1. To extend the area of supply under the Aylesbury Electric Lighting Order, 1912, by adding thereto (a) the Rural Districts of Aylesbury and Long Crendon, and the parishes of Bledlow, Saunderton, Ilmer, Horsenden, Princes Risborough, Monks Risborough, Great and Little Kimble, Great and Little Hampden, and Ellesborough, in the Rural District of Wycombe, all in the County of Buckingham; (b) the Urban District of Thame and the parishes of Kingsey, Emmington and Chinnor in the Rural District of Thame, all in the County of Oxford; and (c) the Urban District of Tring, and the Parishes of Puttenham, Tring Rural, Aldbury, and Wigginton, in the Rural District of Berkhamsted, all in the county of Hertford.

The areas so proposed to be added to the said area of supply are hereinafter referred to as "the added areas."

- 2. To authorise the Corporation to generate and supply electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, within all portions of the added areas.

- 5.
