with-Coniston about seven miles.

with-Coniston about seven miles.

"That the said Parish of Rilston-with-Coniston inclusive of the said Townships of Coniston and Kilnsey contains a population of five hundred and thirty persons or thereshouts.

five hundred and thirty persons or thereabouts. "That the Parish of Kettlewell in the said Diocese of Bradford and County of York is contiguous to the said Townships of Coniston and Kilnsey and from the Parochial Chapel of Saint Mary situate in the said Township of Coniston which under the said Order in Council is a Chapel of Ease to the said Parish Church of Saint Peter Rilston is a distance of two miles only. The Parish of Kettlewell contains a population of three hundred and seventy-four persons or thereabouts.

persons or thereabouts.

"That it appears to me that the said Townships of Coniston and Kilnsey may under the provisions of the before mentioned Act of Parliament be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Rilston-with-Coniston and annexed to the said Parish of Kettlewell.

"That the said Chapel of Ease at Coniston affords accommodation for one hundred and fifty persons and the Parish Church of Kettlewell for two hundred persons.

"That the Church Pastoral Aid Society Patrons of the Rectory of Rilston-with-Coniston and Katherine Elizabeth Perfect, Ralph Mosley Robinson and Geoffrey Dawson, Patrons of the Vicarage of Kettlewell are respectively consenting parties to the foregoing Representation and to the Scheme hereinafter set forth.

"That pursuant to the directions of the said Act of Parliament I have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations before proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithe Rentcharge and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

## " SCHEME.

"That that portion of the Parish of Rilstonwith Coniston which comprises the Townships of Coniston and Kilnsey and is delineated and defined on the plan hereto annexed by a red verge line shall be separated from the Rectory and Parish of Rilston-with-Coniston and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Vicarage and Parish of Kettlewell to which it is contiguous

"That the cure of souls and other clerical duties of the said Townships of Coniston and Kilnsey belonging to the Rector of Rilston-with-Coniston shall be transferred to the Vicar of the Vicarage and Parish Church of Kettlewell.

"That all fees and payments arising from baptisms, churchings, marriages and burials, and all other ecclesiastical dues now receivable by and payable to the Rector of the Rectory and Parish Church of Rilston-with-Coniston in respect of the said Townships of Coniston and Kilnsey shall henceforth respectively be receivable by and payable to the Vicar of the Vicarage and Parish Church of Kettlewell.

"That from and after the date hereof the

"That from and after the date hereof the tithes arising out of land situate in the said Parish of Rilston-with-Coniston commuted at the sum of fifty pounds and belonging to the Benefice of Rilston-with-Coniston which said tithes are more particularly described in the Schedule hereto annexed shall belong to and become part of the endowment of the said Benefice of Kettlewell.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of either of the said two Benefices.

"That the inhabitants of the said Townships of Coniston and Kilnsey shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the Parish Church of Saint Peter Rilston but shall subject to the provisions of the Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, be liable as other inhabitants of the Parish of Kettlewell to the repair of the Parish Church of Kettlewell and that they shall have the same rights as to pews and performance of all offices and services of the Church at the Parish Church of Kettlewell and otherwise in relation to the same Church and the Parish belonging thereto as other inhabitants of the same Parish.

"That the Parish of Rilston-with-Coniston shall henceforth be known as the Parish of Rilston only and the Parish of Kettlewell shall henceforth be described as the Parish of Kettlewell-with-Coniston.

"That I do hereby submit the foregoing Representation and Scheme to your Grace and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with the same I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents of the Patrons and Incumbents by your report to His Majesty in Council pursuant to the Act of Parliament before referred to.

#### HIGHWAY, ENGLAND.

ORDER, DATED 27TH NOVEMBER, 1924, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT UNDER SECTION 7 (4) OF THE ROADS ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5. C. 72), PROHIBITING THE DRIVING OF CERTAIN CLASSES OF MECHANICALLY-PROPELLED VEHICLES ON VARIOUS HIGHWAYS OR PORTIONS OF HIGHWAYS SITUATE IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET.

Whereas by sub-section (4) of Section 7 of the Roads Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1920"), it is enacted that the Minister of Transport (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") may, by order on the application of any county council (as defined in Section 17 of the Act of 1920) after holding a public inquiry, prohibit or restrict, subject to such exceptions or conditions as to occasional user or otherwise as may be specified in the Order, the driving of mechanically-propelled vehicles of any specified class on any specified highway within the area of the council in any case in which it appears to him, as the result of the inquiry, to be proved that a vehicle of that class cannot be used on that highway without endangering the safety of the vehicle or the persons therein or of other traffic using the highway, or that the highway is unsuitable for use by a vehicle of that class;

And whereas the County Council of Somerset made application to the Minister for an Order to be made in pursuance of the said

sub-section;

And whereas the Minister caused a public inquiry to be held into the application, and it appears to him, as a result of that inquiry, that the highways or portions of highways hereinafter specified are unsuitable for use by certain classes of mechanically-propelled vehicles:

Now, therefore, by virtue and in exercise of the powers given to him by sub-section (4) of Section 7 of the Act of 1920, and of any other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Minister hereby orders as follows:—

(a) During the period of five years from the date on which this Order comes into force, no person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highway specified in the First Schedule hereto any locomotive, any heavy motor car (as defined by Article II of the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904), or any motor car with seats for more than fourteen persons exclusive of the driver;

(b) During the period of five years from

(b) During the period of five years from the date on which this Order comes into force, no person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highways or portions of highways specified in the Second Schedule hereto any mechanically-propelled vehicle which has an unladen weight exceeding three tons or which has seats for more than twenty persons exclusive of the driver;

(c) Nothing in this Order contained shall prevent the driving on the highways or portions of highways specified in the Schedules hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said roads") of—

(i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said roads or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;

(ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said

roads; or

- (iii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity;
- (d) The Authority responsible for the maintenance of each of the highways or portions of highways to which this Order relates shall on or before the day on which this Order comes into force give notice in accordance with the Road vehicles Registration and Licensing) Regulations, 1921, of the fact that this Order has been made and shall also cause to be erected in suitable places and maintained during the continuance of this Order warning boards in the forms approved by the Minister; and

(e) This Order shall come into force on the twentieth day of December, 1924.
