

not less than the rates set out above with, in addition, in each case irrespective of age, an inclusive weekly sum of four shillings and sixpence in respect of employment in connection with the duties of feeding, cleaning, bedding down and mucking out stock or other similar duties in connection with the immediate care of animals.

5. For the purpose of the above rates employment in Summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the first Sunday in November, and employment in Winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

6. The wages payable for employment of female workers in agriculture shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates, that is to say:—

	per hour.
18 years of age and over ...	5d.
17 and under 18 years ...	4d.
14 and under 17 years ...	3½d.

7. These rates shall continue in operation up to and including 10th October, 1925, unless otherwise decided by the Committee.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 12th December, 1924.)

Whereas under Section 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, the Registrar General, with the approval of the Minister of Health, may divide any Union into two or more Superintendent Registrars' Districts:

And whereas it is expedient that the Manchester Union, now divided into three Registration Districts, should henceforth be divided into two Registration Districts:

Now, therefore, I, Sylvanus Percival Vivian, Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Births and Deaths Registration Acts, 1836 to 1901, and with the sanction of the Minister of Health, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Manchester Registration of Births, &c., Order, 1924, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1925.

2. The Manchester, Prestwich and Chorlton Registration Districts which, together, form the area of the Manchester Union,

shall cease to exist and that Union shall be re-divided into two Superintendent Registrars' Districts to be named Manchester North and Manchester South respectively.

3.—(a) The Manchester North Registration District constituted by this Order shall consist of the existing Manchester and Prestwich Registration Districts.

(b) The Manchester South Registration District constituted by this Order shall consist of the existing Chorlton Registration District.

4.—(a) The existing Sub-district of Manchester in the Manchester Registration District and each of the existing Sub-districts in the Prestwich Registration District shall form a Sub-district of the Manchester North Registration District and each of such Sub-districts shall be known by the same name as heretofore.

(b) Each of the existing Sub-districts in the Chorlton Registration District shall form a Sub-district of the Manchester South Registration District and each of such Sub-districts shall be known by the same name as heretofore.
